Welcome to the Maine Gay Symposium - what I hope will be the beginning of an effective eampaign for Gay Liberation in the state of Maine. This symposium comes after months of controversy throughout our state - especially in the Bangor area.

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Hopefully, through the efforts of wveryone in this room today, the stereotypes of Gay people willbbe smashed, and the discrimination and harassment of homosexuals ended. This is a long-range effort. It is a campaign for human rights. It is a movement for both Gays and Straights alike who believe that if <u>any</u> minority is denied its civil rights, then <u>no one</u> can be assured of his or her rights.

We of the Wilde-Stein Club are proud to contribute to the Gay movement. Many of us have experienced an unprecedented solidarity with Gays throughout the country. We have received letters of encouragement from Colorado, Michigan, New York, Florida, Ohio and Massachusetts. This is not merely a movement centered in one or two specific cities; it is a nation-wide phenomenon which is rapidly becoming world-wide in scope.

WEXINXWAINEX A year ago, there was one organized Gay group in this state. Gay Support & Action in Bangor. Today there are at least strongly organized groups in Maine, besides the Bangor group: Gay Rights Organization in Portland; Hancock County Gays in the Ellsworth area; The Bridge at Colby College; a group at the Brunswick Women's Center; and The Wilde-Stein Club, here at Orono. We have decided to carry on the fight in Maine. Most of us were born and raised here and have grown to love this state. We believe that Maine people will accept us if given the chance to see us -- to see that we are no threat to them, but are, rather, friends, neighbors and relatives -- people they have lived with all their lives. As I mentioned before, it is a long-range effort. We may not attain our total liberation in the 70's, but we are making great progress; do you realize that this is a Gay Symposium in Orono, Maine?! A few years ago this would have been inconceivable. We are growing restless in our closets, and some of us have come out - proud of our sexuality. We cannot be ignored. We are here and we are here to demand what is rightfully ours.

Today, we have an impressive representation of the national Gay movement as well as dedicated Gays working in the New England area. I would first like to thank Vito Russo
