## MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING OKLAHOMA HISTORICAL SOCIETY April 23, 1964

Mr. George H. Shirk, President of the Board of Directors of the Oklahoma Historical Society, called to order the Annual Meeting of the members of the Oklahoma Historical Society in the auditorium of the Historical Building at 9:30 s.m. on Thursday, April 23, 1964.

He opened the meeting by making some remarks about the 76th Anniversary of the Run of 1889 which the state of Oklahoma had celebrated the day before. April 22, 1964.

Hon. Joe B. Hunt, Insurance Commissioner of the state of Oklahome, was introduced by Mr. Shirk, Mr. Hunt was responsible for originating the theme of the Oklahoma exhibit at the New York World's Pair. The subject of Mr. Hunt's talk was the fourteen flags that have flown over the area that is now Oklahoma. He also prentioned a number of outstanding and famous people, living and dead, who are native Oklahomans.

Mr. Shirk thanked Mr. Hunt, and then spoke in memorium of J. B. Wright, uncle of Mise Muriel H. Wright, and youngest son of Rev. Allen Wright, who gave the state of Oklehoma its name. He concluded by asking the four groundshidnes of Allen Wright who were present at the meeting to stand and be recognized, and Miss Wright one of them, introduced her three cousina; Mrx. Guy F. Powler, Okla-bons City; Mrs. J. P. Ponder, Moore; and Mr. Robert Wallace, Moore.

Members of the Board of Directors present, and other autatand-ing guests were introduced to the meeting by Mr. Shirk.

The business meeting of the Oklahoma Historical Society was opened by Mr. Shirk asking for any old business. Thete beling none, the President stated there was new business in the form of a proposed amendment to the Constitution of the Oklahoma Historical Society. As is required for proposed amendments to the Constitution, he said it had been published in THE CHRONICLES OF OKLAHOMA, and was now before the membership for approval. It was moved by Kr. Fisher Buldrew, and seconded by Judge J. G. Clift that the proposed amandment be adopted. The motion, when put to a vote, passed. The adopted amendment is as follows:

> "If no additional possinations are received, thus resulting in no contest, the Administrative Secretary at the meeting of the Board of Directors where such ballots otherwise would be canvassed shall cost one vote and declare the five nominers elected."

It was maved by Mr. Joe W. Nellride and seconded by Judge Orel Busby that the actions and decisions of the Board of Directors and officers for the past year be approved. The motion passed onanimously. There below as further business, the Annual Meeting of the Okla-
