Linked Data and Wikimedia Defined



- ***Linked Data:** A set of best practices for publishing and connecting structured data on the web
 - **Wikimedia:** The foundation that supports all the wiki projects
 - **Wikimedia Commons:** Media repository for files linked to in other wiki projects
 - **Wikipedia:** Free encyclopedia written and maintained by volunteers
 - **Wikidata:** Repository of linked open data

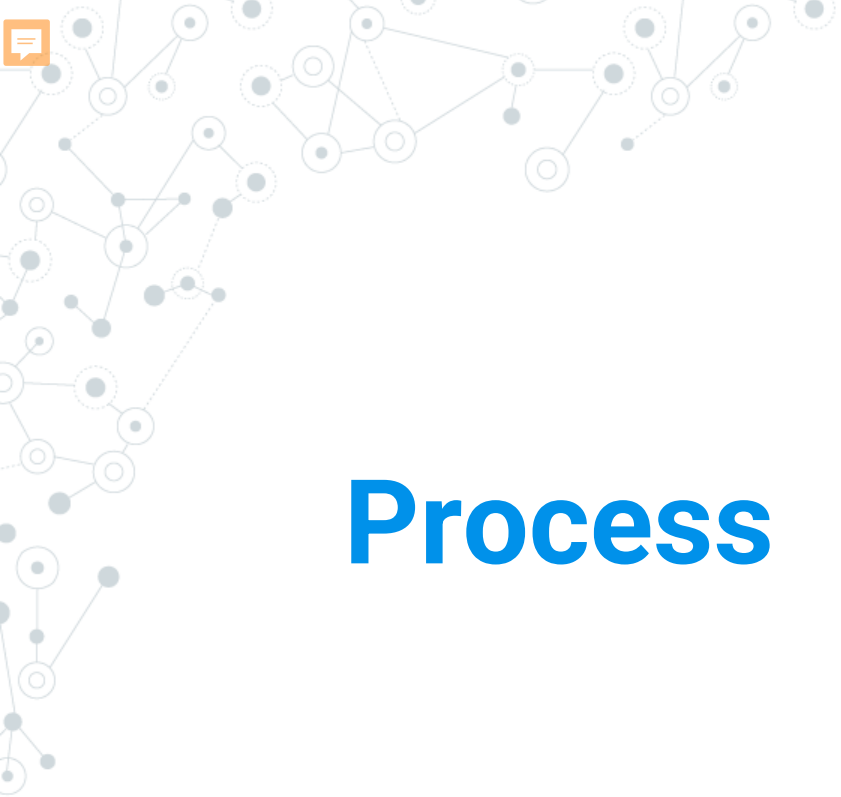
Pilot Goals

- Test proof of concept:
 - Adding content to Wikimedia Commons leads to increased access and use of digital collections
- Pilot participants:
 - Learn a practical application of linked data
- Minitex staff:
 - Learn more to provide better future support



Scope and Timeline

- 25 images per organization to Wikimedia Commons
 - Make connections in Wikipedia articles
 - Add structured data in Wikimedia Commons to connect with Wikidata
- April 2023 - August 2023

2. Discussed selection of content to include
 - a. all items used “No Copyright - United States” rights statement
3. Wikimedia Commons [Information Template](#)
 - a. Default Upload template
 - b. Fields required: Description, Date, Source, and Author
 - c. Customizable

- [Image File Guidelines](#)
 - [Maximum FILE Size](#) for any file = 4 GB

File Formats

- SVG is the preferred format for diagrams, charts, illustrations, maps, and any graphic that needs labels.

Author

Definition: Original author[s] of the file; where appropriate.

Note: For Minnesota Digital Library contributing organizations Author = Creator. If the author/creator is not known, add the word "Unknown" as this Wikimedia Commons field requires a value. Authors can be individuals or corporate bodies and should be entered in "natural language order."

- **Selection:** Random 25 images (some in [MDL](#), some in [Arch](#), all NoC-US)
- **Wikipedia:**

- **Templates:** New category, Info template, tested [Artwork template](#) ([DPLA modified](#))
- **Formats:** Images, [Audio](#) file with a transcript

Pilot Work - Blue Earth County Historical Society

- **Why:** Experiment, learn from and with others, expand access
- **Selection:** (25 images, all [MDL](#), all NoC-US)
 - Represent our cities, townships, and communities
 - Historical interests beyond Blue Earth County
- **Wikipedia:** All but one linked to Wikipedia
- **Templates:** Info, [photograph](#), and [map](#) templates
- **Examples:**

 - [C & NW Locomotive](#)
 - [Making Cement Sidewalks in Lake Crystal](#)

Pilot Work - University of Minnesota Libraries

- **Why:** Increase outreach and access beyond the traditional digital collections website; knew some of our material had already been included on Wikimedia through DPLA, but wanted to learn more
- **Selection:** Materials from [UMedia](#), specifically UMN University Archives
 - NoC-US / Public Domain
 - Important to uplift diverse voices and histories wherever possible (more on that in a few slides)
- **Wikipedia:**
 - Some linked to articles, some not; considered when looking at statistics
- **Template:**
 - All items used Info Template for ease of uploading; Tested [Book](#) template but did not like its representation of serials and yearbooks
- **Formats:**
 - 25 objects total - 22 photos, 2 books, 1 video
- **Examples:**

 - [UMN Football Team, 1904](#)

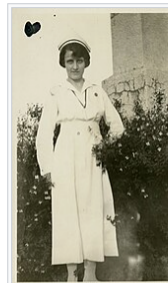
Pilot Work - University of Minnesota Libraries Example



Summary [\[edit \]](#)

Description	English: Katharine Jane Densford (1890–1978) was an American nurse who made important contributions to nursing education and to nursing services during World War II. Densford's leadership of Minnesota's flagship school of nursing, located in the Minneapolis-Saint Paul area provided the model for nursing education throughout the state and nation. This photograph is dated 1923, Cincinnati, presumably taken during Densford's time at the School of Nursing and Health at the University of Cincinnati where she earned a two-year clinical nursing degree.

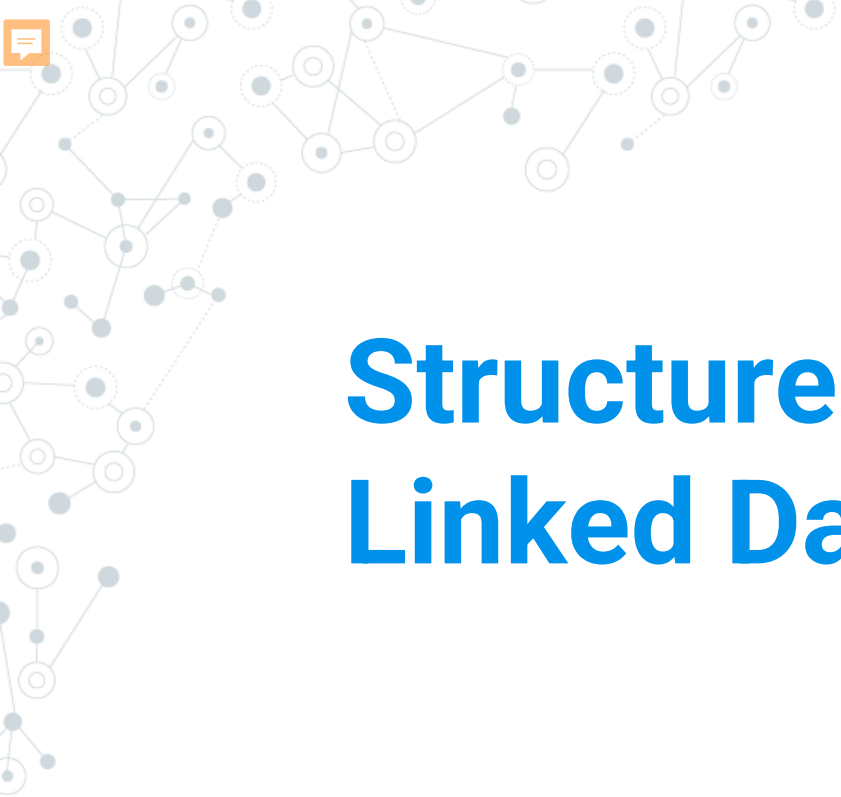


Densford in Cincinnati, 1923

By 1920, she graduated from the [Vassar Training Camp for Nurses](#), where she completed an intensive three-month educational program. Next she earned a two-year clinical nursing degree at the School of Nursing and Health of the [University of Cincinnati](#).^{[4][8]}

In 1925 she transitioned away from bedside nursing practice to education lead the Illinois Training School for Nurses (program merged in 1926 into the [Univer](#) ceased to exist in 1929)^[9] where she also taught [public health](#) and [tuberculosis](#) experience.^{[8][7]:91–94} She also served as Assistant Dean and Associate Direct [Hospital](#) in Chicago.^{[4][7]:84}

In 1930 she became Professor and Director of the [University of Minnesota Sch](#) retired in 1959.^{[5]:97–98[10]} The University of Minnesota (UMN) was the world's i university,^{[5]:xvii[11][12][7]:3} and Densford continued and expanded the nursing based on a set of policies she established early on the defined the quality of th otherwise had been following an apprenticeship model and was conducted exc tenure, School of Nursing faculty began providing bedside instruction, ensuring prepared people available.^{[7]:96–101}



 - Improves searching (e.g. show me all files that [depict a bunny](#))
 - Is pretty new!

What We Learned





Minnesota State University, Mankato

- **Easier than First Imagined**
 - Existing metadata
 - Templates/Team
- **Challenges**
 - Avoiding “I should just quickly edit that page and that one and that one...” or “I should create a page...”
 - Where to Link in Wikipedia
 - Audio files
- **Access**
 - MDL Referral Traffic = commons.wikimedia.org
 - Linked to Wikipedia = more Requests ([Searing](#) = 685)



Blue Earth County Historical Society

- **Access**

- Increased access to often unviewed images
- New referral source to MDL
- A way to reach new/broader audiences

- **Interest**

- From national history ([C & NW Locomotive](#) 1,833 requests)
- To local history ([Judson Township Plat Map](#) 156 requests)

- **Partnership**

- Navigating new ideas/platforms in a group setting incredibly helpful and effective



University of Minnesota Libraries




- **Rhythm and Workflows**

- Easy to upload once content was identified
- Even better working with a team and setting attainable goals
 - The Wiki-verse is vast - working w/ others prevents wandering and getting lost

- **Metadata (Wins and Losses)**

- Templates allow easy reuse and mapping of existing metadata; BUT, metadata must exist
 - Major challenge: Identifying content with proper copyright clearance (not all of our material has certain dates). Same with material that may not have solid description.

- **Access**

- [Portrait of Louise M. Powell](#) - 853 requests (!)
 - Added to Wikipedia article - specifically the infobox and included lots of “Categories” with image
 - Uploads with structured data - more requests than uploads without structured data; but, not as many requests as uploads linked to a Wiki article
 - UMedia referral (2 months of pilot):
 - Wiki ranked 15th in overall site referral tracked on UMedia (in other words, visitors from Wiki were in the top 90% of overall visitors to UMedia)
 - Users from at least 6 different countries

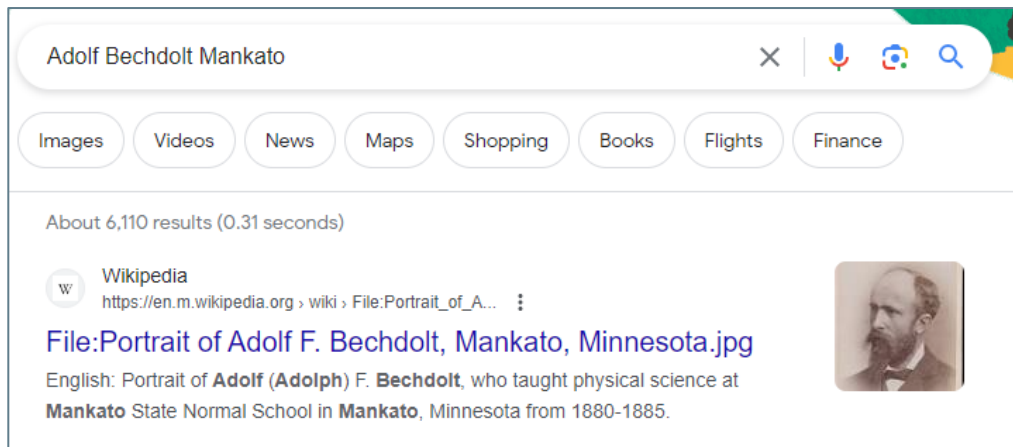
Summary/Future Projects



Assessment: Did Access and Use Increase?

Overall

- More discoverable on the web (e.g. Google Search)
- All new views
- Images linked to a Wikipedia article tended to get more views





Assessment: Did We Learn and Gain Experience?

Awareness

- **Before:** Some awareness noted
- **After:** Strong awareness noted, Wikimedia Commons highest

Experience

- **Before:** No experience
- **After:** Strong experience with Wikipedia (1), Wikimedia Commons (3)
 - Some experience with Wikidata and Linked data (3)

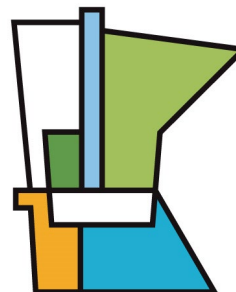
