My dear Aunt

We got home by twelve o'clock after a passage of one hour, and fifty minutes, found the girls all well; they were quite disappointed in not seeing you return with me, as they say you promised to spend a week with us before you went to Phi-a - if you do return to N.Y. again this summer, or any other time, I hope you will consider this, as one of your homes and shall always be happy to see you, and family, and as far as lays in our power to do you any service, shall consider it as a favor in so doing.

I have sent six y^{ds} and a half of musling - which was all she had left, and your tooth-brush - I saw Mr Capino - last evening at Madama La Croix's, and told him I was going to send down some things for you, which he promised to take good care off. I went to Mrs L - for the things you told me, you had left there - but have not got them.

I wish you a pleasant ride, and hope the weather will remain
so cool till you get home - Adieu my dear Aunt, we all
join in best love to Uncle, and the family at Abyssinia
and believe me I will always remain your sincere
and affectionate niece
