# To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Alexander:

The financial report of your schools may be discouraging to you but it is correct for what we have paid showing expenditures for a school year of 32 weeks. If you will compare it with page 22 of your 1940 report you will find that the cost of the Cedar School was only shown for 27 weeks, Hale School 31 weeks, Four Corner School 31 weeks. This of course is something which I did not consider was happening until it was too late to remedy the overdraft by closing school and carrying the cost of schools over into next year. In addition to this complication, we have had added teaching expense, more expensive conveyance and a deluge of unpaid accounts. I am sorry to report that there are still some outstanding accounts. To your Town Officers it must be very discouraging and I see no solution other than to raise more money for Schools.

Even with an expenditure of considerable money during the past years the schools are still poorly equipped and this is partly due to the carelessness of the pupils.

The teachers have worked hard this year to bring the pupils of your schools up to grade levels, but this will not be possible in one year. The Four Corner School should be operated on a 36 week schedule as the grade levels there are in a more serious condition. We are fortunate to have good teachers and without a reasonable salary for next year I fear that we may have to endure teachers who are inferior to those we now have. Without an appropriation larger than last year it will probably be necessary to close schools when the money is expended.

I have enjoyed working with you and wish to express my appreciation to the School Committee, Town Officials and Parents for their helpful cooperation.
