ALNA SCHOOL REPORT

Two rural schools have been maintained in Alna since the last March meeting, with enrollment as follows since Sept. 6, 1938: Dock 26; West Alna 20. Attendance and progress have been very satisfactory in both schools.

Three conveyance contracts have been made, with excellent results. Since 5 of the pupils conveyed are temporary residents, the State has agreed to reimburse Alna at the proper time for this expense. In attendance at Lincoln Academy are 4 pupils, and at Wiscasset Academy 2 pupils, while 1 pupil has been attending Bar Harbor High School. All these pupils are doing unusually good work.

All details as to personnel of teachers, conveyors, janitors, together with all financial details of the Alna educational system, are shown elsewhere in this 1939 Town Report, and in the interests of economy they will not be duplicated here.

Dock School has had electric lights installed, thanks to the help of public-spirited citizens, and it is hoped that the West Alna school may also be provided with proper artificial lighting in the near future. Mention should be made of the several splendid health clinics that have been held, and these cannot be too highly commended.

The textbook situation is improving, but the changes in modern life are so rapid that it is no longer adequate to use material that is out-of-date. Maps, inlike, are evolving with greatest rapidity. Some au thentic reference material in the form of large Webster dictionaries has been added to each school, and it is to be hoped that provision may be made as soon as possible so that each school can have a standard encyclopedia.

In order to conform with the new state system of auditing town accounts it is recommended by the state department that all funds for education, exclusive of the Schoolhouse Repairs Account, be raised as one sum. The estimates of the School Committee are shown in the article. May I say that your Committee has shown a splendid interest in the Alna schools, and clearly wishes to see them compare favorably with the best in the State. With your continued help and support, this will be possible.

In closing this brief report I wish to thank all organizations and individuals who have so kindly helped to give Alna boys and girls better opportunity.

WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

To FRANK CARLETON, a Constable of the Town of Alna in the County of Lincoln: Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Alna, qualified by law to vote on town affairs to meet at the Old Church in said town on the sixth day of March, A. D. 1939 at ten thirty o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles, to wit:

- ART. 1 To choose a Moderator.
- ART. 2 To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- ART. 3 To act on report of Town Officers.
- ART. 4 To choose Selectmen.
- ART. 5 To choose Assessors.
- ART. 6 To choose Overseers of Poor.
- ART. 7 To choose a Treasurer.
- ART. 8 To choose a Collector of Taxes.
- ART. 9 To choose one member Board of Trustees of Alna Cemetery Fund for three years.
- ART. 10 To choose one member of School Committee for three years.

- ART. 11 To choose one or more Fire Wardens.
- ART. 12 To see if the Town will choose one, or more, Road Commissioners.
- ART. 13 To choose all other necessary Town Officers.
- ART. 14 To see what method the Town will adopt for collection of taxes.
- ART. 15 To see what sum the Town will appropriate for State Aid Road construction (in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of Ways, Highways and Bridges) under the provisions of Sec. 19, Chap. 28, Revised Statutes 1930, or under the provisions of Sec. 3, Chap. 229, Public Laws of 1937.
- ART. 16 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Assessors to rescind any amounts appropriated by the Town for State Aid Highway construction in excess of the amount required to meet the State apportionments.
- ART. 17 To see what sum, if any, the Town would recommend to take from the Joint State Aid Account for the purpose of applying Bituminous Surface Treatment to State Aid Roads, in excess of the requirements of Sec. 2, Chap. 132, P. L. 1935.
- ART. 18 To see if the Town will vote to raise \$418.00 for Maintenance of Third Class Road.
- ART. 19 To see if the Town will vote to raise \$120.00 for Cutting and Burning Bushes on State Aid Roads.

- ART. 20 To see if the Town will vote to raise \$396.00 for Patrol Maintenance.
- ART. 21 To see if the Town will vote to raise \$532.00 to be applied on Dock Bridge Note and Interest.
- ART. 22 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Incidental Expenses.
- ART. 23 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Notes and Interest.
- ART. 24 To see if the Town will vote to co-operate with the State on Clearing Snow from Roads accepted by the State.
- ART. 25 To see if Town will vote to Clear Snow on Common Roads.
- ART. 26 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Snow Bills.
- ART. 27 To raise money for the following purposes: Poor, Town Officers, Ways and Bridges, School Buildings, Electric Lights.
- ART. 28 To see how much the Town will vote to raise for General School Maintenance. Recommendations of Superintending School Committee as follows: School Teachers, \$1,020.00; Janitors, \$8.00; Conveyance, \$760.00; Electric Lights, \$24.00; Fuel, \$70.00; Textbooks, Supplies, \$125.00; Comptons Encyclopedia, \$71.00; Secondary Tuition, \$300.00. Total amount recommended, \$2,378.00.
