Our community meeting on July 29 gave people a chance to meet the Backyard ADU builders for the 3 units of affordable year round rentals at 18 Central Ave. It also announced our It Takes a Village fund raising campaign which is going well - so far about half of what we need has been raised - which also means there's plenty of room for more donations: see www.peakshomestart.org.

We're run into a snag, however. Although the project will be built on the existing footprint within current zoning requirements, the City has informed us we need a variance because it is a large building on a small lot. Our <u>Practical Difficulty Variance appeal will be heard by the Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) on September 7 at 6 pm.</u>
