The same three schools have been serving their respective districts during the past year as heretofore, with enrollments since September 11, 1933 as follows: Dock School, 12; Head Tide School, 11; West Alna School, 13. Both attendance and progress have been excellent. Conveyance has been furnished to 10 scholars, and the tuition of one scholar has been paid in Newcastle.
