
E WAY TO OXFORD'S H








Another notable act is Cleveland DMI product, Schaefer Llana, who comes off the heels of her recently released full length, 49 Ceiling Tiles, which has received raved reviews nationwide. Other acts from Mississippi include Oxford's And The Echo; Blackwater Trio, a three-piece gone full band with screaming violin and a whirlwind of vocal harmonies; and A Scarlet Empire, whose 2010 Otherfest performance literally caused a plague of crickets and brought on strong, unexplained winds. All told, 16 bands will grace the stage at this year's Otherfest.

DEAR PAW'S CORNER: My cat "Pedro" had his annual checkup the other day, and the veterinarian said he needed to lose 10 pounds. Can you believe that? He doesn't look fat at all—in fact Pedro looks very

healthy. Could the vet be wrong? -Barbara Y., Burlington, Vermont

DEAR BARBARA: A healthy, recommended weight for a cat does vary between breeds. A Maine Coon, for example, can weigh as much as 25 pounds, while some Siamese cats are feather-light at just over 5 pounds.

You can verify the vet's diagnosis in two ways: search online for the recommended healthy weight for his breed. Or, try these at-home techniques:


Stand over Pedro and look down at him. His body from this angle should look kind of like an hourglass if he's at a healthy weight. If he looks like a pear, he's outside the norm for

- Now, look at Pedro from the side. Does his belly sag? That's typically extra fat.
- Finally, hold Pedro in your lap. Can you feel his ribs when you run a hand along his flank? If not, then it's time to slim him down.

To help Pedro lose weight, control his feeding more tightly. Feed him exactly the amount of cat food recommended by the vet, at the times of day recommended (sometimes it's once a day, sometimes twice). Don't leave uneaten food in Pedro's dish; clean it out. If he begs for food between meals, don't give it to him.

Increase Pedro's activity wherever you can. When you're relaxing in the front room, have him chase a feather or mouse toy. You also can buy a "puzzle feeder" that makes him work a little harder to get his food.



DEAR PAW'S CORNER: Why does my Great Dane fart so much? —James K., Syracuse, New York



DEAR JAMES: Hoo boy. Great Danes are notorious for passing gas. And because they're big dogs, well, it's impossible not to notice. Part of the reason is that they often are prone to digestive issues and can be sensitive to some varieties of dog food.

Talk to your dog's veterinarian about this, as he or she will have some suggestions for reducing flatulence. The No. 1 recommendation will be a change to a different brand of dog food.

Try introducing the new food gradually, replacing part of its current food with the new brand and increasing the ratio of old to new. Note whether its gas symptoms diminish, or if there's no change.

Theories abound as to why Great Danes and other large breeds like Bull Mastiffs rip so many stinky farts. Fermentation of digesting food in the large intestine is one. Dry dog foods with a lot of grain filler may make this worse. If your dog is fed table scraps, even occasionally, this could contribute to the problem, as human food tends to be higher in fat with lots of spices.

Large breeds also are very susceptible to bloat, so stay aware of your dog's physical condition. When the stomach swells up with excess gas it can be very painful and put the dog at risk of gastric torsion, which requires immediate surgery. Labored breathing, excessive drooling, vomiting, or an enlarged abdomen are among the symptoms of bloat. Take your dog to the emergency vet right away if you notice any of these symptoms.
