Background and methods

- Joint masterclass symposium held in RCSI in May 2017
- Masterclass format
 - Plenary sessions; Roundtable discussions; Focus groups

Research aim

- To determine key stakeholders' opinions and perceptions regarding the development, implementation and future direction of IPE in Ireland

Method

- Focus groups conducted with masterclass attendees
- Topic guide outline:
 - 1. Development of IPE initiatives
 - 2. Implementation of IPE initiatives
- 3. Future direction of IPE in Ireland
- 4. Key priorities for IPE in Ireland

- Analysis: thematic analysis



Key findings/recommendations (1)

1. Promoting IPE and demonstrating its benefits

- Promote diverse roles of individuals across healthcare teams
- Assess and demonstrate value of IPE across all target groups
- Incorporate mechanisms that directly capture the benefits into the monitoring and evaluation of IPE initiatives
- Share lessons of best-practice

Key findings/recommendations (2)

2. Structures to assist the implementation of IPE

- Incorporate IPE at an early stage of the undergraduate curriculum
- Investigate potential for joint CPD opportunities as IPE/IPC
- Manage expectations to overcome protectionism, and promote collaboration between professional bodies
- Increase linkages between professional and academic institutions
- Explore different models and techniques of IPE/IPC to ensure the 'best fit' within teams and institutions
