Delta Gamma Chapter has been very busy during the past year working with the Bowling Green Child Protection Agency. Our annual Shenanigans program was a great success; we raised over \$4000 for the Child Protection Agency. We also continued our weekly

visits to the agency to help care for the children while their parents attend Parent's Anonymous meetings. Throughout the past year we have organized Christmas, Halloween, Valentine, and Easter parties.

Our yearly Shamrock Project was also a success. We sold balloons on campus and collected money at Bowling Green shopping centers. We collected approximately \$1700, and this money went to the National Committee for the Prevention of Child Abuse. We participated in the statewide Blue Ribbon Campaign sponsored by the Kentucky Council on Child Abuse.

This summer we started a new project. Each member was asked to bring a teddy bear to our summer RUSH Workshop. We have already collected over 50 bears, and we have hopes of receiving over 100 bears. When school starts in the fall, we are going to take the bears to the Juvenile Division of the Bowling Green Police Department.
