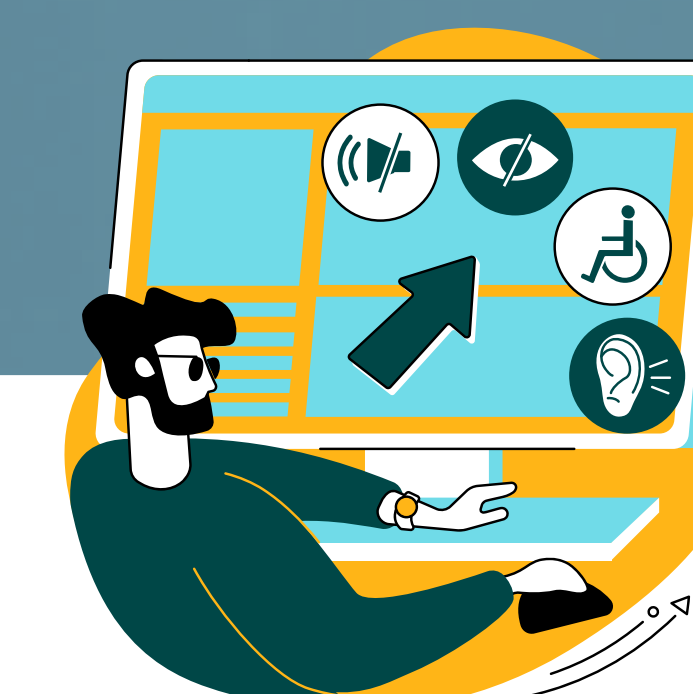
Signposting users to trusted resources
