To the Superintending School Committee of the town of Alexander.

I herewith submit my sixth annual report of your schools.

The schools on the whole have made satisfactory progress and the attendence has been an improvement over last year. In regard to this I wish to bring again to the attention of the parents to keep their children in school every day possible, for the larger the attendance the more money the town receives from the State. Owing to the small number of pupils in Cedar district it would he an economic move to transport them to district No. 2 next year. I believe that \$300.00 can be saved for the town by so doing. The school house in district No. 2 has been greatly improved during the past year by the School Improvement League and the help of the citizens. I wish to commend Mrs. Scamans, the teacher, for efforts in this direction. More money should be appropriated for schools in order to reduce your overdrafts. I have kept the expenses for textbooks and supplies down to as low figure as possible consistent with the welfare of the pupils. There should be appropriated \$75.00 for textbooks and \$50.00 for supplies. If this was appropriated no overdrafts would occur in these accounts. The tuition bills, it will be necessary to either increase the appropriation for tuitions or increase the amount for school expenses. There was no appropriation reported for the superintendent and committee. There should be a fund for these expenses or it should be paid by the town and recorded as such.

I wish to thank the Committee for their support and advice and the citizens for their interest in the schools.
