

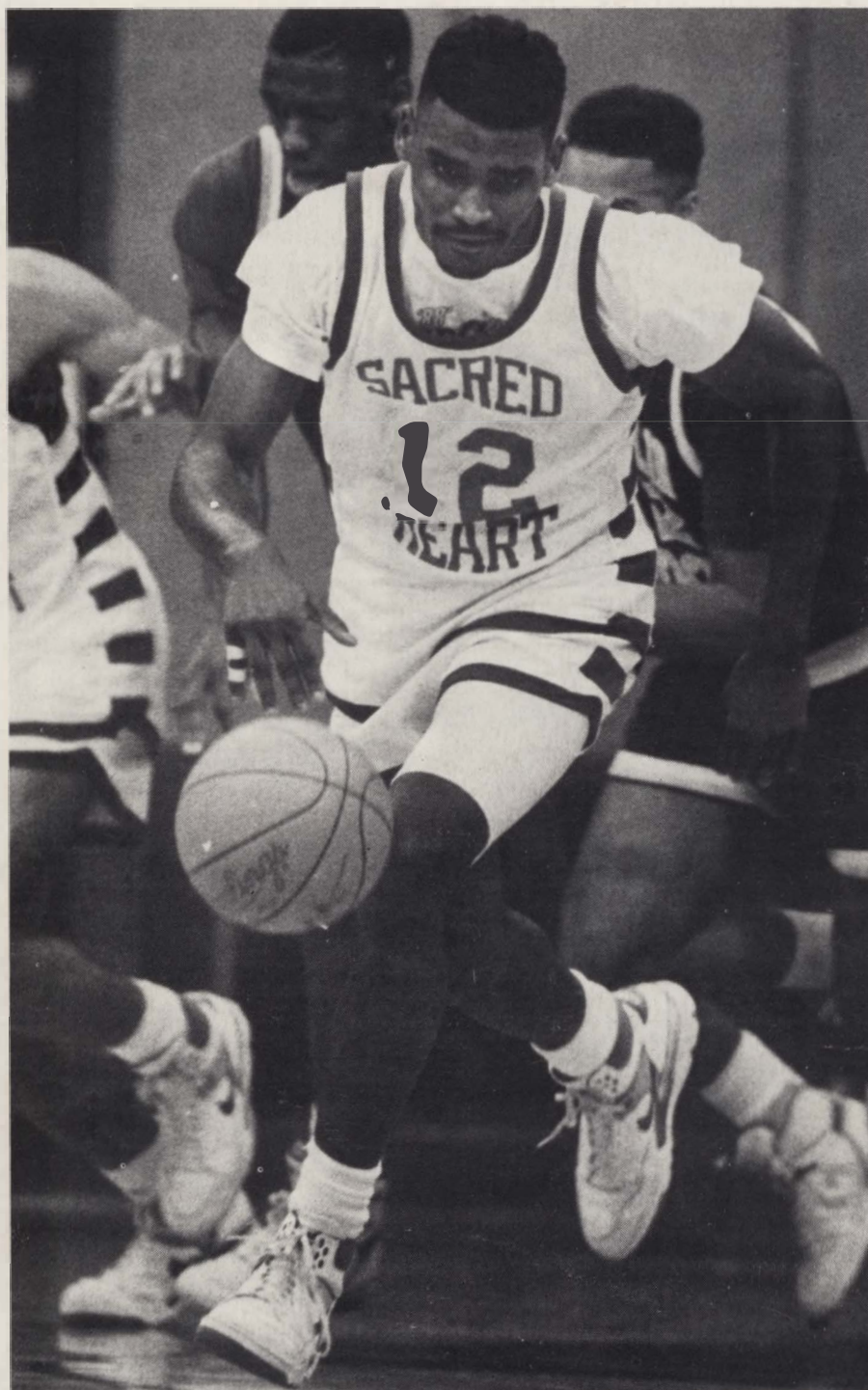

12th Season

Head Basketball Coach 245-95 (.721)

Entering his 12th season as Director of Athletics and Head Basketball Coach at Sacred Heart University, Dave Bike has firmly established the Pioneers as a regional and national power.

Bike's impressive 245-95 (.721) record ranks him among the Top Ten Winningest Active Division II Coaches by Percentage. He has guided the Pioneers to NCAA postseason play in eight of the last 10 seasons with an NCAA National Championship in 1985-86 and five NCAA New England Regional Championships to his credit.

Bike's astonishing 34-11 (.756) record in postseason action is oddly enough higher than his regular season mark. He has put together 11 straight winning seasons and has seven seasons with 20-or-more victories.

Bike's list of accomplishments is a long one. His teams appeared in seven straight New England Regional championship games from 1981 to 1987 and he was selected the National Coach of the Year in 1985-86 by the National Association of Basketball Coaches. He is a three-time (1983-84-89) Coach of the Year in the New England Collegiate Conference and has four NECC titles to his credit. Over the last 11 seasons the Pioneers have captured 13-regular-season tourney titles throughout the country and there have been nine NABC All-American selections during his tenure at Sacred Heart.

The highlight of his coaching career came when Sacred Heart defied the odds and captured the 1985-86 NCAA Division II crown over Southeast Missouri 93-87 in Springfield, Mass. The Pioneers became the first team from New England to capture the Division II crown as eight of the 11 members from the championship squad were homegrown Connecticut players.

Bike played eight seasons with the Detroit Tiger organization (1965-72) and was inducted into the Notre Dame High School Hall of Fame where he earned All New England honors in basketball and baseball his senior season (1965). He served a four-year stint as an assistant to his brother-in-law Billy O'Connor at Seattle University and is currently a member of the NCAA Division II All-American Selection Committee and the ECAC Executive Committee.

Bike resides in Durham with his wife Judi and their four children Kelly, Amy, Corey and Keith.



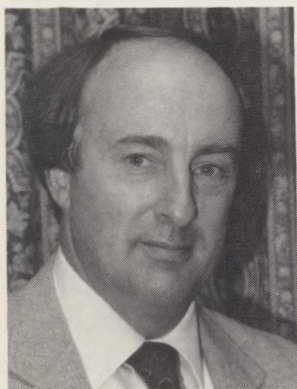

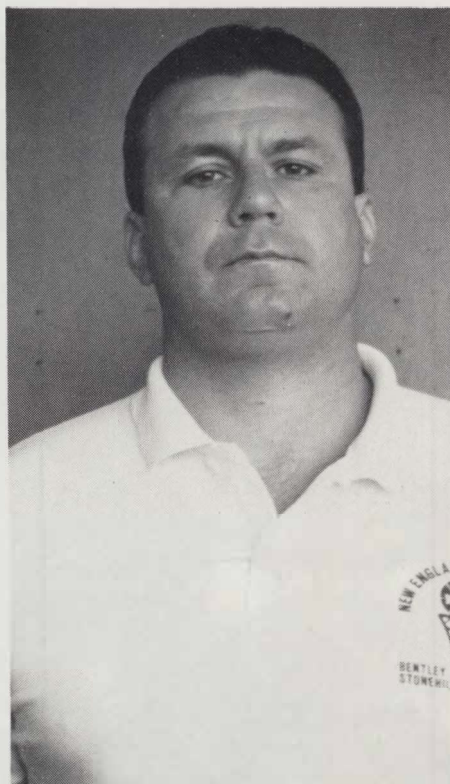
Head Coach Dave Bike readily admits that, "A coach is only as good as his players and his assistants and I have been fortunate in being blessed with an individual like Bob Jenkins."

Jenkins has played a major role in the success of the Sacred Heart basketball team on the court as well as off throughout the years. The Bridgeport native is entering his 13th season in the role of assistant basketball coach.

Coach Jenkins is a great communicator and his message to the players is an important one, "You can't play basketball all your life. Basketball is important in college but you have to find something constructive to do with your life." He has always stressed the importance of a sound education and has had a positive effect on the players, not only as athletes but as individuals while earning their respect and admiration.

After a standout career at Central High School in Bridgeport, he played two years for Rod Butler at Housatonic Community College with the Hawks advancing to the 1975 National JUCO Tournament in Hutchinson, Kansas. He then moved on to Sacred Heart, playing two years for Don Feeley and averaging seven points while earning recognition for his defensive and rebounding skills. Jenkins also played semi-pro ball in the New England Basketball Association and was named to the league's All-Star combine during the 1980 and 1981 seasons.

Jenkins graduated from Sacred Heart in 1977 and holds a B.A. Degree in Business. He was named a top salesman for Clairol in national sales competition and manages retail sales in southern Connecticut after joining the company in 1979.



Barry McLeod
Assistant Coach

Barry McLeod, who starred in the backcourt scholastically at nearby Notre Dame High School and on the collegiate level at Centenary College in Shreveport, La., is entering his second season as an assistant coach for the Pioneers.

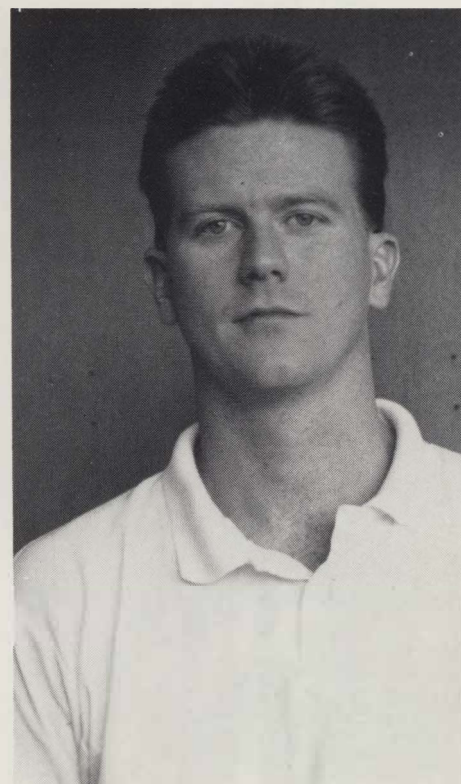
McLeod earned All-State and All MBIAC honors his senior year (1972) at Notre Dame and was a 1988 inductee into that school's Hall of Fame.

McLeod, a three-year starter at Centenary from 1973-76 co-captained the Gents, along with Robert Parish of the Boston Celtics, his junior and senior years.

A fifth-round draft pick of the Chicago Bulls in 1976, McLeod played locally for the Panama Inn Volunteers in the New England Basketball Association for several seasons. He remains active with Sunny's, one of the nation's top slow pitch combines.

He is a physical education teacher for the Bridgeport School System at Blackham School. McLeod served five years as an assistant at Central High School and one year as an assistant and one as the head coach at Housatonic CC.

Ed Swanson, a 1989 graduate of Sacred Heart with a degree in Business, is the newest member of the Pioneer staff. Swanson graduated from Kolbe-Cathedral High School in Bridgeport in 1984 and served as assistant coach there the last four years with the Cougars (21-2) winning the 1985 CIAC state title by beating St. Joseph in the finals on Milt Pettway's (SHU guard) shot with five seconds left. Swanson has served on the staffs of summer camps at Sacred Heart, Fairfield and the Mason-Dixon Camp in Washington, D.C.

1989-90 Pioneer Basketball Prospectus

This is a hallmark year for Sacred Heart basketball.

It is the Silver Anniversary for the Pioneers, who have averaged 20 wins a season since Don Feeley's first season 25 years ago in 1965-66. Sacred Heart has won 485 of its 691 games (.702) over that span and with 15 victories this year, it should reach the 500-win plateau.

And as has been the case in the past, the question asked is a familiar one.

Will Sacred Heart be able to make up for the loss of some key personnel and be able to defend its NCAA New England Regional Championship?

The Pioneers have a solid nucleus of seven lettermen, including three starters, returning from last year's 22-10 squad which advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals before losing to eventual champion North Carolina Central 58-57. Two-time NABC All-American forward Tony Judkins (8th on SHU's all-time scoring list with 2,059 points) and frontcourt performers Keith Gatling and Vince Howard have graduated while junior starting guard Rodney Smith will not be returning this season.

Heading the list of returnees will be senior captain Sean Williams and junior forward Todd Williams (no relation) a pair of NECC second team selections a year ago. Sean Williams served as the point guard last season, averaging 13.9 points, 5.9 rebounds while leading the team in assists with 6.3. He played a major role in SHU's turnaround

last year from a .500 club to an NCAA Regional Championship team and needs just 94 points to reach the 1,000-point plateau. Sean will most likely be moved from backcourt to his more familiar position down low.

Todd Williams has quickly de-

adly short jumper.

Despite averaging only 2.9 ppg and 3.2 rpg, junior center Rob Dubose came on strong last year, earning a spot in the starting lineup over the final 15 games. The 6-foot-7 pivot will be heavily counted upon to make his presence felt down low.

Sophomores Phil Howard (6-foot-5 swingman/ 4.4 ppg and 1.2 rpg) and Tim Stackhouse (6-foot-3 guard/ 1.6 ppg) and junior Rich Percudani all gained valuable experience last year and will also be counted upon to play bigger roles this season.

The return of starting point guard Milton Pettway after a year's absence will be a big boost to the backcourt forces. The 6-foot dynamo started 21 games during the 1987-88 season, leading the Pioneers in assists with four a game while averaging 7.9 points. He is considered one of the team's top defensive players.

A promising group of four talented newcomers will be playing a big role in determining just how far the Pioneers will go this year. Heading that list is junior forward Kevin Phillips, the CIAC scoring champ his junior year at Law H.S. in Milford with a 29.4 average.

Among freshmen expected to help out immediately is Lionel Coleman, a 6-5 guard who earned All-State Group I honors at state championship Haddonfield H.S. (31-1) in Glassboro, N.J. Demuzla Bryant, a 6-7 center out of Harding H.S. in Bridgeport and Lincoln Boulanger, a quick 5-10 point guard out of LaSalle (NY) Academy round out the squad.

Sean Williams will serve as captain of this year's team after an outstanding junior season in which he perhaps emerged as the team's best all-around player as he averaged 13.9 points and 5.8 rebounds...The West Haven High product led the team in free throw percentage (.752) and assists (6.6) and was second in steals (69)...Has improved his FG% from .450 his freshman season to .465 as a sophomore and an impressive .521 last year, which was the best mark among backcourt players in the NECC...Listed as a guard last year but Coach Bike referred to his 6-foot-4 leader as his 'point forward'...Earned second team All-NECC honors while starting all 32 games...An underrated player whose effort last year was most responsible for turning a .500 club in the middle of the season into regional champions and national contenders by the end of the year...Posted season high 25 points vs. Keene State (2/4/89) and 13 rebounds against New Haven (2/1/89)...Career highs of 29 points and 15 rebounds came against Pace his sophomore season and 14 assists against New Hampshire College (1/2/89)...Will start the season with 906 career points just 94 markers shy of becoming the 20th Pioneer cager to hit the 1,000-point plateau...Became adept at hitting teammates down low for backdoor layups...Accuracy from three-point range has dropped from .474 (37-for-78) as a frosh to .333 (21-for-63).

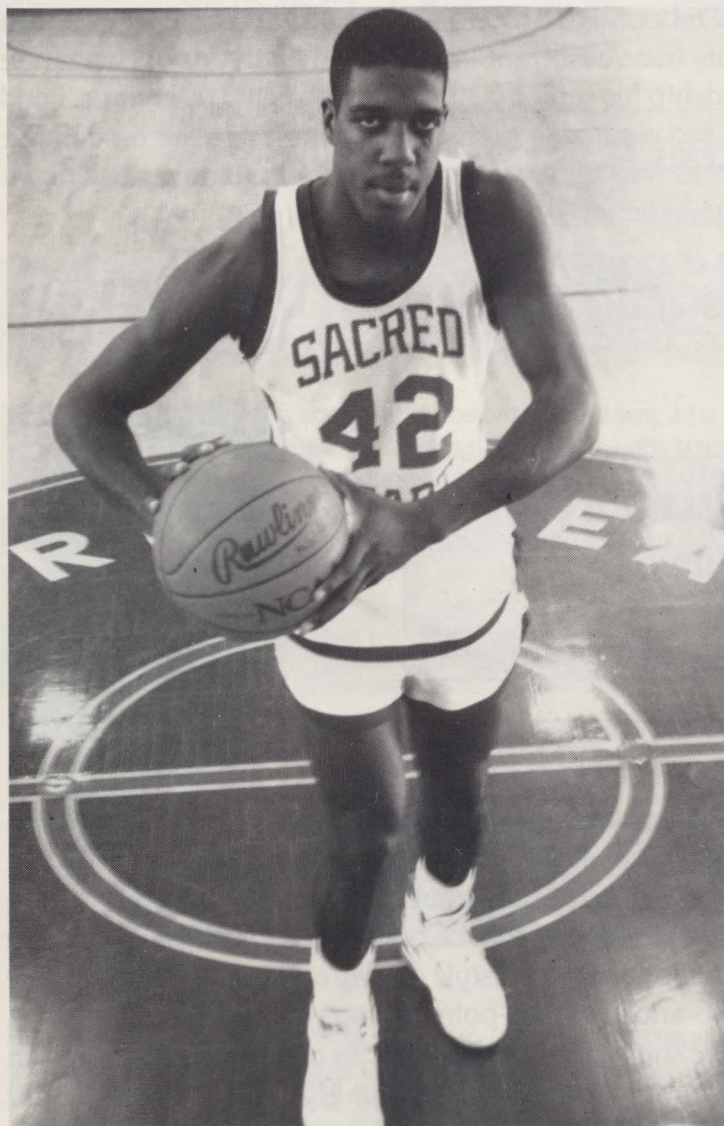

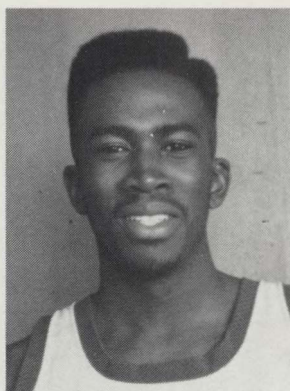

Todd Williams rates as perhaps the hardest worker on the squad and is coming off a sensational sophomore season in which he earned SHU's Most Improved Player Award...Thanks to a deadly short jumper which he has perfected, his scoring average leaped to 17.9 from 7.8 as a freshman and his FG percentage improved to a team high .583 from .488...Battles for position down low and shows quick hands on defense...Earned second team All NECC and NCAA New England Regional All Tournament honors sparkling with 27 points against Bentley when he did not miss a shot all night (11-of-11) from the floor, including a three-pointer, and four-of-four from the line) and 14 in the title game against Bridgeport despite suffering an ankle injury late in the game...Missed double figures only twice all season when another ankle problem forced him to limited action in the final two games of the Holiday Classic...Posted a career high 34 points on 15-of-18 shooting from the field in a 91-67 win over Franklin Pierce (2/28) in the first round of the NECC playoffs...Scored 20 points or more 10 times, including three 27-point outings while career high 12 rebounds came his sophomore year against Franklin Pierce in the Holiday Classic semifinals...Was an uncanny 31-of-37 (.837) in consecutive games on the Florida trip against Florida Southern (6-of-7), Tampa (13-of-14) and Rollins (12-of-16)...A teammate of SHU center Rob Dubose at 1987 CIAC Class LL champion West Haven High School...Needs 216 points to reach 1,000-point plateau.

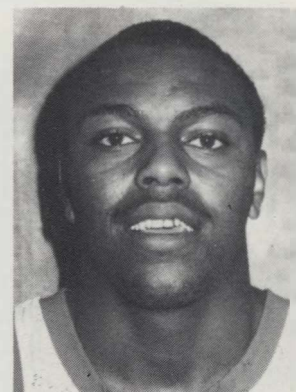

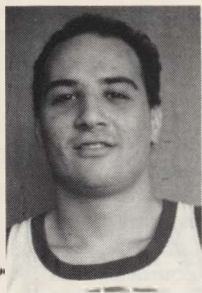

Milton Pettway sat out last year after starting 21 of 29 games as a point guard in the 1987-88 season when he topped the Pioneers in assists with 100 (3.9) while averaging 7.9 points...Despite playing at less than 100 percent with a separated shoulder and a foot injury, Pettway reached double figures nine times, including career highs of 17 points against New York Tech and nine assists against Concordia...Earned a spot in the starting lineup at the start of his sophomore season with his hard-nosed style of play and was able to improve his field goal accuracy from .368 as a freshman to .426 and his three-point success from .091 to .389...A very strong athlete, he possesses excellent speed, quickness and defensive skills...Played center in high school and was able to make the transition to the backcourt...A three-year starter Milton tallied over 1,000 points at Kolbe-Cathedral while garnering Bridgeport Sunday Post honors with 18 points and nine rebounds his senior year...As a junior he led the Cougars to the CIAC Class S state title in 1985 and a 21-2 record as his field goal with five seconds remaining beat St. Joseph of Trumbull in the finals.

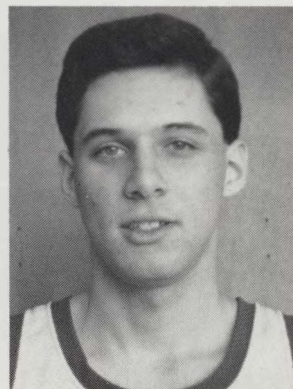
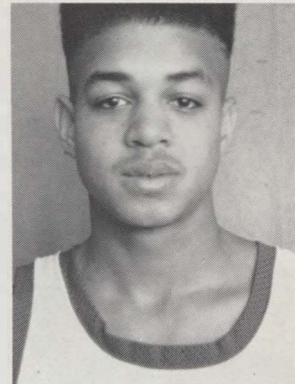


14 Lincoln Boulanger Guard 5-11 160 Freshman

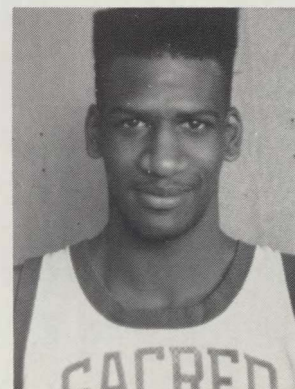


#22 Kevin Phillips Forward 6-5 190 Junior

1988-89 SHU Basketball In Review (22-10, 12-2 NECC)

Pioneers Earn Seventh NCAA Regional Championship

The Sacred Heart University 1988-89 men's basketball team reclaimed its position atop NCAA Division II basketball in New England by garnering its seventh regional championship and earning a spot in the inaugural Elite Eight (NCAA quarterfinals) in Springfield, Mass.

After a mediocre 9-8 start, the Pioneers finished strong, winning 13 of their last 15 games for a 22-10 overall record. SHU appeared in its 13th NCAA New England Regional and captured its fifth regional championship in the last eight years under 11th year Head Coach Dave Bike.

Sacred Heart defeated Bentley 103-88 and Bridgeport 69-67 in the New England Regionals at Waltham, Mass., before dropping a tough 58-57 decision to eventual national champion North Carolina Central in the opening round of the Elite Eight. "If you're going to lose your last game in Division II, this is the place to lose it in," said Bike about the Springfield Civic Center.

The Pioneers copped the New England Collegiate Conference regular season title (12-2) but had to receive an at-large bid to the tournament after they were knocked off by New Haven 87-82 in the semifinals of the NECC playoffs.

Bike, among the Top Ten Win-

ningest Active Division II Coaches by Percentage with a 245-95 (.721) record, was selected the NECC Coach of the Year for the third time ('83, '84, and '89).

Tony Judkins completed an outstanding four-year career by earning his second NABC All-American selection (second team) to go along with his third-team selection his junior season.

The 6-5 senior forward, who started as a freshman on the 1985-86 national championship team, moved into eighth place on SHU's all-time scoring list with 2,009 career points. The Hartford, Conn., product led the team in scoring (18.5), rebounding (7.9) and steals (7) while earning a host of post-season awards that included All ECAC North, All New England and All-NECC. Judkins, who started 125 of 126 games in his four seasons, was also named the Most Outstanding Player in the New England regionals. His three-point desperation shot at the buzzer that beat UB for the New England title will long be remembered.

Todd Williams, a 6-4 sophomore forward, and Sean Williams, a 6-4 junior guard, (no relation) also turned in excellent seasons as the pair of underclassmen earned NECC Sec-

ond Team accolades.

Todd Williams established himself as one of the premier frontcourt performers in the region, averaging 17.9 points and 6.4 rebounds while leading the team in field goal percentage (.583).

Sean Williams' play was instrumental in the Pioneers' turnaround, averaging 13.8 points and 5.8 rebounds while leading the team in assists (203/6.3) and free throw percentage (.752).

Sophomore guard Rodney Smith (7.7) started 30 of 32 games and was second in assists (58) while senior frontcourt performers Vince Howard (5.7) and Keith Gatling (5.0) made their contributions as spot starters and by providing quality minutes off the bench.

First-year players Phil Howard (4.4), walkon Tim Stackhouse (1.6) and Rich Percudani (who missed the first half of the season with a stress fracture) all gained valuable experience.

The defensive work of the Pioneers was impossible to overlook. The nothing-tricky tactics of Bike enabled SHU to lead the NECC in defense at 70.8 as it held opponents to 65-points-or less 15 times and under 60 on six occasions.

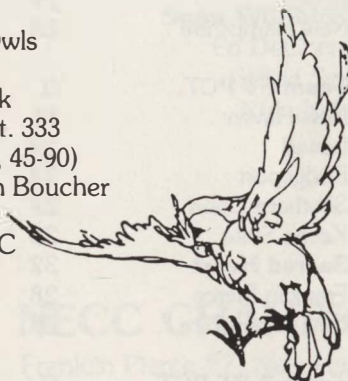

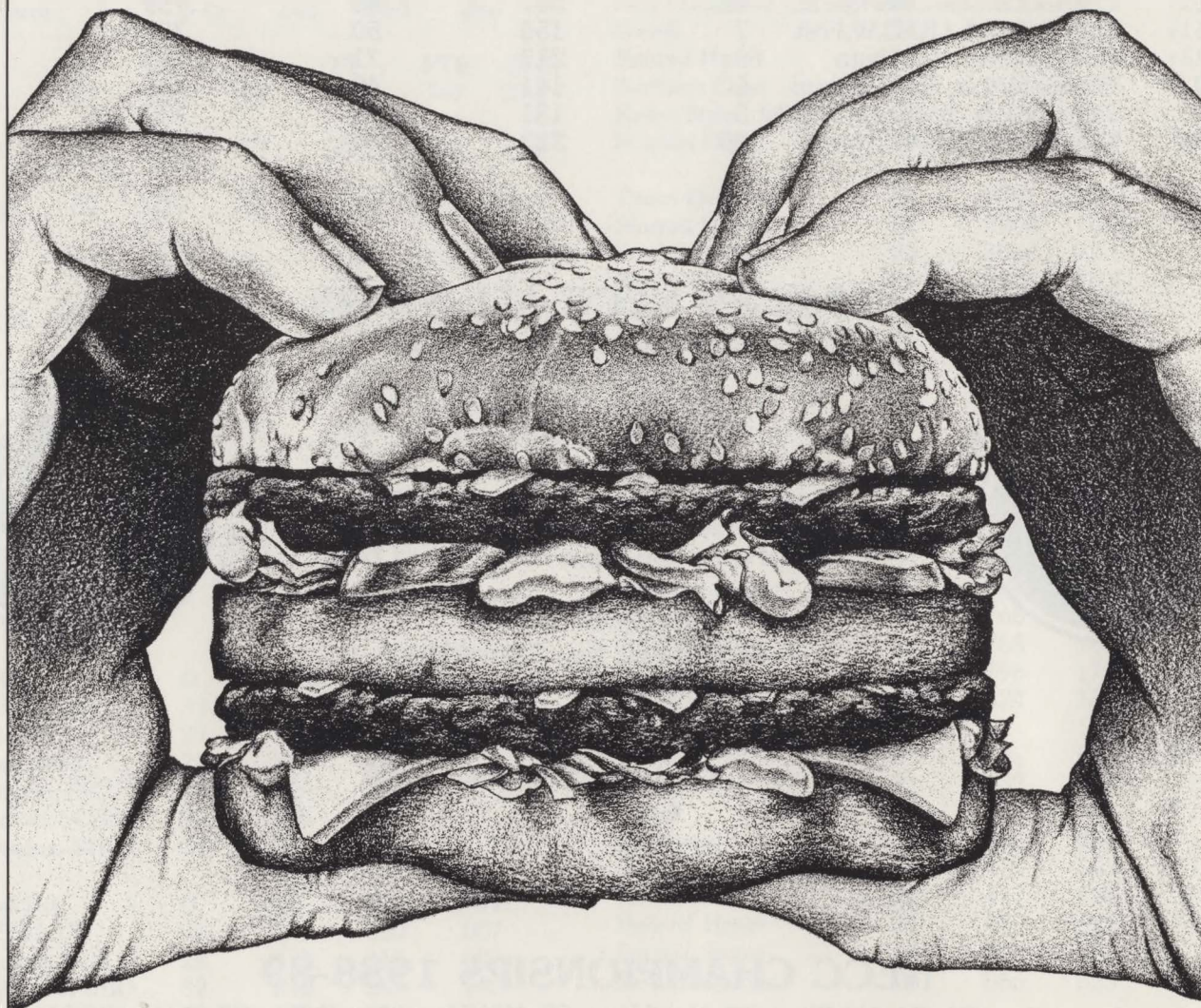

Sacred Heart University/Busch Beer XXIII Holiday Classic

Over the years the Sacred Heart University/Busch Beer Holiday Classic has earned the reputation as one of the finest and most competitive Division II basketball tournaments anywhere.

The Classic has enabled area cage fans the opportunity to observe a wide range of contrasting styles as 75 different teams will have participated with the conclusion of this year's event. Former Athletic Director and Head Basketball Coach Donald Feeley introduced the idea to the area back in 1967. The Classic has enjoyed success since then mainly due to the untiring efforts of Robert Shea, who will be serving as the tournament director for the 22nd consecutive season.

The look of the XXIII Holiday Classic will be somewhat different as its traditional eight-team, three-day, 12-game format has now been switched to a four-

team field. The 1989 Holiday Classic will be conducted Friday Dec. 29 with games set for 6 and 8 o'clock and for Saturday Dec. 30 with the consolation and championship games slated for 5 and 7 o'clock, respectively. The College of St. Rose (Albany, N.Y.) will be making its initial Classic appearance and will face St. Anselm's College (Manchester, N.H.) in Friday's opener before Concordia College (Bronxville, N.Y.) goes against the host Pioneers in the nightcap.

Stonehill College (North Easton, Mass.) captured last year's title with a 114-103 win over New York Tech in the finals. Only once (Sacred Heart in 1967 and '68, the first two years) has a team been able to earn back-to-back championships.

Fourteen different teams have managed Holiday Classic titles in the previous 22 events with Sacred Heart gam-

ing eight crowns (1967, 68, 70, 74, 76, 80, 82 and 85). St. Michael's College is the only other combine to have more than one championship (1973 and '75) to its credit. Southern Conn. (69), Wesleyan (71), Tufts (72), Merrimack (77), Bridgeport (78), Quinnipiac (79), New Haven (81), District of Columbia (83), Franklin Pierce (84), Pace (86), St. Thomas Aquinas (87) and Stonehill (88) complete the list of Classic champions.

Although the host Pioneers have compiled a fine 48-13 (.786) Classic record, they have been denied the title the last four years and would like nothing better to halt that skein this year. St. Anselm (1976, 79, 84) and Concordia (1985, 87, 88) will be making their fourth Classic appearances with the former 5-4 and the latter 4-5 in Classic action.

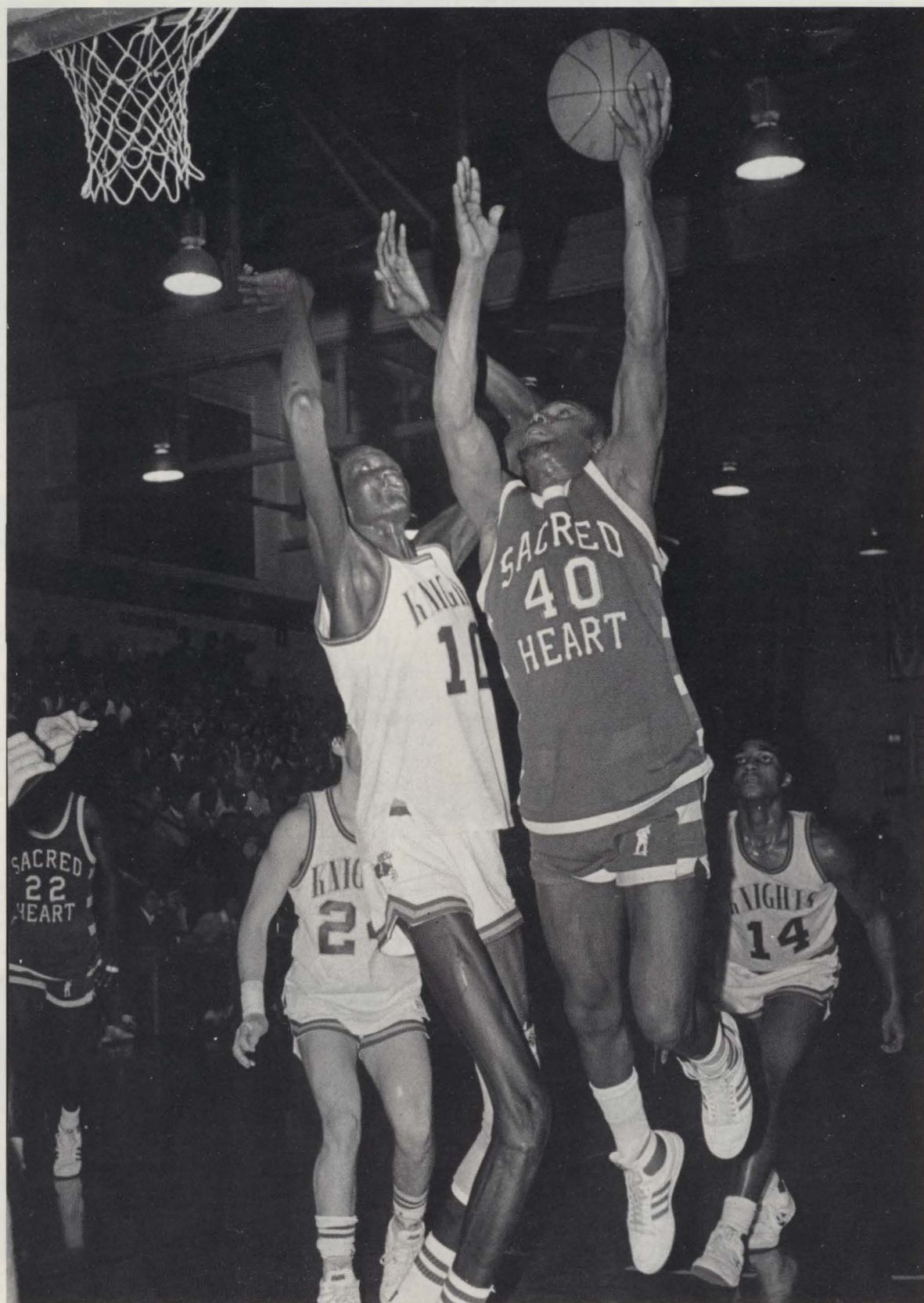

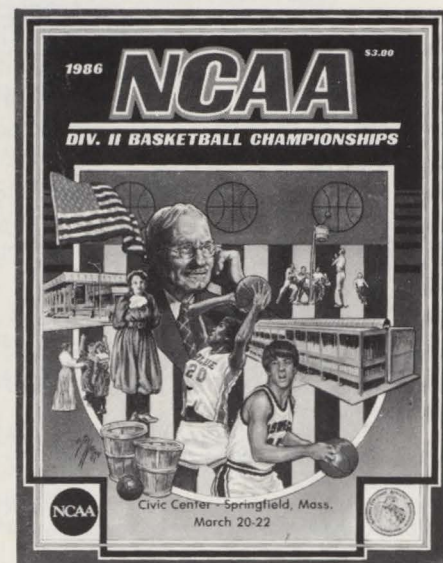

Sacred Heart Defeats Southeast Missouri 93-87 For NCAA Title



March 6 - Manchester, NH (1,857) NCAA New England Regional Opening Round Sacred Heart 76, Springfield 74 (2OT)

Joe Jackson hits three late free throws as the Pioneers open their run to the NCAA crown with a double OT victory. Roger Younger hit two jumpers in the final 42 seconds of regulation to send the game into OT. The first OT ended at 68-all before freshman Tony Judkins hit a 20-footer from the corner with 44 seconds left in double OT to break a 70-all tie and put SHU ahead for good. Younger ended with 22 points, Keith Johnson 16, Travis Smith 12 and Tony Judkins 10.

March 7 - Manchester, NH NCAA New England Regional Finals Sacred Heart 83, New Hampshire College 67 (1,639)

The Pioneers won the New England crown for the fourth time in five years as four players hit double figures (Younger and Johnson 20 each, Smith 15 and Judkins 11). Playing on a tender ankle dislocated just four weeks earlier, Kevin Stevens contributed nine points.

March 15 - Norfolk, VA, Echols Hall (5,187) NCAA Quarterfinals Sacred Heart 84, Norfolk State 74

The Pioneers shot a blistering 80% from the floor (21 of 26) in the second half and 62% for the game (35-56) with Younger (28), Stevens (14), Johnson (11), Jackson (10) and Judkins (10) showing the way once again.

March 21 - Springfield, MA Civic Center (5,133) NCAA Semifinals Sacred Heart 86, Florida Southern 80

SHU rallied from an eight-point 43-35 halftime deficit with a 19-2 outburst to open up the second half in their second Final Four appearance. Smith turns in an outstanding effort

with 17 points, 13 rebounds, 10 assists and eight steals. Defense played a big part in the win as SHU came up with 17 steals.

Sacred Heart becomes the first team from New England to win the Division II championship in a rousing final that set a record for most points in a championship contest. Both teams shot 54% from the floor but the Pioneers were able to rebound the taller Mules 43-32. A jumper by Jackson tied the score at 34-all with 4:42 left in the first half before SHU went on one of its patented streaks and managed to build up a seemingly safe 56-41 bulge with 17:47 left. But SEMO got back to within two 77-75 at the 4:33 mark before Younger keyed a 12-2 spurt that closed the door. Younger was selected the tournament's Most Outstanding Player while Stevens and Johnson made the All-Tournament Team.

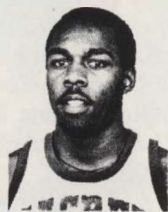

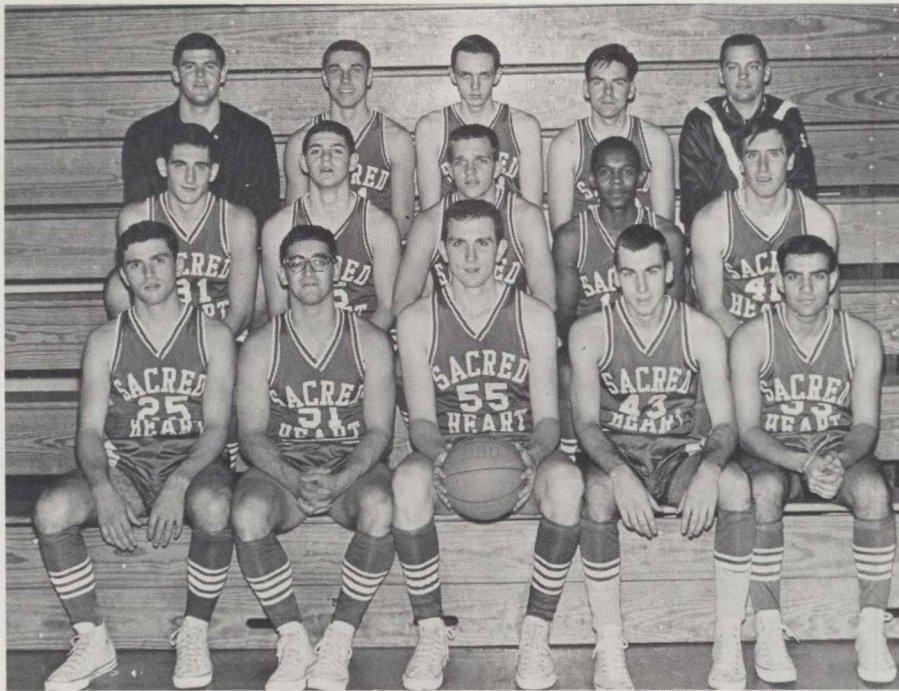

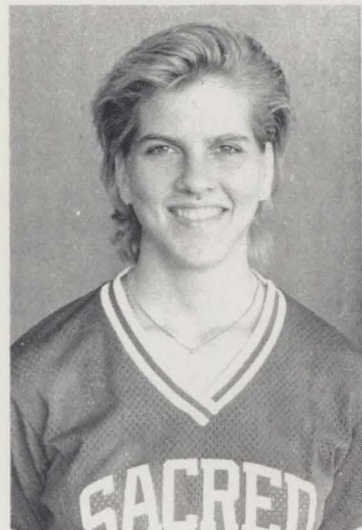
