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

[For SOCI 258](#): Gender, Race and Poverty in the US with Prof. Marya Mtshali (FA 23), students could create either a zine or podcast.

From the Syllabus:

I. Podcasts

a. The podcast should be 8-15 minutes and with clear audio. You can use this medium to record a simple conversation about your topic with a classmate, but it is even more interesting if you decide to incorporate at least parts of interviews with other people. This is also a great way to get creative – you can either keep your podcast fairly simple with opening and closing music, or you can get into doing sound effects or mock commercials. Bertrand Library has all the resources you need to complete your podcast, and staff will be working throughout the semester with our class to ensure you have assistance in bringing your ideas to life.

b. For the podcast final project submission, you will also be submitting the following documents:

1) Transcription

a) Transcription does not need to be exact (but it needs to close), and I will use it as a backup in case needed. Bertrand Library staff will have recommendations on software that you can use for transcription, as well as for your zine.

2) Artist statement

a) A single paragraph explaining what you were hoping to accomplish with your podcast. Please address the following: a) What goal or message are you hoping to accomplish with your podcast? b) What do you want your audience to walk away with after listening to it? c) What was your vision for the design and structure? d) If you worked with members of the local community, what was your experience like, and what did you learn from it? e) Did you incorporate any of the peer feedback? If not, why?

3) Cover Art

a) This will be used to feature your work on the final project showcase website. If you use another person's visual images, make sure to give photo credit.
