Claims Rubin ringleader in 1962 - 1963 riots. On farm in firehouse; not recall date except cold. Was commander and John the institutional firechief. John on duty. Had walked in. Offered him coffee-early morning hours. Small talk. John had been a good convict, good athelete. Knows him from Rahway. John responsible for rescuing hostages in 1971 riots in Rahway. John responsible for rescuing 6 cops. Rubin a ringleader.

Asked how got mixed up in the murder, & Artis said had date with his chick that night, if he would have gone on that date, would not be here

talking. Late 1973 or early 1974.

Parole officer went & asked Artis about it. After bullshit small talk, Asked how got mixed up in bullshit murder or thing like this.

Artis never talked to him about it again. Capt Mc Donald felt talking

about his involvement. Not recall parole officer's name.

With aprole dept. Thinks got letter from him arranging a meeting. 609-785-0040. Not recall his mentioning Rubin Carter. Said had sparred with Carter.

The above captioned individual will be sentenced on January 27, 1977, before the Honorable Bruno Leopizzi, Judge, Passaic County Court on three counts of first degree murder.

Mr. Artis advised the undersigned that while an inmate at Rahway State Prison, he helped save the lives of several guards during the riots.

However, the classification material does not contain any information to verify this statement. Mr. Artis's attorney advised that you would be able to give information as to the extent of his help during the riots.

With regard to the above; Please be advised that John was one of a group of indicates that rescued the hostages that were taken during the riot at danway state Prison on nov.24-25 1971. My investigation indicated conclusively that John Artis played an important role in bringing the hostages out of the distress area where we could effectively remove them from further narm.

It must be understood that this deed had placed John in jeopardy. However we have handled to keep the actual rescue operation confidential, to a large degree. John and several other limates are still in the system and any notoriety with regard to this natter could open up some old wounds. As a natter of fact, Thomas wooten the hajor ringleader of that riot and the taking of the hostales is here at leesburg.

MEMORANDUM

The pre-sentence report prepared by the undersigned on John Artis reflects a statement on page 3A that states the defendant saved the lives of the guards during the Rahway Riots. However, this information could not be verified.

On January 18, 1977, Mr. Jeffrey E. Fogel, attorney for John Artis, phoned the undersigned. He advised that he had a copy of a report from the Prosecutor's Office regarding an interview with Captain Mc Donald of Leesburg State Prison indicating that John Artis was responsible for rescuing hostages in the 1971 riots at Rahway.

The undersigned then contacted Captain Mc Donald on January 19, 1977. He advised the matter was too confidential to discuss on the phone and a letter should be sent to him requesting the information. A letter was prepared and sent on January 19, 1977.

On January 25, 1977, Captain Mc Donald replied that John Artis was one of a group of inmates that rescued the hostages that were taken during the riot at Rahway State Prison on November 24-25, 1971. Furthermore, John Artis played an important role in bringing the hostages out of the distress area where they were effectively removed from further harm.

Captain Mc Donald advised that this deed placed John Artis in jeopardy. However, we have managed to keep the actual rescue operation confidential to a large degree.

January 25, 1977

John Artis and several other inmates are still in the system and any notariety with regard to this matter could open up some old wounds. As a matter of fact, Thomas Wooten, the major ringleader of that riot and the taking of the hostages is at Leesburg.
