MINUTES OF THE QUARTERLY MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OKLAHOMA HISTORICAL SOCIETY

October 28, 1965

Members of the Board of Directors of the Oriahoma Historical Society met for their quarterly meeting in the Board of Directors Roota at 10:00 a.m. on October 28, 1968, with President George H. Shirk, presiding.

It was moved by Miss Seget that Mr. Henry B. Boss, Mr. Q. B. Boydstum, Judge J. Q. Clift, Dr. E. E. Dale, Mr. Bob Foreman, and Mr. R. M. Mountcastle be excused. The motion was seconded by Mr. Philling and adopted by the Boxed.
