
ND Law in DC Lunch-N-Learn



PERLA KHATTAR




**The Future of Democracy**







# Saint of the Week: St. Thomas of Villanova with Charlie Nugent

I have a special devotion to St. Thomas of Villanova, the patron saint of Villanova University. Villanova has always been a part of my life. I'm very lucky, and proud, to be one of over sixty family members to have graduated from the University. For anyone who knows me, it's no shocker that I chose St. Thomas of Villanova to be my confirmation saint.

Tomas Garcia Martinez was born in the 1480s, and he was raised in Villanueva de Los Infantes, Spain. From the beginning, everyone knew of Tomas's brilliance. In his early twenties, Tomas became one of the youngest professors at the University of Alcala, where he taught art, theology, logic, and philosophy. His reputation as a professor spread, and, in 1516, the chancellor of the renowned University of Salamanca offered him a professorship. Tomas declined the offer and instead entered the Augustinian monastery. Tomas surrendered all that he was to God.

Tomas was a skilled writer and eloquent orator. Legend has it that Charles V, after hearing one of his sermons, observed: "This monsignor can move even the stones." Tomas had a profound sense of how to govern, and so, he held many positions of leadership in the Church. He was a local prior, a regional superior, and eventually the Archbishop of Valencia. Tomas always cared for his people, and he believed deeply in the structural reform of society. At a time when many in the Church used wealth for unholy means, he used his power and influence to establish schools, hospitals, kitchens, homeless shelters, and sanitary prisons. Tomas died in 1555, and he was canonized as St. Thomas of Villanova in 1658. His feast day is celebrated on September 22.

Words cannot capture the eternal gratitude I have for St. Thomas of Villanova. As Notre Dame lawyers, we can learn a thing or two from him. A different kind of lawyer recognizes that the law is a vocation, not a profession. He uses his power and influence to serve the common good.
