Sandra was very active in campus life and Produced the Miss Prairie View A&M Pageant for 2 years. She was the first Student Manager for Miss Prairie View A&M. Sandra also assisted in the production of the first Miss Black and Gold Pageant. With her 12 years experience, Sandra is currently associated with The Miss a Saginaw County Pageant, a Miss America preliminary. Sandra holds membership in several civic and community organizations including the Saginaw Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., NOBCChE (National Organization for the Professional Advancement of Black Chemists and Chemical Engineers), Adopt-A-School Program, Chairperson for Project MITE and Secretary for the AIChE Mid-Michigan Chapter. She is employed with The Dow Chemical Company as a Production Engineer. Sandra is married and resides in Saginaw with her husband and daughter.



DELLENOR MILES received her Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminal Justice from Prairie View A&M University in 1987. As Miss Prairie View A&M in 1984, Dellenor was named 4th Runner-up to Miss Texas and also received the best Talented Singer Award. Dellenor went on to become Miss Beaumont 1985, Miss Harris County 1987 and Miss Liberty County 1990. Aside from her pageant experiences, Dellenor was employed with the Child & Adolescent Development, Inc. of Houston and was the 'Employee of the Year' in 1989. Professionally, she has performed at Showtime at the Apollo, Lou Rawls Parade of Stars and the Kennedy Center Theater Arts Festival. While at Prairie View, Dellenor held membership in the Charles Gilpin Players, and is a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. Dellenor currently resides in Los Angeles pursuing a professional singing career and has a Chrevolet and McDonald commercials to her credit.



DON L. WOLFE received a Bachelor of Science degree from Prairie

View A&M University in 1977. He began his sales career in the automobile business with Mosehart & Keller Ford in 1977 and joined Mort Hall Ford, Inc as a salesman in 1979 and was named Salesman of the Year in 1982. Don progressed through the ranks of New Car and Truck Sales Manager to General Sales Manager. Since 1988, he has been president and co-owner of Mort Hall Ford of Houston. Under Don's leadership, Mort Hall Ford was named the #1 Retail Ford Dealer Award in the Houston District of 160 Ford Dealers. Don holds membership in several professional groups including the Society of Professional Sales Manager and received the Outstanding Black Achievers and Houston's Entrepreneur Awards.

Miss Prairie View A&M University Scholarship Pageant A Historical Perspective

The era of the "seventies" introduced a new dimension of the Miss Prairie View A&M concept. Growing out of an earlier period, which focused on the election of a queen who reigned supreme at "Pantherland", the Miss Prairie View A&M Pageant introduced and extended its emphasis and provided the opportunity for "Miss Prairie View A&M" to compete in the Miss Texas Pageant, and ultimately in the Miss America Pageant.

Broadening the University's philosophical premise that "education must encompass the personal and social development of the individual as well as his/her intellectual, professional and cultural development", the University purchased a franchise from the Miss Texas-Miss America Pageants, to provide opportunities for its young women to enter the broader social-cultural competitive arena.

On April 28, 1970, the Miss Prairie View A&M Pageant became the first University pageant which was sponsored in cooperation with the Miss Texas-Miss America Pageants. Margaret Penn of Houston, Texas was selected as the winner, thus becoming the first Miss Prairie View A&M University to compete for the Miss Texas title. Prairie View A&M University, once again, made a major thrust forward into the mainstream of the American social system. As it made this move, it also provided for its young ladies a national experience; namely, the State and National competitors for Miss America, as an environment for learning and studying the concepts of the Free Enterprise System by becoming competitors in the social and cultural environment.

It was the "decade of the 70's" and Prairie View A&M University was on the move. A new era was being forged and the University was moving boldly to end its first century of service to the State and Nation while charting its future as it moved into its "Second Century". Throughout the University there were visible signs of tangible changes; yes, a change of its physical form. In the intellectual environment the change was electrifying, as the University moved for Excellence. In the world of academics, it broadened its scope and a dynamic faculty, students and administrators, developed programs to serve the state, the nation and the international communities. Therefore, the ushering in of the Miss Prairie View A&M Pageant, as a part of time larger Miss Texas and Miss America pageants, was compatible with the "new philosophy" at the University.

"The decade of the 70's" was coming to a close but the Miss Prairie View A&M Pageant had became the highlight of the social-cultural season at the University. Young ladies in gracious splendor as the vibrant colors of spring came alive in their highly fashionable evening gowns and young men garbed in sartorial elegance of white tie and formal tails set the scene for the social season. It was also during the seventies that the Royal Coronation for Miss Prairie View A&M University was revived in all it splendor.

The "decade of the 80's" was ushered in with the selection of Natalie McKinney of Bay City. The Pageant also made more impact during this period when Ava' Maria Malone of Houston became the first Miss Prairie View A&M to be recognized as a non-finalist in the Miss Texas Pageant in 1982. She was followed for the same honor by Lillie L. Taylor of Kinlock, Missouri and Lenice D. Brown of Prairie View. National recognition was brought to the University when Lillie Taylor was crowned Miss Collegiate Black America in 1985 and Shari Love was crowned Miss Black College Alumni Hall of Fame in 1987. The highlight thus far has been the selection of Dellenor R. Miles of Houston, Texas as Fourth Runner-up to Miss Texas in 1984, thus becoming the first Miss Prairie View A&M University to be named a finalist, in addition to the Most Talented Singer at the Pageant.

The "decade of the 90's is young but is already labeled the 'decade of achievement in pageantry' at the University. Mary Ann Palmer of Bellville, Texas, was named fourth Runner-up in the Miss Black College Hall of Fame 1990 and was crowned Miss Collegiate African American 1990-91. The winning tradition continued when Jolie Lynn McKeel of St. Louis, Missouri was named 3rd Runner-up and Elizabeth E. Vaughn of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, was named 4th Runner-up in the Miss Black College Hall of Fame Pageant for 1991 and 1992, respectively. These young women have continued to bring national and international recognition to the University.

The Miss Prairie View A&M University Scholarship Pageant has been provided many varied experiences for the students, and particularly the young women at Prairie View A&M University. It has served well as a part of the development of the 'whole person'.

This coincides with the philosophy of a University of the 'first class'. Finally, the pageant program has provided another avenue for mainstreaming and recognizing the individual achievement of the students.
