Award-winning songwriter and music producer **Tena Clark** presents what is sure to be one of 2018's major memoirs with *Southern Discomfort*, an extraordinary story of a girl coming of age in the Civil Rights-era Deep South. nineteen, she came out as a lesbian to her mother, and then to her father, before ultimately leaving the South to pursue her dream of becoming a famous musician—but Mississippi would always remain her home. A powerful coming-of-age story, *Southern Discomfort* is about how the people and places we come from shape who we are, but do not define who we will become.

As a songwriter and producer Tena Clark has worked with some of the biggest stars in music, including **Aretha Franklin**, **Patti**

Tena Clark was born in 1953 in a tiny Mississippi town close to the Alabama border, the youngest daughter of the town's very wealthy, notorious womanizer and his beautiful alcoholic wife.

Adding to the turmoil, Tena understood from a very young age that she was different from her three older sisters, all of whom had been beauty queens and majorettes. Tena didn't want to be a majorette—she wanted to marry one. When she was

influences, including: twangy Southern rock . . . reverb-soaked psychedelia reminiscent of early My Morning Jacket or . . . Phosphorescent, soaring guitar solos à la Neil Young and Crazy Horse, rhythmic jangle from that other Athens band, REM, multi-part vocal harmonies, and, weaving through it all, lyrical slide guitar" (vox.com).

Another notable act is Cleveland DMI product, **Schaefer Llana**, who comes off the heels of her recently released full length, *49 Ceiling Tiles*, which has received raved reviews nationwide. Other acts from Mississippi include **Oxford's And The Echo**; **Blackwater Trio**, a three-piece gone full band with screaming violin and a whirlwind of vocal harmonies; and **A Scarlet Empire**, whose 2010 Otherfest performance literally caused a plague of crickets and brought on strong, unexplained winds. All told, 16 bands will grace the stage at this year's Otherfest.

Gates open at 5 pm on Friday, and admission for the festival will be \$25 at the gate. Small coolers are permitted inside the festival grounds. Car-pooling as well as camping are strongly encouraged for the festival.

An **Adopt-A-Band** campaign has been set up to give regional businesses and private donors sponsorship opportunities for the festival, all of which are tax deductible.

Since 2006, **Otherfest** has held the stage for over 100 indie-label and unsigned bands from around the U.S. ranging in genres from blues to bluegrass, from hip-hop to rock, and every sub-genre in between. This October 5th and 6th, Otherfest grows into its teenage years with big plans and big headliners. The 13th annual Otherfest, sponsored by **Keep Cleveland Boring** and **Budweiser**, will feature 16 music acts over two days. In addition to live original music, the festival boasts two days of free camping, food trucks, and art and beverage vending in a two-day, all ages music festival just north of **Cleveland, Mississippi**, on Highway 61.

Originally a one-day fest, Otherfest grew to two-days in 2017. "After such great success last year with having the festival over a two full days instead of cramming everything into one day, we decided two things: First, two days of music is way better than one and second, with all of Cleveland on a music high with the recent addition of the Grammy Museum, it's time for bigger acts that everyone can enjoy while still staying true to our indie roots," said festival organizer **William "Weejy" Rogers**.

This year's lineup includes headliners, **Futurebirds**, whose "music is a patchwork amalgam of

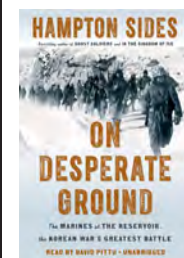

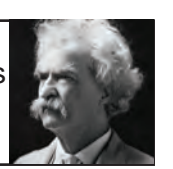

DEAR PAW'S CORNER:
 My cat "Pedro" had his annual checkup the other day, and the veterinarian said he needed to lose 10 pounds. Can you believe that? He doesn't look fat at all—in fact Pedro looks very

healthy. Could the vet be wrong?
 —Barbara Y., Burlington, Vermont

DEAR BARBARA: A healthy, recommended weight for a cat does vary between breeds. A Maine Coon, for example, can weigh as much as 25 pounds, while some Siamese cats are feather-light at just over 5 pounds.

You can verify the vet's diagnosis in two ways: search online for the recommended healthy weight for his breed. Or, try these at-home techniques:

- Stand over Pedro and look down at him. His body from this angle should look kind of like an hourglass if he's at a healthy weight. If he looks like a pear, he's outside the norm for weight.

- Now, look at Pedro from the side. Does his belly sag? That's typically extra fat.
- Finally, hold Pedro in your lap. Can you feel his ribs when you run a hand along his flank? If not, then it's time to slim him down.

To help Pedro lose weight, control his feeding more tightly. Feed him exactly the amount of cat food recommended by the vet, at the times of day recommended (sometimes it's once a day, sometimes twice). Don't leave uneaten food in Pedro's dish; clean it out. If he begs for food between meals, don't give it to him.

Increase Pedro's activity wherever you can. When you're relaxing in the front room, have him chase a feather or mouse toy. You also can buy a "puzzle feeder" that makes him work a little harder to get his food.

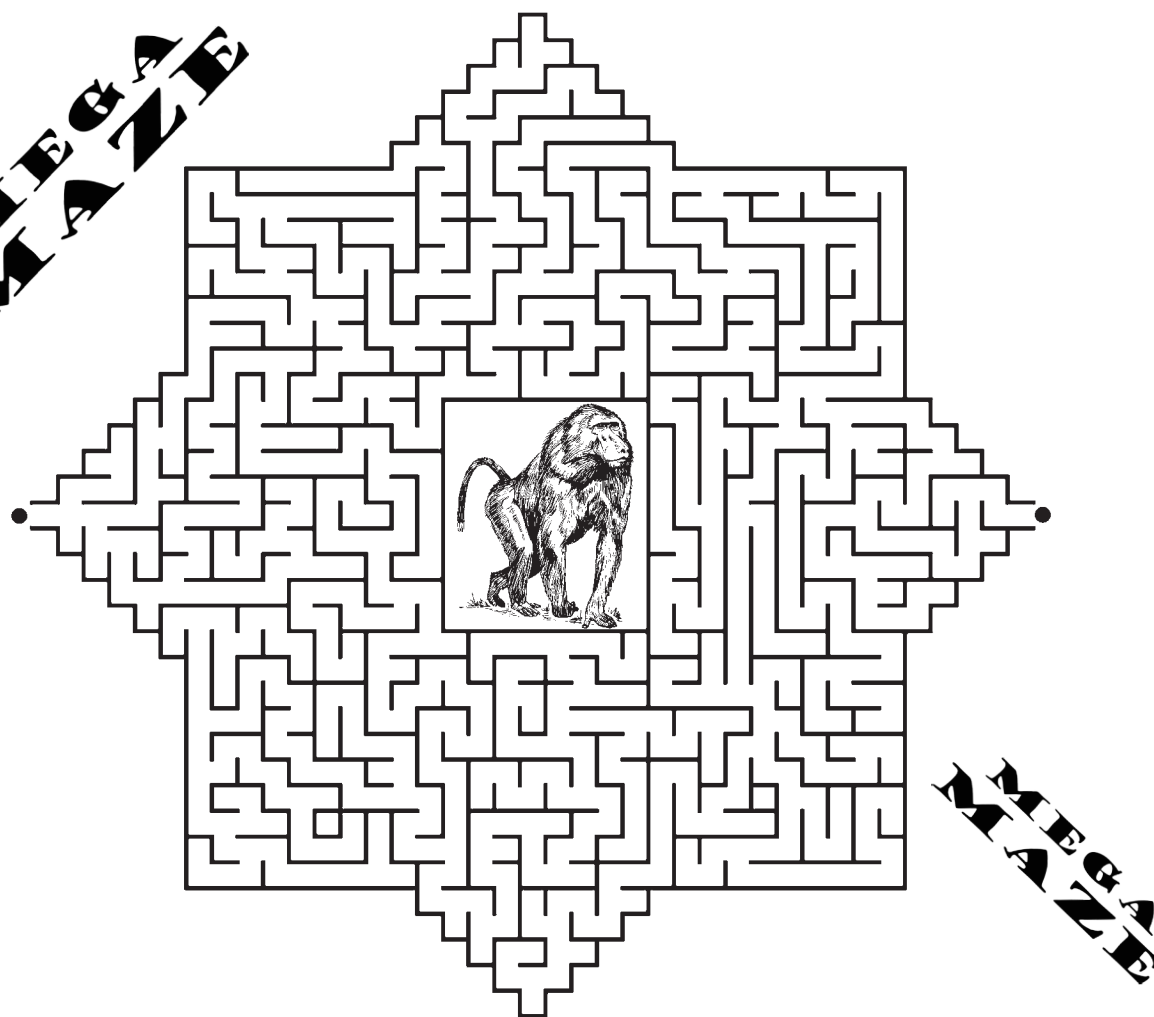

DEAR PAW'S CORNER: Why does my Great Dane fart so much? —James K., Syracuse, New York



DEAR JAMES: Hoo boy. Great Danes are notorious for passing gas. And because they're big dogs, well, it's impossible not to notice. Part of the reason is that they often are prone to digestive issues and can be sensitive to some varieties of dog food.

Talk to your dog's veterinarian about this, as he or she will have some suggestions for reducing flatulence. The No. 1 recommendation will be a change to a different brand of dog food.

Try introducing the new food gradually, replacing part of its current food with the new brand and increasing the ratio of old to new. Note whether its gas symptoms diminish, or if there's no change.

Theories abound as to why Great Danes and other large breeds like Bull Mastiffs rip so many stinky farts. Fermentation of digesting food in the large intestine is one. Dry dog foods with a lot of grain filler may make this worse. If your dog is fed table scraps, even occasionally, this could contribute to the problem, as human food tends to be higher in fat with lots of spices.

Large breeds also are very susceptible to bloat, so stay aware of your dog's physical condition. When the stomach swells up with excess gas it can be very painful and put the dog at risk of gastric torsion, which requires immediate surgery. Labored breathing, excessive drooling, vomiting, or an enlarged abdomen are among the symptoms of bloat. Take your dog to the emergency vet right away if you notice any of these symptoms.

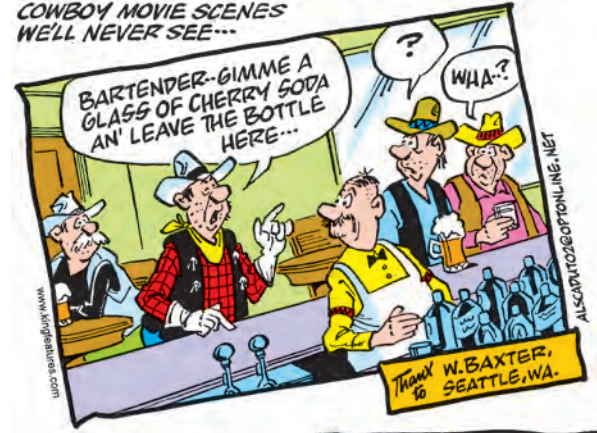
