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REMARKS BEFORE THE HEALTH AND COMMUNITY SERVICES COUNCIL OF HAWAII

IT NOW APPEARS CERTAIN THAT PRESIDENT REAGAN WILL SUCCEED IN MOST, IF NOT ALL, OF THE BUDGETARY REDUCTIONS THAT HE HAS RECOMMENDED FOR THE DEPARTMENTS OF LABOR, HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES, AND EDUCATION FOR BOTH FY'81 AND FY'82. OUR APPROPRIATIONS SUBCOMMITTEE, WHICH HAS JURISDICTION OVER THESE THREE DEPARTMENTS, HAS COMPLETED MINE WEEKS OF INTENSIVE PUBLIC HEARINGS ON THE PRESIDENT'S RECOMMENDATIONS. ALTHOUGH I PERSONALLY FELT THAT THE EVIDENCE PRESENTED TO US DID NOT BY ANY MEANS JUSTIFY THE TYPE, NOR THE EXTENT, OF THE PROPOSED REDUCTIONS, IT IS CLEAR THAT THE MAJORITY OF MY COLLEAGUES DID.

THE OVERWHELMING NATURE OF THE RECENT VOTES IN THE U.S. SENATE

ON BOTH OVERALL BUDGET LIMITATIONS AND ALSO ON A SPECIFIC \$250

MILLION REDUCTION FOR THESE THREE DEPARTMENTS DURING THE LAST

QUARTER OF FY'81, MAKE IT ABUNDANTLY CLEAR THAT MAJOR PROGRAMATIC

REDUCITONS ARE COMING IN THE FORESEEABLE FUTURE.

IT SADDENS ME TO REPORT THAT CLOSE EXAMINATION REVEALS THAT

75% OF THE PROPOSED REDUCTIONS BY THE PRESIDENT FOR FY'82, OR

\$28 BILLION OF THE \$37.5 BILLION IN QUESTION, WILL COME FROM

PROGRAMS THAT PROVIDE BASIC SERVICES TO THE POOR. YET THESE

PROGRAMS ACCOUNT FOR LESS THAN ONE-TENTH OF THE TOTAL FEDERAL SPENDING PROPOSED FOR THAT YEAR. FOR EXAMPLE, WE MUST EXPECT THAT FOOD STAMP BENEFITS WILL BE ELIMINATED FOR ABOUT ONE MILLION OF OUR FELLOW CITIZENS, THAT NUTRITION ASSISTANCE WILL BE ENDED FOR THE 700,000 INFANTS, CHILDREN, AND PREGNANT WOMEN WHO ARE PRESENTLY COVERED BY THE SUPPLEMENTAL FEEDING PROGRAM, (DURING) AND THAT THIS FISCAL YEAR ALONE, MORE THAN 300,000 CETA PUBLIC SERVICE JOBS WILL BE TERMINATED, MANY OF THEM IN OUR NATION'S MENTAL HEALTH OR CRIMINAL JUSTICE PROGRAMS. THIS, I AM AFRAID, IS JUST FOR STARTERS.

I AM ESPECIALLY CONCERNED ABOUT OUR DIMINISHED COMMITMENT
TO INSURING THAT OUR NATION'S MOTHERS AND EXPECTANT MOTHERS WILL
CONTINUE TO BE ABLE TO RECEIVE HIGH QUALITY, NUTRITIOUS MEALS.

EXPERTS FROM BOTH THE MEDICAL AND NUTRITION FIELDS HAVE INFORMED
ME THAT EVEN TODAY, THE SINGLE GREATEST HAZARD TO OUR NATION'S

NEWBORN IS LOW BIRTH WEIGHT. LOW BIRTH WEIGHT HAS BEEN DIRECTLY

ASSOCIATED WITH A NUMBER OF DISEASES, INCLUDING EPILEPSY,

DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, MENTAL RETARDATION, AND AUTISM.

IN OUR NATION, ABOUT SEVEN PERCENT OF ALL BIRTHS ARE BELOW

5.5 POUNDS; IN SWEDEN, WHICH HAS THE LOWEST RATE OF INFANT

DEATH, ONLY FOUR PERCENT ARE BORN BELOW THIS CRITICAL WEIGHT.

AND FOR ME, WHAT IS SADDEST ABOUT THE ADMINISTRATION'S PROPOSED

BUDGETARY REDUCTIONS IS THAT NOT ONLY WILL THEY NOT REDUCE OUR

NATION'S INFLATIONARY RATE AT ALL, BUT EQUALLY IMPORTANT, THAT

THEY ARE BASED UPON A NUMBER OF ASSUMPTIONS THAT SIMPLY ARE

NOT TRUE. FOR EXAMPLE, WE KNOW THAT THE SINGLE BIGGEST FACTOR

AFFECTING ELIGIBILITY IN OUR NATION'S FOOD STAMP PROGRAM TODAY

IS NOT FRAUD AND ABUSE, BUT INSTEAD UNEMPLOYMENT PER SE. FOR

EVERY ONE PERCENT INCREASE IN UNEMPLOYMENT, NEARLY ONE MILLION

AMERICANS BECOME ELIGIBLE FOR FOOD STAMPS. EVEN UNDER OUR

CURRENT LAWS, IF A FAMILY OF FOUR EARNS \$700 PER MONTH, OR

\$8,400 PER YEAR, THEY CAN NOT RECEIVE FOOD STAMPS. YET, RATHER

THAN ADDRESS UNEMPLOYMENT, WE SEE THE ADMINISTRATION SEVERELY

RESTRICTING THESE FAMILIES' VERY CHANCES OF SURVIVAL.

I AM EQUALLY SURE THAT VERY FEW OF YOU REALIZE THAT PRESIDENT REAGAN'S MUCH HERALDED "SAFETY NET" PROGRAM WILL NOT REALLY PROTECT THOSE MOST IN NEED. NEARLY HALF OF ITS BENEFICIARIES ALREADY HAVE INCOMES OF MORE THAN \$15,000 PER YEAR.

THE ADMINISTRATION HAS ALSO PROPOSED A DRASTIC REVISION OF

THE CURRENT RESPONSIBILITIES THAT THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT HAS

FOR OUR NATION'S ELDERLY, DEPENDENT, AND POOR. AT FIRST GLANCE,

THE "BLOCK GRANT" APPROACH MAY SEEM LOGICAL AND EVEN COST-EFFECTIVE.

WHY NOT ALLOW OUR VARIOUS STATE AND LOCAL OFFICIALS TO

ESTABLISH THEIR OWN PRIORITIES, TO TRULY CONTROL THE

DISTRIBUTION OF SOCIAL WELFARE EXPENDITURES? IN HAWAII, I

HONESTLY FEEL THAT THE BLOCK GRANT APPROACH WILL WORK OUT QUITE

WELL. WE ARE FORTUNATE TO HAVE LEADERSHIP IN THIS STATE THAT

IS TRULY COMMITTED TO INSURING THAT NECESSARY HEALTH AND HUMAN

WELFARE SERVICES ARE DELIVERED. I AM AFRAID, HOWEVER, THAT

THOSE WHO LIVE IN MANY OF OUR SISTER STATES ON THE MAINLAND

WILL NOT FARE SO WELL. HISTORY HAS SHOWN US THAT OFTENTIMES

MINORITIES AND OTHERS WHO DO NOT HAVE POLITICAL CLOUT, SIMPLY

DO NOT RECEIVE THEIR "FAIR SHARE". THE OFTEN TIMES UNIQUE

PROBLEMS AND CONCERNS DO NOT RECEIVE ADEQUATE ATTENTION. THEY

ARE ALWAYS ON THE BOTTOM OF THE TOTEM POLE.

BUT EVEN IN HAWAII, THERE WILL BE PROBLEMS. FOR EXAMPLE,
SECRETARY SCHWEIKER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN
SERVICES HAS PROPOSED FOUR BLOCK GRANTS. HE HAS ESTABLISHED

BROAD PARAMETERS WITHIN WHICH, IT WOULD BE UP TO LOCAL

AUTHORITIES TO DEVELOP PRIORITIES. FUNDS ALLOCATED FOR ONE

"BLOCK" MUST BE EXPENDED FOR PROGRAMS WITHIN THAT DESIGNATION,

NOT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF ROADS, ETC. HOWEVER, IT IS THE

SECRETARY'S EXPRESS INTENTION NOT ONLY NOT TO PROMULGATE

DETAILED REGULATIONS SUCH AS THOSE REQUIRING 24-HOUR CARE FOR

OUR STATE COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH CENTERS, BUT ALSO TO REQUEST

FROM THE CONGRESS ONLY 75% OF THE FUNDS ALLOCATED IN FY'81 FOR

THESE PROGRAMS. THUS, FOR THE SECRETARY'S HEALTH SERVICE BLOCK

GRANT, 15 CURRENTLY CATEGORICAL PROGRAMS WILL BE CONSOLIDATED.

COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS, HOME HEALTH SERVICES, AND MATERNAL

AND CHILD HEALTH INITIATIVES WILL NOW HAVE TO DIRECTLY COMPETE

WITH COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH CENTERS, DRUG ABUSE PREVENTION

PROGRAMS, AND EVEN EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE PROPOSALS—ONCE

AGAIN, FOR THREE—QUARTERS OF THIS YEAR'S SUPPORT.

SIMILARLY, UNDER THE SECRETARY'S PREVENTIVE HEALTH SERVICE BLOCK
GRANT, 11 PROGRAMS WILL BE CONSOLIDATED INCLUDING VENERAL
DISEASE, RAT CONTROL, FLUORIDATION, AND ADOLESCENT HEALTH
SERVICES. UNDER HIS SOCIAL SERVICE BLOCK GRANT, TWELVE
PROGRAMS ARE TARGETED FOR INCLUSION INCLUDING: DAY CARE, CHILD
WELFARE SERVICES, DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, CHILD ABUSE, AND
REHABILITATION SERVICES. THE SECRETARY'S FINAL BLOCK, ENERGY
AND EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE, IS LESS ACUTE FOR HAWAII.

THE SPECIFICS OF EACH OF THE SECRETARY'S PROPOSALS ARE STILL SUBJECT TO CHANGE, HOWEVER, I AM SURE YOU CAN APPRECIATE HOW UNSETTLING THEY WILL BE FOR ALL CONCERNED. NOT ONLY WILL THERE BE SIGNIFICANTLY FEWER RESOURCES AVAILABLE, BUT THOSE WHO WILL NOW BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ESTABLISHING PRIORITIES WILL BE COMING FROM A VERY DIFFERENT VANTAGEPOINT THAN BEFORE.

IN MANY WAYS, OUR STATE WILL ALSO FACE UNIQUE CHALLENGES.

FOR EXAMPLE, WE HAVE THE HIGHEST PERCENTAGE OF IMMIGRANTS PER CAPITA, AND DURING THE PAST SEVERAL YEARS, WE WERE SUCCESSFUL IN HAVING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES PROVIDE US WITH SPECIAL ASSISTANCE TO ADDRESS THEIR UNIQUE PROBLEMS. WE OF COURSE, DID NOT RECEIVE ALL THAT WE DESIRED, BUT A START WAS MADE. UNDER THE BLOCK GRANT APPROACH, IT IS NOT CLEAR WHAT RESPONSIBILITY THE FEDERAL AGENCIES MIGHT STILL HAVE FOR SITUATIONS SUCH AS OURS. WILL THESE "FUTURE CITIZENS" BECOME THE EXCLUSIVE RESPONSIBILITY OF OUR STATE LEGISLATURE? IT IS TOO EARLY TO TELL.

THIS ADMINISTRATION HAS THE EXPRESS INTENT OF DISMANTLING MANY, IF NOT ALL, OF THE MOST HERALDED PROGRAMS OF THE KENNEDY-JOHNSON ERA OF THE GREAT SOCIETY. IN MY JUDGMENT, THEY HAVE NOT PROPOSED ANY VIABLE ALTERNATIVES. WE ARE STILL FACED WITH A NUMBER OF VERY SERIOUS SOCIETAL PROBLEMS, SUCH AS PROVIDING CARE FOR OUR NATION'S ELDERLY, HANDICAPPED, AND DISADVANTAGED. THESE INDIVIDUALS WILL NOT MERELY GO AWAY. THEY HAVE AS MUCH RIGHT TO A GOOD LIFE AS YOU OR I DO; IF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT DOES NOT ACCEPT THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THEM, WHO WILL?
