INDIANA TERRITORY

INDIANA WAS FIRST EXPLODED BY THE FRENCH UNDER LASALLE WHO ESTABLISHED FORTS AND TRADING POSTS. THE FIRST PERMANENT SETTLE MENT WAS AT VINCENNES IN 1731. THE AREA WAS CEDED TO GREAT BRITAIN IN 1763 AND BECAME A PART OF THE MORTHWEST TERRITORY IN 1787 WHEN INDIANA TERRITORY WAS ORGANIZED, IN 180Q IT INCLUDED THE PRESENT STATES OF ILLINOIS AND MICH. ISJAN. IMPLANA WAS ADMITTED TO THE UNION DEC. 11, 1816.
