To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of Alexander:

I hereby submit my report for your schools for 1936-1937.

Our schools, as well as others in the State ,have been invaded by epidemics which have depleted the attendance of the pupils, but fortunately there were no serious results

You will observe that your accounts are in good condition and by reason of this I would strongly recommend that you increase your school year to thirty-four weeks. The added expense for the extra two weeks would be less than \$100.00 and the advantage of two weeks schooling for the pupil would give him a better preparation for entering High School.

You have a balance of \$86.04 in your repairs account, which will take care of ordinary repairs for next year, but if you plan to do any painting, clapboarding or shingling, quite a sum would have to be raised in addition to the unexpended balance.

Although there has been quite a marked falling off in the attendance, the pupils have made good progress and undoubtedly will make up all deficiencies by the end of the school year.

In conclusion I wish to express my appreciation for the cooperation of the School Committee, and the many courtesies shown me by the citizens. Also I wish to commend the teachers for their loyalty toward their work and their cooperation.

To choose one or more Road Commissioners.

Article 15

To choose one or more Fire Wards.

Article 16

To choose a Town Agent and all other Town Officers.

Article 17

To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for State Aid Road construction (in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of Ways, Highways and Bridges under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1936 or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 173, Public Laws of 1936.

Article 18

To see what sum if any the Town would recommend to take from the joint State Ald account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Ald roads in excess of the requirements of Section 2, Chapter 132, P. L. 1335.
