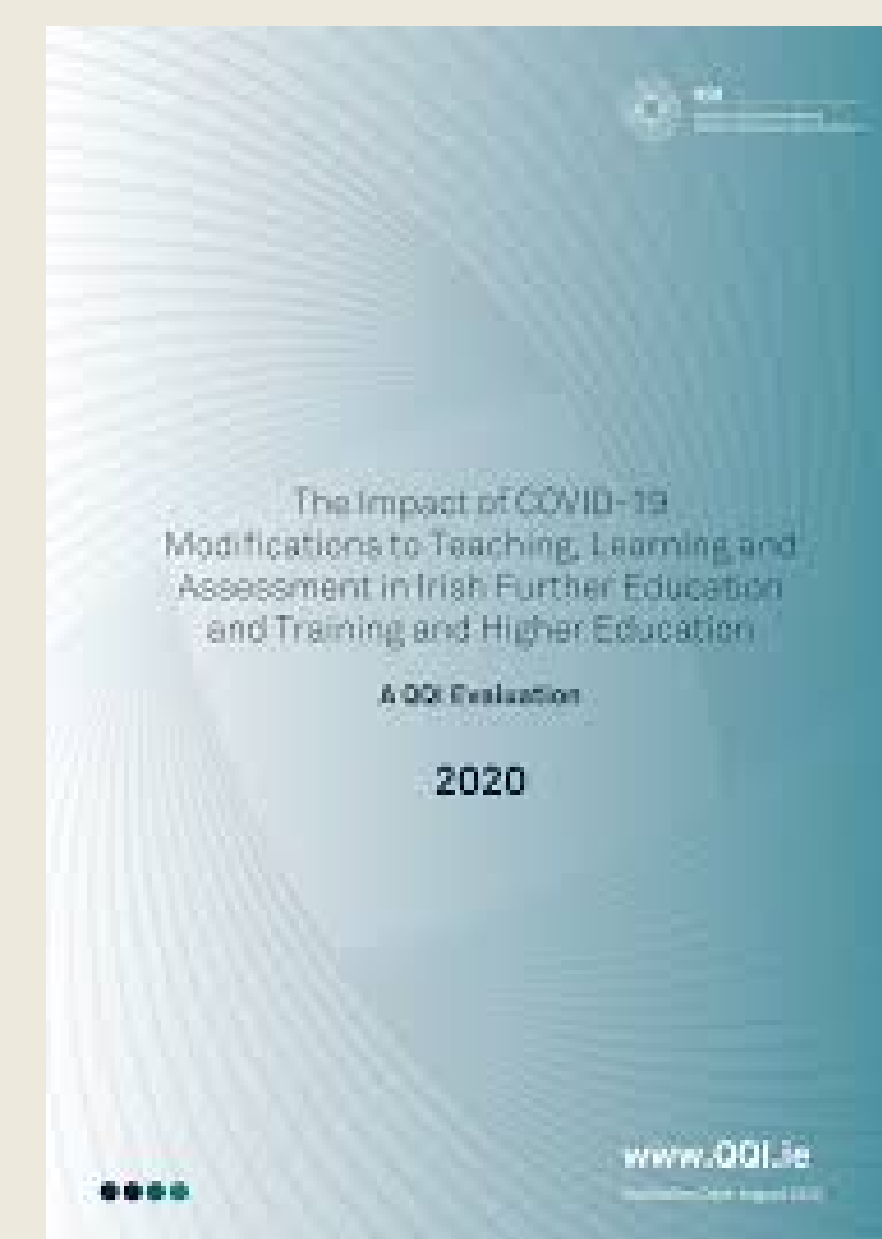

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## 1. An Expanded Focus on Authentic Assessment

Implementation of alternative assessment at CCT during the pandemic enhanced engagement with authentic assessment that connects "classroom learning to real-world experiences" (Hasan & Cerimagic, 2021). This engagement continues post pandemic. Tips from Ahead to promote inclusion in relation to assessment (Ahead 2020) were also integrated. CCT also promoted and continues to promote the CAST UDL Framework.



QQI's 'The Impact of COVID-19 Modifications to Teaching, Learning and Assessment in Irish Further Education and Training and Higher Education' (2020) recommended that providers "Provide tips and online resources to help students prepare for assessment". CCT launched, and retained, the Learning Space learningspace.cct.ie, a central platform with audio, video and text guides for faculty and students.

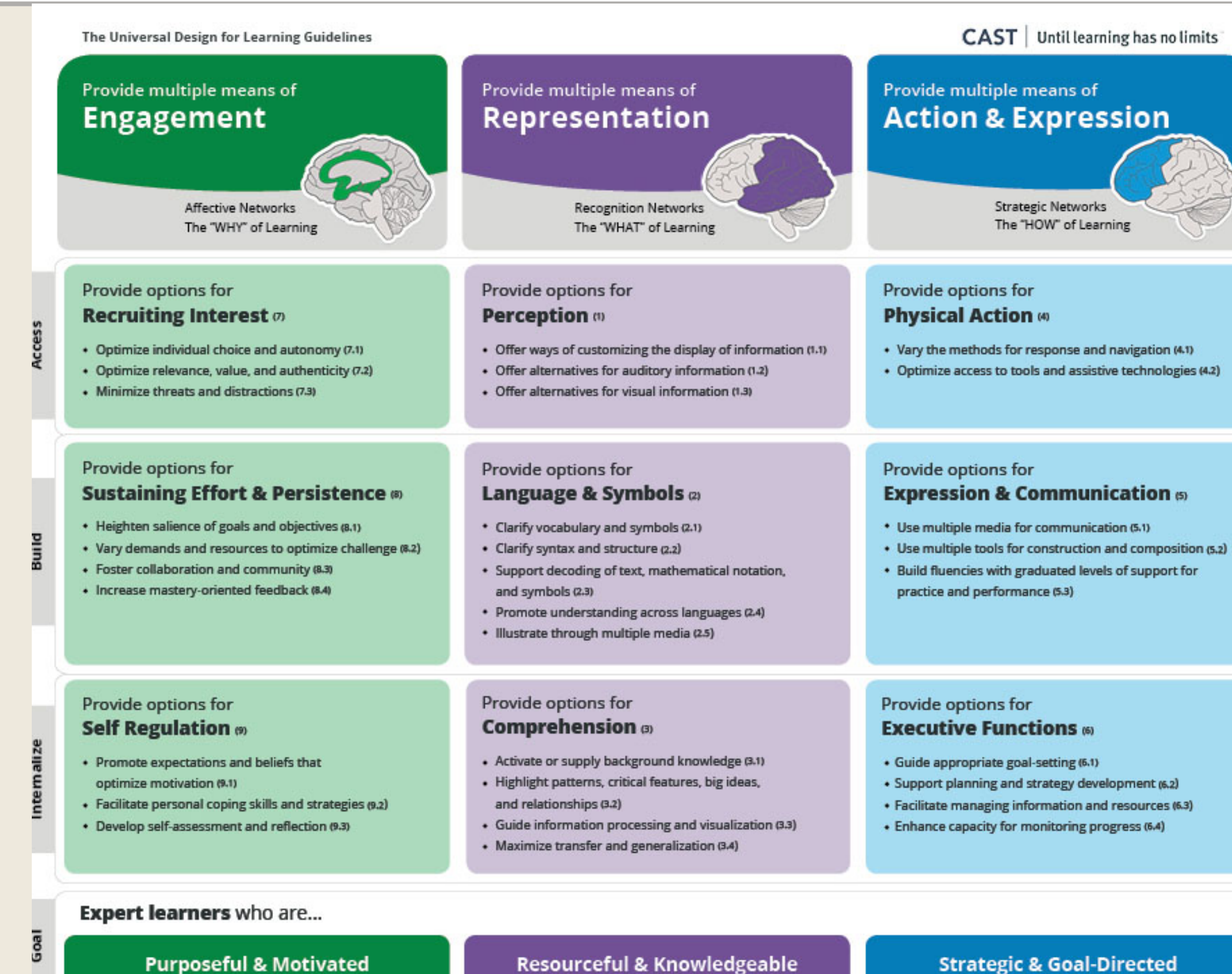
## 2. Increased Digitisation

During the COVID-19 pandemic, CCT digitised services traditionally offered face-to face such as induction, student support across departments, Student Success Classes and the Peer Mentoring Academy. Recordings of class lectures were also made available for all modules via Moodle. CCT has retained these services post-pandemic.

*Recorded lectures were also the most popular academic support resource and continue to be offered for all classes including face-to-face classes*



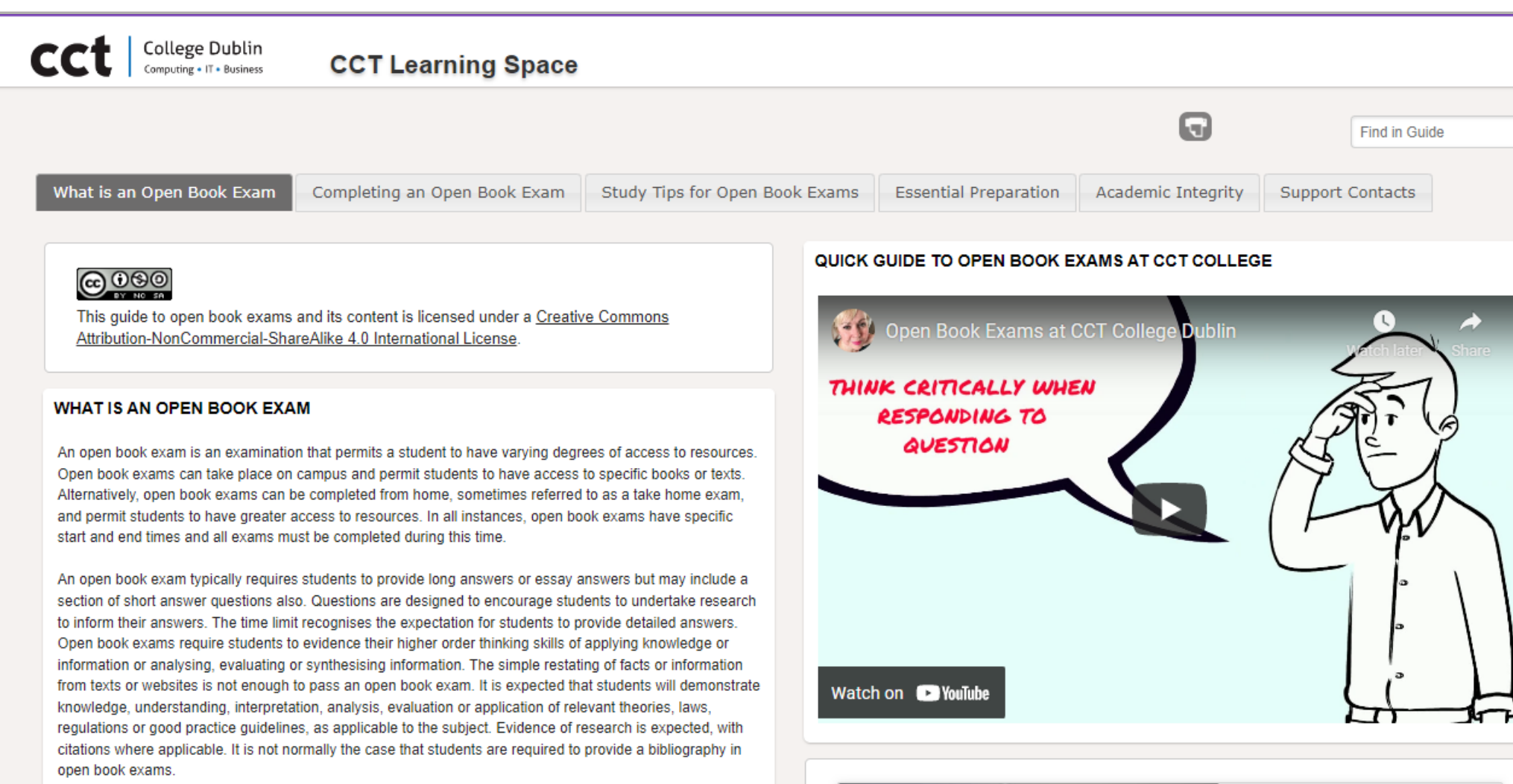

## Abstract

In February 2020, CCT College Dublin convened the Monitoring and Review Team (MRT), to identify risk and mitigating actions required to ensure the continuity of programme delivery and supports to learners during the COVID-19 Pandemic in the event of potential campus closure. The team investigated good practice in online teaching, learning and assessment, regulatory frameworks and practices, technology supports, and human resources required to proactively support any potential shift to online delivery and supports. A peer consultation was also conducted with online teaching and learning experts across the sector (CCT College Dublin, 2020). Maintenance of academic standards and integrity were central to the project. The CCT Academic Council was responsible for the review and approval of contingency arrangements in respect of teaching, learning and assessment. This poster captures three key enhancements that the College implemented during the COVID-19 pandemic but retained post pandemic to further enhance programme delivery going forward.

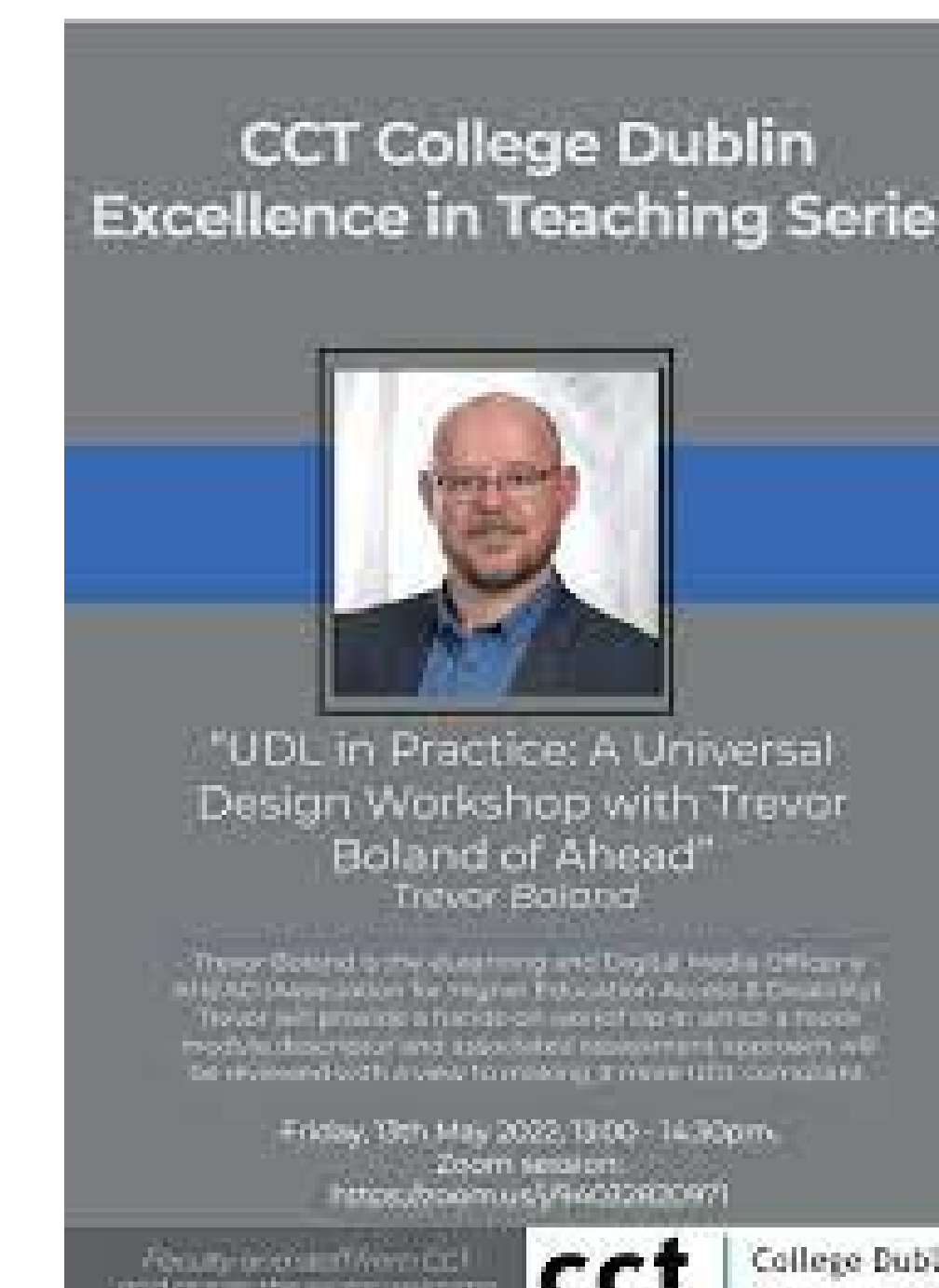
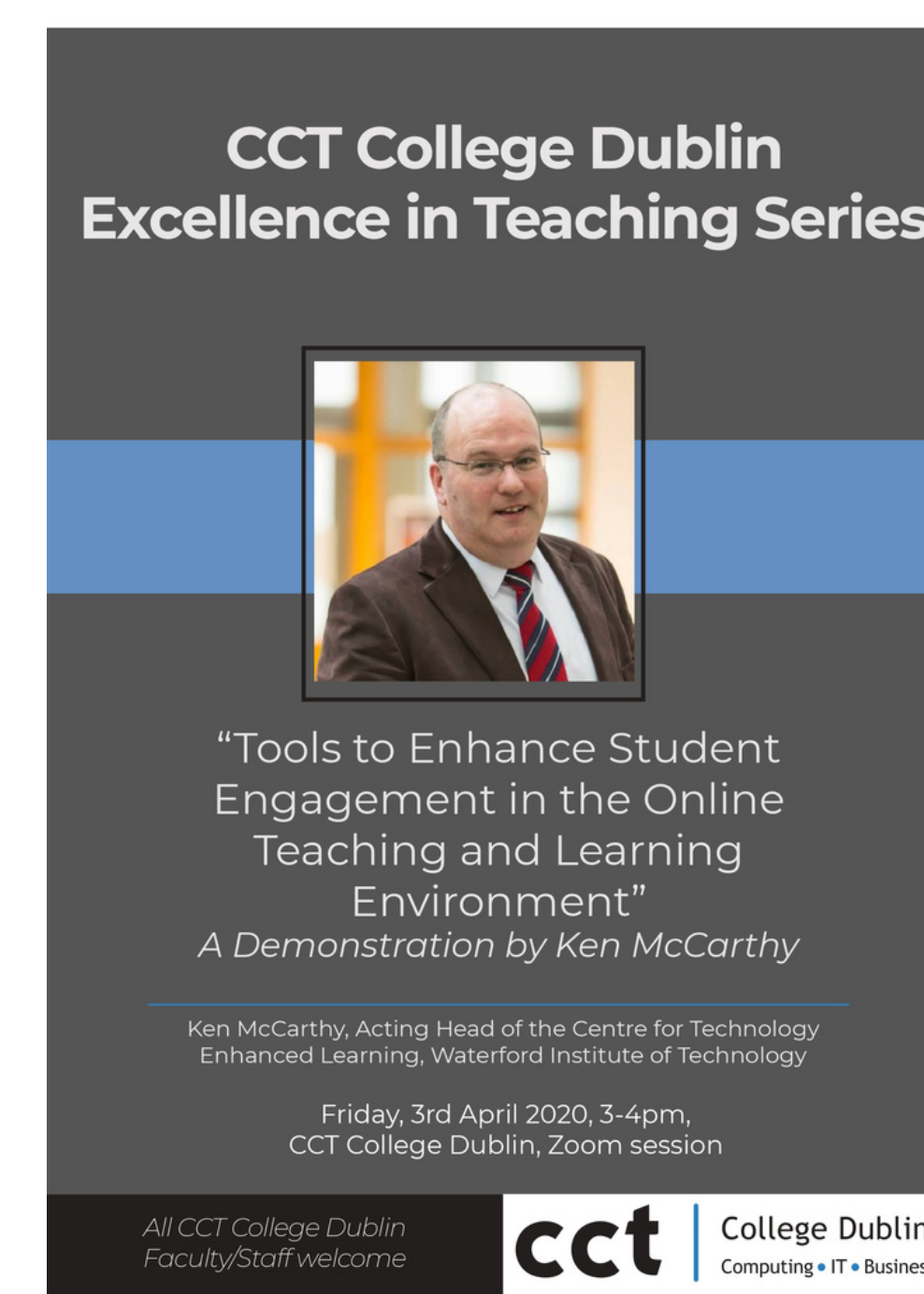
