Commencement Notes

Clark University was founded in 1887 as the first all-graduate institution in America; the undergraduate college was established in 1902. During the early years of the University, graduate degrees were awarded on an individual basis. Formal commencement exercises began at Clark in June 1905, when bachelor's degrees were awarded for the first time.

From the cap, gown and hood, it is possible to distinguish the institution from which the wearer graduated, the field of learning in which his or her degree was earned, and the level of degree: bachelor's, master's, or doctor's.

The distinguishing feature of the black mortarboard cap, standard at most colleges and universities in the United States, is the color of the tassel—black for the holder of bachelor's or master's degrees, gold for doctor's degrees and the governing officers of educational institutions.

The gown is normally black, although the chief officers of many universities wear colored gowns, and several institutions have authorized optional doctoral gowns that embody the institution's colors. The level of degree is indicated by the gown's cut. The bachelor's gown, which is relatively simple, has long pointed sleeves. The master's gown is somewhat fuller, and its sleeves, which reach nearly to the wearer's knees, are squared at the ends. The gown for the doctor's degree is cut rather fully. It has velvet panels down the front and around the neck, and bell-shaped sleeves decorated with three horizontal velvet bars.

The hood is the most distinctive feature of the academic attire in the United States. Originally used as a cowl, as a shoulder cape, and as a container in which to collect alms, the hood is now worn at the back, suspended from the shoulders. The length of the hood and width of the velvet border indicate the level of the degree held. The length of the bachelor's hood is four feet long, and the border is five inches wide. The hood is lined with the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree, and the color of the border indicates the field of learning in which the degree is earned.

The gown worn by the doctoral candidates was designed and first worn in 1991 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the awarding of the first Ph.D. at Clark. The robes are emerald green with gold University seals on the lapels. These complement the traditional doctoral hoods, reflecting the University's official colors, white and emerald.

The gold cord worn by students receiving their degree through the Undergraduate College signifies graduation with honors.

Today's Commencement also features the flags of 39 nations and the United Nations, lining the walkway of the processional. These flags represent the homelands of all undergraduate and graduate degree recipients. With students from 77 countries in attendance at Clark and members of the faculty involved in research, training and development around the world, Clark's international character is evident and is honored today with this display.

Honorary Degree Recipients

Vartan Gregorian, the 12th president of the Carnegie Corporation of New York, is an historian, educator and author. As president of Carnegie Corporation, a grantmaking institution founded by Andrew Carnegie in 1911, he has worked for the past 10 years to promote Carnegie's vision of philanthropy by building on his two major concerns: advancing education and international peace. Born in Iran of Armenian parents, Gregorian was educated in Iran and Lebanon before entering Stanford University where he earned his B.A. in 1958 and Ph.D. in 1964. After teaching history at several American universities, he joined the University of Pennsylvania, where he was appointed founding dean of the Faculty of Arts and Sciences (1974), becoming that institution's 23rd provost four years later. He went on to become the president of The New York Public Library (1981-89), where he raised over \$300 million, and president of Brown University (1989-97), where he nearly tripled the University's endowment. Among his numerous awards and fellowships are the Ellis Island Medal of Honor (1986), the American Academy of the Institute of Arts and Letters' Gold Medal of Service to the Arts (1989), the National Humanities Medal (1998), awarded to him by President Bill Clinton, and the Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest civilian award (2004). He serves on the boards of many institutions, including Brandeis University, Central European University, The Museum of Modern Art and Human Rights Watch and has been a board member of the J. Paul Getty Trust and the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. Gregorian has been decorated by governments around the world and is the author of The Road To Home: My Life And Times, Islam: A Mosaic, Not A Monolith, and The Emergence of Modern Afghanistan, 1880-1946. For his visionary leadership in the field of education and the humanities, he will receive the Doctor of Humane Letters degree.

Christopher Collier '51, historian, author and educator, taught school in Connecticut and at Teachers College, Columbia University, before becoming a professor of history, first at the University of Bridgeport and then the University of Connecticut. A scholar of early American history and the Constitution, Collier authored Roger Sherman's Connecticut: Yankee Politics and the American Revolution (1971), which was nominated for the Pulitzer Prize. Collier also wrote a popular history of the creation of the Constitution titled Decision in Philadelphia: The Constitutional Convention of 1787 (coauthored with his brother, James Lincoln Collier) and, in 2003, All Politics is Local: Family, Friends, and Provincial Interests in the Creation of the Constitution. Working again with his brother, Collier has reached beyond the academic community, collaborating on several history books and historical novels for young readers, beginning with the award-winning My Brother Sam is Dead, which won a Newbery Honor Award in 1975 and was nominated for a National Book Award. Their book Jump Ship to Freedom was named a Notable Trade Book in the Field of Social Studies in 1981 by a joint committee of The National Council for the Social Studies and the Children's Book Council. Collier served as Connecticut State Historian from 1985-2004, and in that capacity promoted the study of and appreciation for that state's history among both historians and the general public. He also served on the Connecticut Historical Commission (now the Connecticut Historic Preservation Council) and on the board of the Connecticut Coordinating Committee for the Promotion of History. Collier received his M.A. and Ph.D. from Columbia University. Collier will receive the Doctor of Humane Letters degree.

Business leader and philanthropist Arthur J. Remillard, Jr. '56 has made a career of making a difference while also leading the largest automobile insurer in Massachusetts. Founder and former CEO and Chairman of the Commerce Group, Inc., Remillard teamed up with fellow independent insurance agents and local businessmen to found the Commerce Insurance Company in 1971. Today, he continues to act as director of the company, which issues more than 1.3 million policies and employs 2,000 people across the country. He has been a steadfast champion of his alma mater, Clark University. He chaired the Clark Fund from 1969-71, served on the Alumni Council from 1972-75, and generously supported the building of the Dolan Field House and the establishment of the Dolan/Remillard Fund. His philanthropy extends beyond Clark to the greater Worcester Community through the Remillard Family Foundation's support to the Boys and Girls Club of Webster, the Central Massachusetts Chapter of the American Red Cross, the Salvation Army, and the University of Massachusetts Memorial Foundation. In 2005 he established the Arthur J. Remillard scholarship for African American Worcester college-bound students through the Worcester Community Foundation. Among his past professional affiliations are the Governing Committee, Actuarial Committee, Budget Committee and Personnel Committee of the Commonwealth Automobile Re-insurers. He will receive the Doctor of Humane Letters Degree.

Diana Chapman Walsh, president emerita of Wellesley College, served as president from 1993 to 2007. Wellesley, a leading college for women, ranks among the country's top liberal arts colleges. Under her leadership, Wellesley revised and expanded the curriculum, renewed the landscape and buildings, and strengthened campus intellectual life. The value of the college's endowment more than doubled during her tenure and the college raised over \$700-million to help support financial aid, expanded programs in global education, internships and service learning, and new interdisciplinary offerings. Before assuming the Wellesley presidency, Walsh held the Norman Professorship at the Harvard School of Public Health, where she chaired the Department of Health and Social Behavior. Prior to joining the Harvard faculty, she was at Boston University, as a University Professor and, in the School of Public Health, Professor of Social and Behavioral Sciences. She served as a Kellogg National Fellow from 1987 to 1990 and has written, edited and co-edited numerous articles and books, including a study of the practice of medicine within corporations. A 1966 Wellesley graduate, Walsh earned an M.S. in journalism (1971) and a Ph.D. in health policy from the University Professors Program (1983). She is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and currently serves on the board of Amherst College and the corporation of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. She was a director of State Street Corporation from 1999 to 2007. Walsh will receive the Doctor of Humane Letters degree.
