Madam,

It is at the request of Mr Thomas W
Willing that I at present trouble you. It
seems that Mr Sean & Mr Wm Smith were appoint-
ed, by the Stockholders of South Carolina, to vote
for Directors by Proxy, and that Mr Sean, at the
Election in January 1795, attended & gave in the Votes,
the Powers of the Proxies however cannot be found,
and Mr Willing being at that Election One of the
Judges, has in a particular manner been called
upon for those Papers. He desired me therefore
to write you Madam on the Subject and to
request, that you will be so good and examine all

your Papers, and if the Powers are found to transmit
them to me by some safe Conveyance —

I hope my last letter inclosing a remittance
for Eight hundred Dollars has come safe to
hand — it was dated the 30 of August —

One of Mr^r Ricketts Tickets in the Canal Lottery
has drawn one of the smallest Prizes for which I
have credited your Account with Ten dollars & Twenty
Cents — The other Tickets that were received are
Blanks —
