ALNA SCHOOL REPORT

To the Inhabitants of Alna, GREETINGS:

During the past municipal year two rural schools have been maintained by Alna, with enrollments since September 3, 1940 (opening of the last Fall Term) as indicated herewith, viz: Dock School, 28 pupils; West Alna School, 23 pupils. Progress has been excellent, and attendance above normal to date.

Elsewhere in this annual report to Alna may be found, in proper fashion, all financial details with reference to expenditures for education in Alna, and it does not, therefore, in the interests of economy, seem necessary to duplicate the same here.

Reports at hand (State Form 47-G.A.) indicate that Alna has received the following subsidies from the State, viz: High School Tuition (2-3 actual amount expended, same not to exceed \$700 for any municipal year) \$276.67; Teaching Positions (\$100.00 for each certified teacher employed) \$200.00; Census (\$1.65 for each pupil duly returned under oath to the State, last date of return being April 1, 1940) \$169.95; Temporary residents (so-called "Camp" or "Mill" children) \$129.25; and "Adjustments, R. S. c. 18, Sec. 210", \$170.00. The total educational subsidy from the State to Alna is thus \$945.87, and this checks with the amounts due and payable as shown by your Selectmen.

Every financial statement issued has been passed by the State Auditors, in accordance with the latest statutes, and every item shown in the educational budget has been duly checked and re-checked. It is hoped that for the forth-coming year you will give due consideration to the cause of public education in America, insofar as you citizens of Alna may have jurisdiction, since it is clear that many now consider our public schools one of our first lines of defense. It is believed that you will accord reasonable support for this, our most democratic institution.

In closing this Report, made purposely brief as best serving the interests of economy for all taxpayers, might I express a few simple words of appreciation in behalf of the diligent and loyal support for your schools of your School Committee. The record shows that each and every member has worked very hard indeed, without any compensation whatsoever, to stretch every dollar appropriated by you to the very fullest extent possible, and every possible credit should be given for the showing made. I extend to you, and to your Committee, my deepest gratitude for the constant and unfailing support which you have accorded to the cause of public education in America.

- ART. 25 To see if the Town will vote to open the school at Alna Center as recommended by the School Committee.
- ART. 26 To see what sum the Town will vote to raise to maintain the electric lights now in use.
- ART. 27 To fix wages for men, teams and trucks on Common Roads.
- ART. 28 To see what sum the Town will vote to raise to buy flags to decorate the Soldiers' Graves in Alna Cemetery.
- ART. 29 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Abatements.
- ART. 30 To authorize the Selectmen to borrow sums of money in anticipation of taxes.
- ART. 31 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the Town to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute quitclaim deeds for such property.
- ART. 32 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
