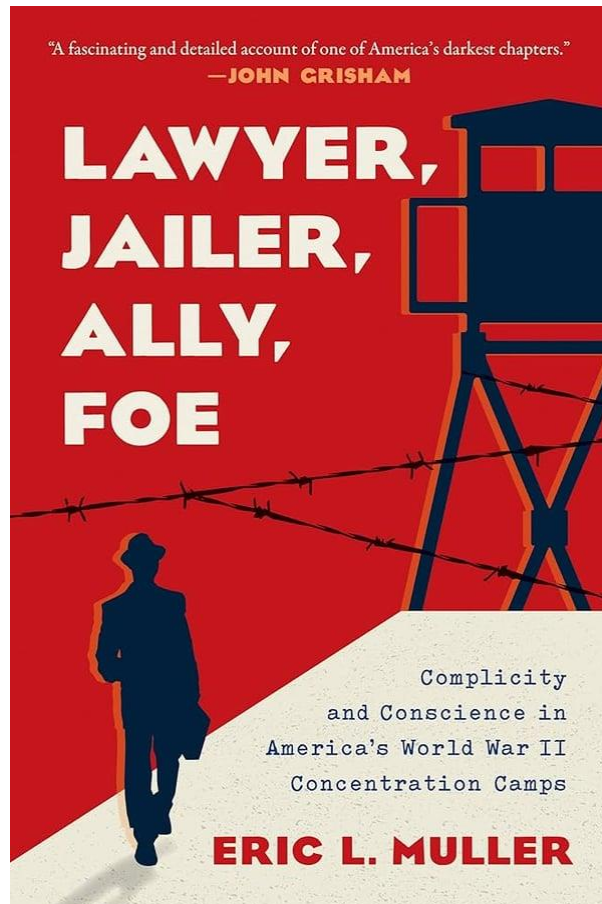

[Eric L. Muller](#) is Dan K. Moore Distinguished Professor in Jurisprudence and Ethics at the University of North Carolina School of Law. He is editor of *Colors of Confinement: Rare Kodachrome Photographs of Japanese American Incarceration in World War II* and author of *Free to Die for Their Country: The Story of the Japanese American Draft Resisters in World War II*.

Lawyer, Jailer, Ally, Foe brings to vivid life the stories of three white lawyers, with contradictory instructions — provide legal counsel to the prisoners, but keep the place running — illuminating a shameful episode of American history through imaginative narrative deeply grounded in archival evidence.
