

WHAT IS OPEN ACCESS?

"Digital, online, free of charge, and free of most copyright and licensing restrictions," Peter Suber, *Open Access* (MIT Press, 2012), 4.

OA VARIETIES / COLORS



Gold – immediately available OA license, often requires payment (APC)



Platinum/Diamond – immediately available OA license, no APC / sponsored



Green – OA deposit in a repository




Gray – OA via academic network (Academia.edu, ResearchGate)



Bronze – publicly available on publisher's platform no OA license

ADVANTAGES

- Increases access (up to 7.5x)
- Increases impact/citations
- Speeds up science
- Promotes your profile as public scholar
- Is altruistic
- Contributes to OER
- Ensures compliance with funder mandates

DISADVANTAGES / OBSTACLES

Many ISU scholars don't have funding; many venues require payment. 02


Prestige publishing persists.

 "I know a colleague who refuses to publish in gated journals, and I think it's slowed his career a bit." 03

Payment-based OA is associated with "predatory" practices.

INSTITUTIONAL REPOSITORY (IR)

ISU ReD (Research and eData) is the digital repository for the work of faculty, staff, and students at Illinois State University.

This online archive, run by Milner Library, provides open access to and preserves the scholarly and creative output of the university.

INSIDE ISU RED



Authors can upload work themselves, or send the library their CV for staff to upload works on their behalf



Articles, reviews, books, chapters, presentations, workshops, creative works, student work (capstone, theses and dissertations), reports, datasets, and more!



Depositors receive monthly download and usage statistics of their work through email or the author dashboard





Institutional Repository Submission Statement
