# Commencement Notes

Clark University was founded in 1887 as the first all-graduate institution in America; the undergraduate college was established in 1902. During the early years of the University, graduate degrees were awarded on an individual basis. Formal commencement exercises began at Clark in June 1905, when bachelor's degrees were awarded for the first time.

From the cap, gown, and hood, it is possible to distinguish the institution from which the wearer graduated, the field of learning in which his or her degree was earned, and the level of degree: bachelor's, master's, or doctor's.

The distinguishing feature of the black mortarboard cap, standard at most colleges and universities in the United States, is the color of the tassel-black for the holder of bachelor's or master's degrees, gold for doctor's degrees and the governing officers of educational institutions.

The gown is normally black, although the chief officers of many universities wear colored gowns, and several institutions have authorized optional doctoral gowns that embody the institution's colors. The level of degree is indicated by the gown's cut. The bachelor's gown, which is relatively simple, has long pointed sleeves. The master's gown is somewhat fuller, and its sleeves, which reach nearly to the wearer's knees, are squared at the ends. The gown for the doctor's degree is cut rather fully. It has velvet panels down the front and around the neck, and bell-shaped sleeves decorated with three horizontal velvet bars.

The hood is the most distinctive feature of the academic attire in the United States. Originally used as a cowl, as a shoulder cape, and as a container in which to collect alms, the hood is now worn at the back, suspended from the shoulders. The length of the hood and width of the velvet border indicate the level of the degree held. The length of the bachelor's hood is four feet long, and the border is five inches wide. The hood is lined with the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree, and the color of the border indicates the field of learning in which the degree is earned.

The gown worn by the doctoral candidates were designed and first worn in 1991 to commemorate the one-hundredth anniversary of the awarding of the first Ph.D. at Clark. The robes are emerald green with gold University seals on the lapels. These complement the traditional doctoral hoods, reflecting the University's official colors, white and emerald.

The gold cord worn by students receiving their degree through the Undergraduate College signifies graduation with honors.

Today's Commencement also features the flags of 50 nations and the United Nations, lining the walkway of the processional. These flags represent the homelands of all undergraduate and graduate degree recipients. With students from 94 countries in attendance at Clark and members of the faculty involved in research, training and development around the world, Clark's international character is evident and is honored today with this display.

# Honorary Degree Recipients

Lois B. Green MPA '78 serves as an independent consultant for a number of central Massachusetts nonprofit organizations and is a member of the University of Massachusetts Medical School Faculty, serving as the Director of Geriatric Community Clerkship. She is on the boards of the Fallon Clinic Foundation, Bet Shalom Housing for the Elderly (which she helped found), the Central Massachusetts Partnership to Improve Care at the End of Life, the Worcester Regional Research Bureau and is a trustee for the Hoche Scofield Foundation. Green served from 1985 to 1991 as executive director of Elder Home Care Services of Worcester Area, Inc., and from June 2005 to March 2006 as interim president and CEO of United Way of Central Massachusetts (UWCM), where she was also the first woman campaign chair. She is a founding member of UWCM's Women's Initiative, which champions the needs of young girls. Green has received numerous awards for her service to the community, including the Worcester Jewish Federation "Servant of My People" Award, The National Conference of Christians and Jews Brotherhood Award and the Isaiah Thomas Award for Distinguished Community Service. In addition, she has been awarded a Doctorate in Humane Letters from both Becker College and University of Massachusetts Medical School. A graduate of the Masters in Public Administration program at Clark and former vice chairman of Clark's Board of Trustees, Green serves as a model of community engagement for Clark students. She and her husband Robert '49 established the Lois M.P.A. '78 and Robert '49 Green Endowed Undergraduate Internship Fund to support undergraduate student internships in the city of Worcester. For her service to the University she was honored with the Alumni Association's Distinguished Service Award. Green, who earned a B.A. from Bryn Mawr College, will receive the Doctor of Humane Letters degree.

Steven A. Minter is an Executive-in-Residence and a Fellow in the Center for Nonprofit Policy & Practice at the Maxine Goodman Levin College of Urban Affairs at Cleveland State University. From 1984-2003, he served as President and Executive Director of The Cleveland Foundation, a public charity dedicated to enhancing the quality of life in Greater Cleveland and the original and second-largest community foundation in the nation. Under Minter's direction, the Cleveland Foundation became the first non-coastal community foundation to make AIDS grants. He led the Foundation's efforts to extend services for donors, expand donor outreach efforts to the African-American community, improve Cleveland's public schools and systematically revitalize Cleveland's neighborhoods and lakefront. Under his leadership, the Foundation's assets grew from \$300 million to \$1.5 billion, and grant making increased from \$17.5 million to \$74 million per year. In 2003 Minter was awarded the Distinguished Grantmaker Award from the Council on Foundations in recognition of his lifetime achievement in the field of philanthropy. Prior to joining the nonprofit sector, Minter worked in government, beginning as a caseworker for the Cuyahoga County Welfare Department in 1960 and going on to become its first African American director. From 1970-1975, Minter served as Commissioner of Public Welfare for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, the first African American to do so. Minter joined the Carter administration in 1980 to serve as Under Secretary for United States Department of Education and ultimately as director of the department's transition from the Carter to the Reagan administration. Minter, who holds a master's degree in social administration from the Mandel School at Case Western Reserve University and a B.A. in education from Baldwin-Wallace College will receive the Doctor of Humane Letters degree.

A leading spokesperson for American higher education, David Ward is the former President of the American Council on Education (ACE), having served from 2001 to 2008. Under his leadership, the American Council as the major coordinating agent for higher education, maintained and strengthened its efforts to expand equity and diversity, internationalization, lifelong learning, and institutional effectiveness. As president of ACE, he was appointed to the Council of the United Nations University and to the Commission on the Future of Higher Education, convened by Secretary of Education Margaret Spellings. Ward is also the former provost and Chancellor of the University of Wisconsin at Madison, where he was also Andrew H. Clark Professor of Geography. A recognized authority in historical urban geography, he has pioneered research on English and American cities during their rapid growth of the 19th and early 20th centuries and is the author of several books in this area, including "Poverty, Ethnicity, and the American City: Changing Conceptions of the Slum and the Ghetto, 1840-1920". Ward is a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, has served as president of the Association of American Geographers, and has been a visiting professor at University College London, Hebrew University, Jerusalem, Australian National University, Canberra as well as his alma mater, the University of Leeds. Throughout his career as a university leader, he has worked with many of the nation's higher education associations, including serving as chair of the Government Relations and Council the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges (1998-2000) and on the Committee on Undergraduate Education of the Association of American Universities (1996-2000); the Science Coalition (1996-2000); the Kellogg Commission on the Future of State and Land-Grant Universities (1996-2000); and chaired the board of UCAID (University Consortium for Advancement Internet Development). Ward currently resides in Washington D.C. where he consults, writes and lectures on issues in higher education. For his commitment to higher education, he will receive the Doctor of Humane Letters degree.
