Every year, the Faculty Senate elects their representatives to serve on the committee. These

During the meeting, new representatives were welcomed. Dr. Eric Hom started the meeting with an update on the Federal Demonstration Partnership. The FDP is a unique forum for individuals from universities and nonprofits to work collaboratively with federal agency officials to improve the national research enterprise.

Key topics covered during the meeting were the short-term Strategic Plan within ORSP, upcoming and currently open positions in ORSP, and future plans of the Research Visioning Task Force.

## What is a PI?

A Principal Investigator (PI) is the project lead and the individual responsible for the scientific, technical, and programmatic aspects of the project, as well as resource allocation, fiscal stewardship, and overall administrative conduct of a sponsored project within the terms and conditions of the award and in accordance with University rules and regulations.

In fewer words, the PI is *the* key person and the touchpoint for the research effort. Signaling intent to apply for a funding opportunity, developing the proposal, locating partners for subawards, ensuring research protocol is approved... this and much, much more falls under the category of PI ownership.

The good news is, you're not in it alone! We're here to assist our PIs in putting together an excellent submission for external funding! In future editions of ORSP Connect, we'll highlight some of the responsibilities of a PI.
