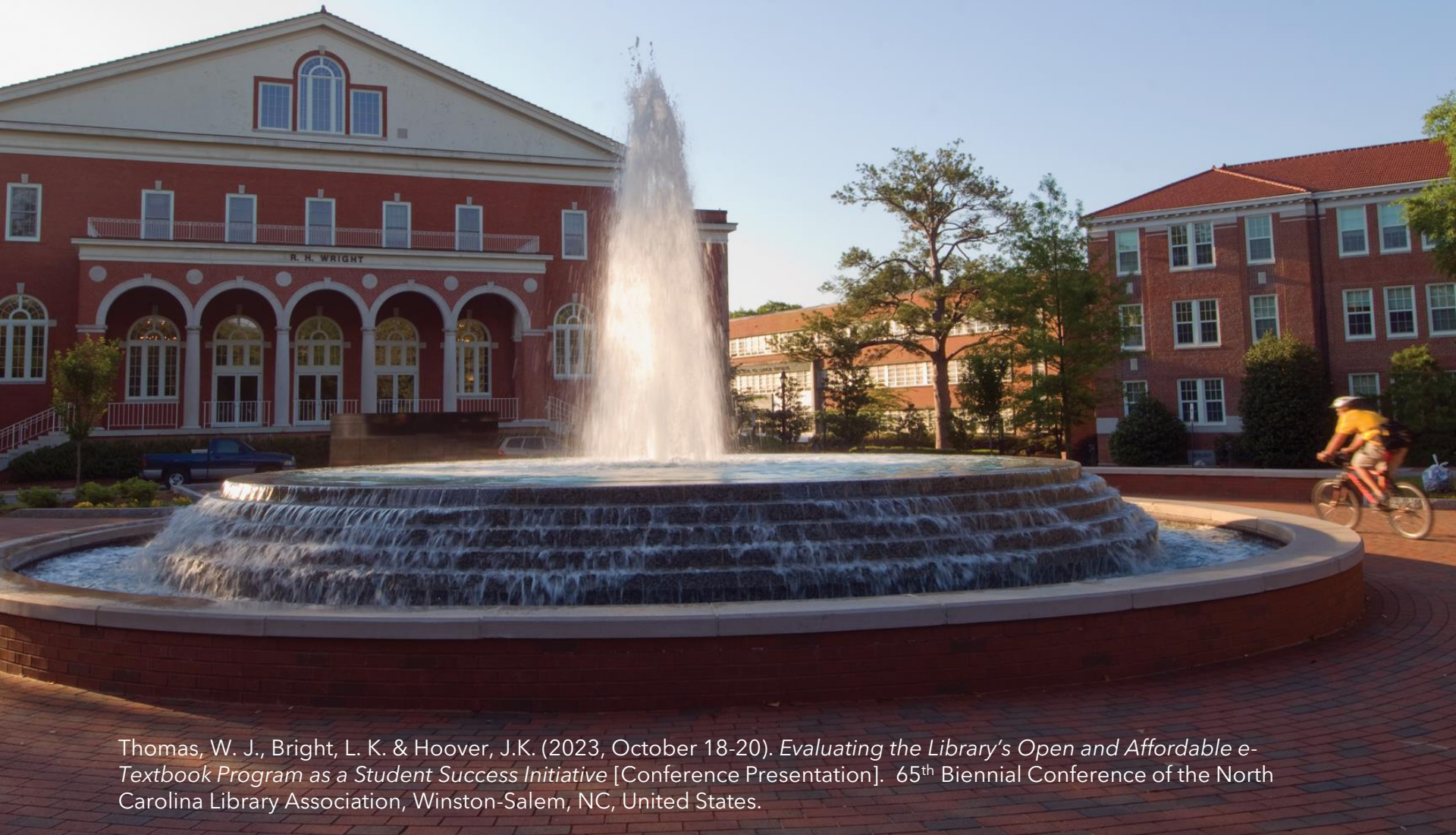

→ Lead textbook affordability initiatives

- Engage effectively with underserved students, including those from low-income families and rural counties, transfer students, and active military and veterans
- Champion student excellence in research, writing and creative activity
- Foster graduate student success
- Provide physical and online environments that facilitate and inspire learning and knowledge creation

Course Adopted eTextbook (CAT) Program

Textbooks:

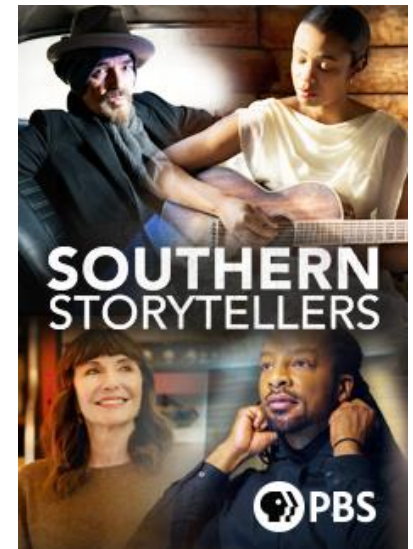
- Review the required textbook list (provided by the bookstore)
- Determine which ebooks we already own for unlimited users
- Select and acquire additional ebooks
- List on Free E-Textbooks webpage: <https://lib.ecu.edu/alt-texts>
- Notify faculty members



Course Adopted eTextbook (CAT) Program

Streaming Media:

- Open request form and notify faculty
- Check existing licenses and availability of new films
- Acquire/renew films as needed (esp. Kanopy and Swank)
- Notify faculty members



Alternative Textbook Program

- Provides awards of \$1,000 to faculty to move to free or low-cost materials (about 10/year)
 - Open Educational Resources (OER)
 - Library materials
- Faculty are assigned a personal librarian
- Optional summer workshops and a Canvas course are provided



CAT Program Evaluation

CAT Impacts

- Fall 2015 – Spring 2023 (17 terms)
- LSTA grant from 2016-2018 (with UNCG)
- Over the most recent five years, nearly \$2.8M in savings:

CAT Impacts

- Top Books used in about 110 sections across 12 terms (6 years)
 - *Developing Reading Comprehension*, maximum potential savings more than \$60,000
 - *Developing Word Recognition*, maximum potential savings topping \$70,000
- Of 1,101 titles, across editions:
 - Used more than 2 terms on average
 - 27 books used 10 or more terms

CAT Impacts

- Streaming Media:
 - Began reporting 2019-2020
 - For 2022-2023: 227 film requests by faculty in 16 depts across 5 colleges
 - Student Tech Fees paid for AVON + Swank
 - Library funds for Kanopy and some others

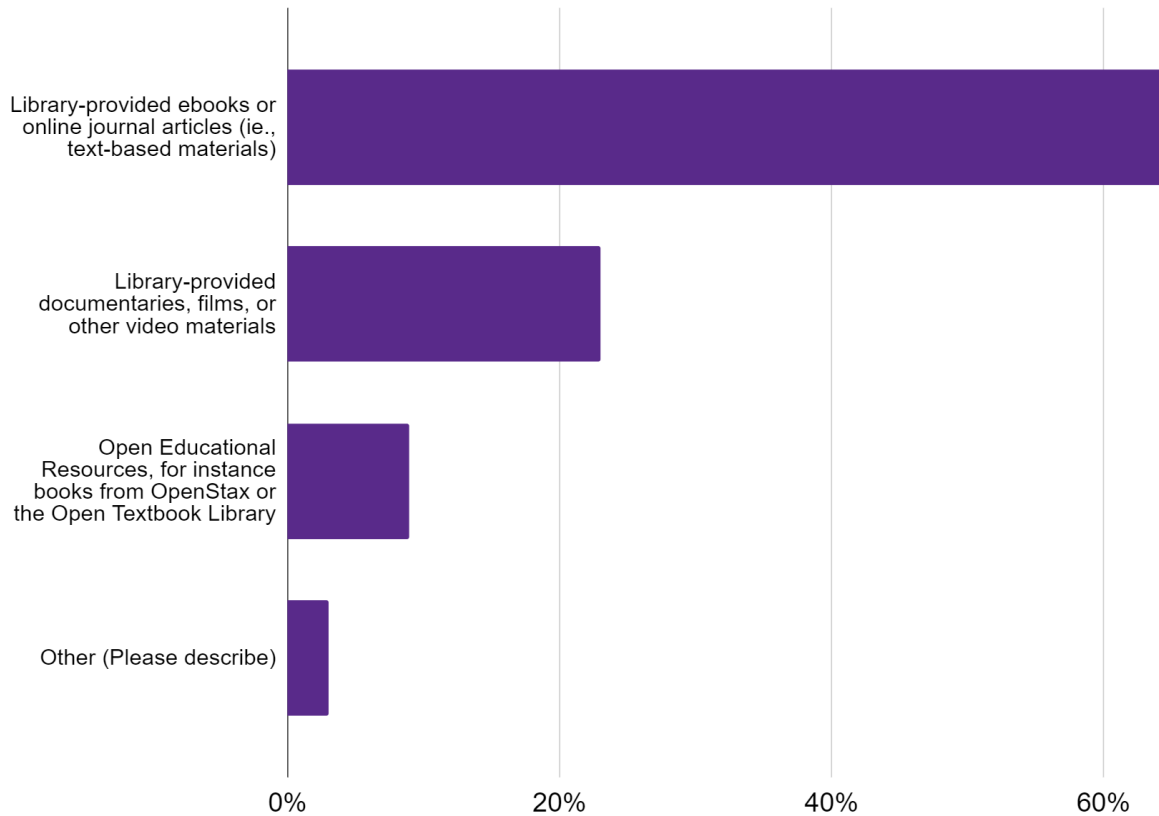

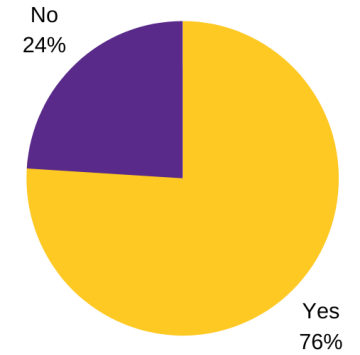

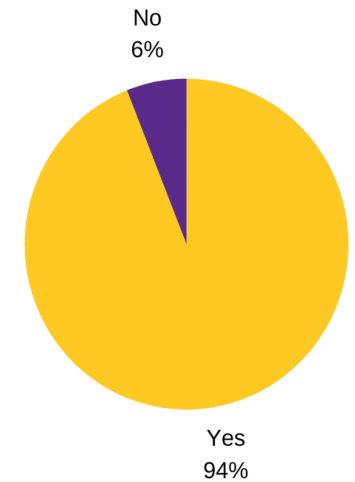
Course Content

CAT Survey Results (2)

Impacts on Students

Engagement with Course Content	77% moderate/high positive impact
Engagement with Professor	55% positive, 45% no discernible impact
Improved Student Learning Overall	78% moderate/high positive impact
Perception of Reduced D/F/W Rates	55% no discernible impact, 45% positive

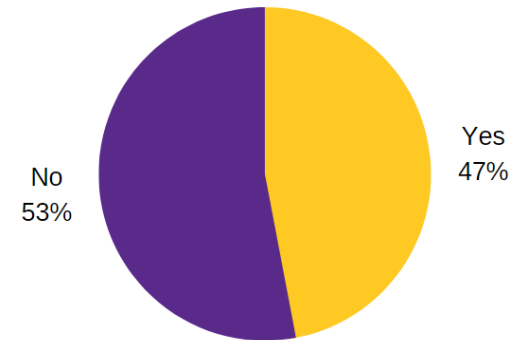
Impacts for Professors

Own Engagement with Content	68% moderate/high positive impact
Own Engagement with Students	65% moderate/high positive impact

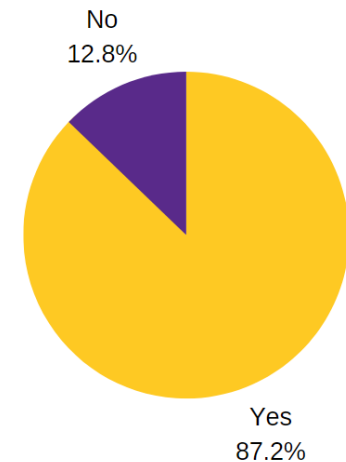
CAT Survey Results (3)

- Most important benefits?
73 responses:
 - 56 mention cost savings
 - 35 mention access* and/or format
- Suggestions? 51 responses
 - 21 were N/A or “Thanks”
 - Improved communication (16)
 - Earlier notification
 - More publicity
 - Include more courses/texts (8)

Alt-Text Program Evaluation

COUP Elements

- A. Costs: Students' cost avoidance by switching texts
- B. Outcomes: Number students served and courses/departments most impacted

- D. Perceptions: Survey faculty about student engagement, effectiveness of materials, successes, challenges, and suggestions

Alt-Text Impacts

- Over 7 years, awards for 72 faculty members from 34 departments in all 6 Main Campus colleges
- Significant changes: BIOL, ECON, & PSYC switched to OER
- Faculty select free texts for NEW courses

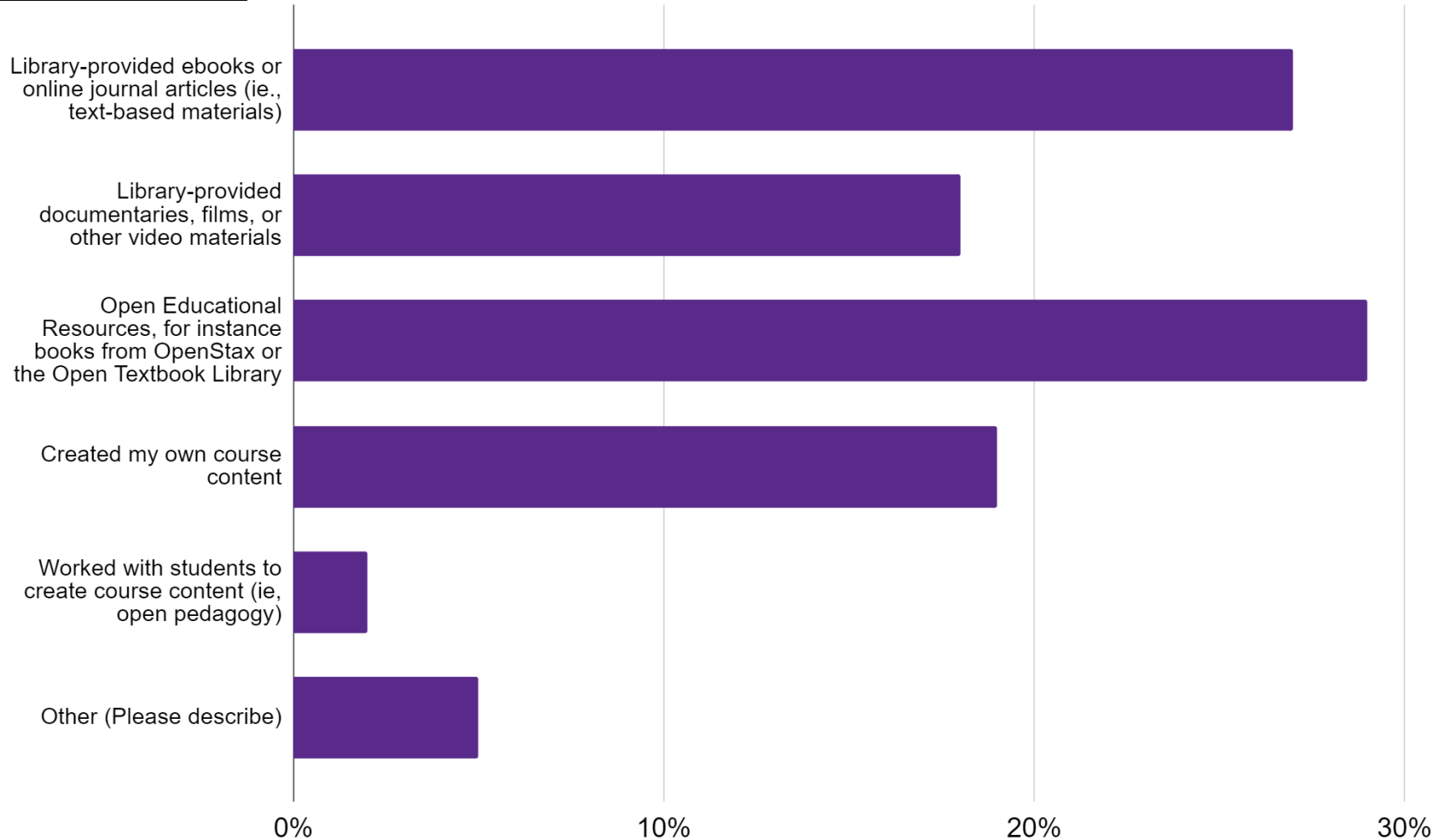

Engagement with Professor	57% positive, 43% no discernible impact
Improving Student Learning Overall	79% moderate/high positive impact
Perception of Reduced D/F/W Rates	52% positive, 48% no discernible impact

Impacts for Professors

Own Engagement with Content	86% moderate/high positive impact
Own Engagement with Students	79% moderate/high positive impact

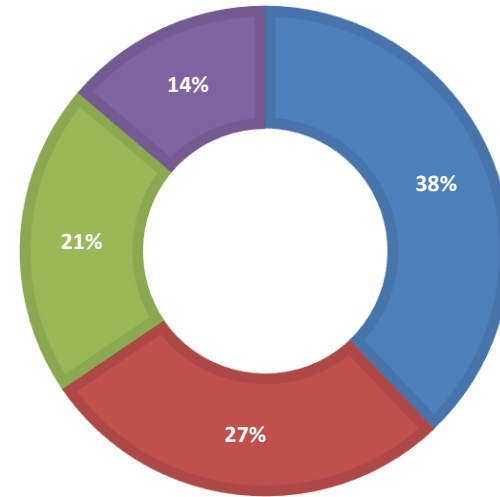
Primary motivations for participating

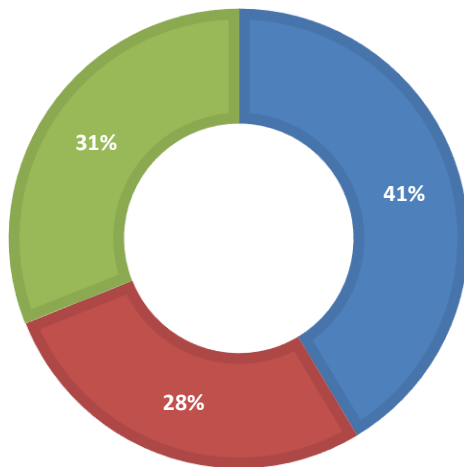
HOW MANY TIMES DID YOU WORK WITH YOUR LIBRARIAN?

IN TOUCH WITH LIBRARIANS AFTER THE ALT-TEXT PROGRAM

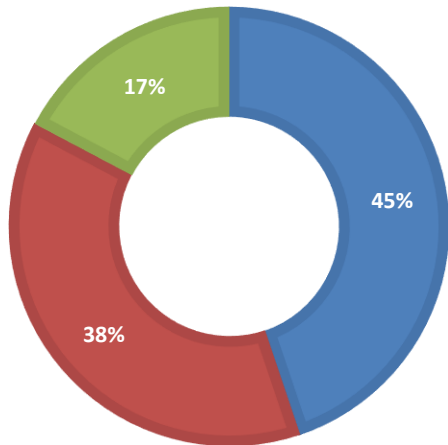
■ About the same ■ Less ■ More

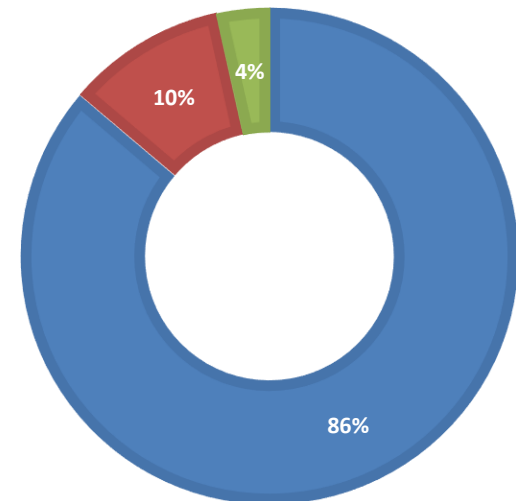
QUALITY OF MATERIALS COMPARED TO PREVIOUS RESOURCES

■ About the Same ■ Better ■ Lower



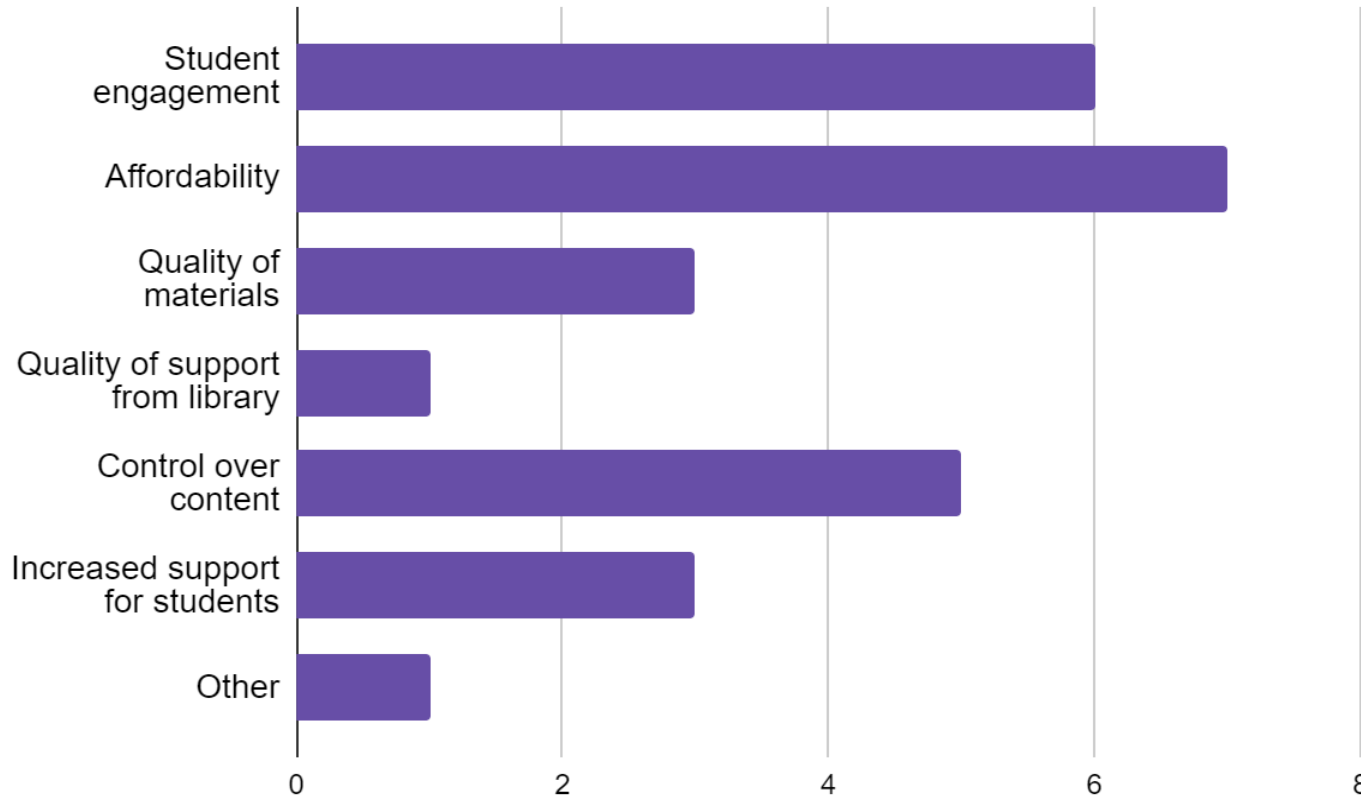
USE ALT-TEXTS IN FUTURE?

■ Yes ■ Maybe ■ No



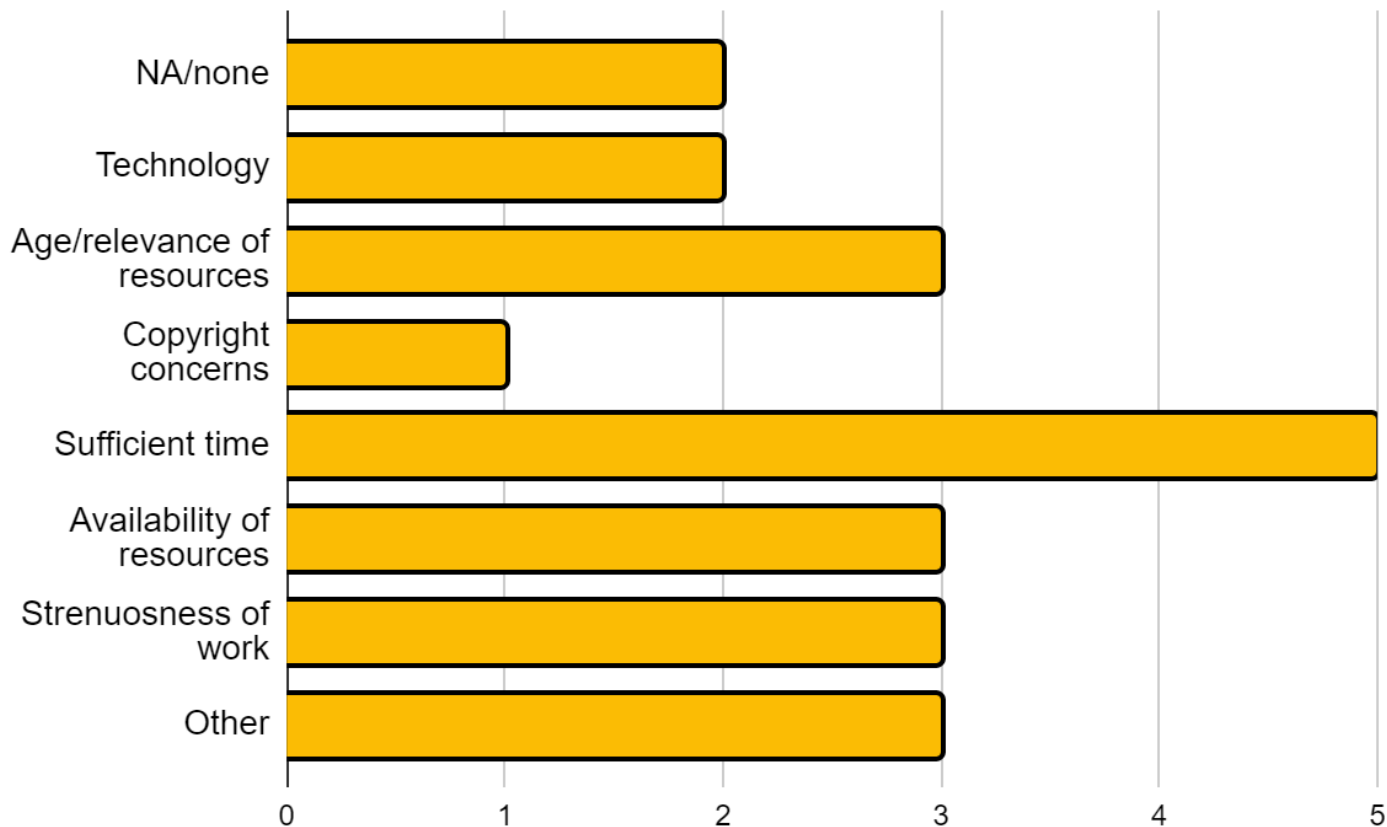

Alt-Text Survey Results (8)

Comments/suggestions about Alternative Textbook Program:

- **20%** suggested **specific additional resources**
- **17%** suggested **improved communication**
- **38%** made **positive comments**

"This is a great program and I am grateful that I was selected to participate in it. I intend to continue working with 'my librarian' during the school year and find more useful resources to improve the quality of my course materials."

"My experience was very positive. I worked with two librarians who were well-versed in my content area and they provided me with selections that fit my needs and parameters."


"I would have done this without the stipend, but it was nice to be recognized for my efforts."

Interview Insights


- Invited 24 faculty members, both CAT and Alt-Text, 8 interviews (33%)
- Included faculty from Arts & Humanities, Social Sciences, and Sciences
- Questions included advice for others, how they would evaluate success, and how we could improve to increase participation

Interview Insights

- Links in syllabus and on Canvas
- It takes longer than anticipated....but
- Focus on learning objectives, then find resources to support those goals
- To encourage participation:
 - Take OER suggestions to faculty
 - Work with chairs → "Take the show on the road"

Interview Insights

Great opportunity
to start from
scratch

- Largely adopted existing OER
 - Swap out some materials over time
- Unsure if greater participation is because of free access to materials or redesigned class
- Feel successful: more engagement, more reading
- Like the “democratic aspect” / equity of materials being available to all

Affordability and
inclusiveness

Next Steps:

- Consider additional marketing methods
- Timing on CAT notices to professors
- Work with Institutional Research on student success impacts
- Monitor/measure changes as a result of bookstore taken on by Barnes & Noble
- Look for better ways to assess cost savings
