
Fluency

- Ability to read a text quickly, accurately, and with proper expression
- Bridge between word recognition and comprehension
- Focus on learning words in context

- Vocabulary
- At-a-glance words
- Self-monitoring




Newbery books: Criteria for character development

- Admirable but believable characters
 - about the same age
- Wide range of cultures
 - boy and girl lead characters









The Evolution of Calpurnia Tate











When You Reach Me

NAEP Fluency Scale

Level 4

Large, meaningful phrase groups. Deviations do not detract from story. Preserves author's syntax. Expressive interpretation

Level 3

Smaller phrase groups (3-4 words). Phrasing appropriate and preserves author's syntax. Little expressive interpretation

Level 2


Primarily two-word phrases. Word groupings awkward and unrelated to context.

Level 1

Primarily word-by-word. Infrequent phrases do not preserve meaningful syntax.


