Dear Mother:

I was glad to get your letter and know that your Social Security payments are starting. That will help a lot, I know. It's too bad you didn't get to make the trip to Texas. How is Aunt Mary Lee now?

Everything is quiet here--the summer doldrums. Lots of people are away on vacations and so nothing much is done in the way of real business.

I'm going off on a short vacation tomorrow. The plans to join Bill and his wife on the Chesapeake Bay didn't work out, as she found out she had only a week's vacation and they have to go home to visit their families. So I decided to go to St. Martin again. It's cheaper than any place around here that I could go and I do need to get away and have a rest. I didn't have any time off last year, except a week during which I stayed in town and worked on the Latin translation.

The summer has been very mild so far, with only a few hot days and some very cool ones. I haven't had the fan on to sleep by the whole time.

I haven't heard from Frank or Jimmy either, except for a card from Frank after he got back to Jackson. I guess he'll be leaving for Texas again soon. Major called one night not long ago, and said he was going to be working in Miami for a few months, and then he hoped to get his permanent place, probably in Charleston, if it works out. That's where he wants to go, anyhow.

I got a letter from Mary Alice at camp, but it was enly a day or so before she was leaving so I couldn't write her there. I'll send her and Elizabeth cards from St. Martin.
