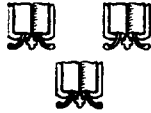

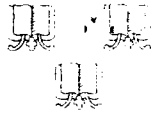

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of Alna :

When the fall term opened the Dock School was overcrowded with a registration of 38 pupils and five grades. At the beginning of the winter term the 4th grade was transferred to the Center School. This relieves the Primary School and seems to be a satisfactory arrangement.

Besides books needed to complete sets, these new books have been purchased: Literature and ancient histories for the older pupils and geographies and health books for the primary grades. The literature is suitable reading for the 7th and 8th and is a large book containing many of the required selections. It ought to be a decided help to those pupils. Compared with many of the ancient histories, this book is easier to read and understand. The new geographies for the 3rd grade are written with 3th grade vocabulary and are interesting. The 1st and 2nd grade health readers are attractive and useful for both reading and information.

In regard to your appropriations: I was very pleased with the liberal increase in the school money voted at your 1942 Town Meeting. At that time it was sufficient for your needs, but now you must all be aware of the decided upward trend and the necessity of increasing your 1943 appropriation. To get the most out of this extra money I suggest the following: \$200.00 to be used to lengthen your school year to 36 weeks. This will give your pupils 2 more weeks of school and make your town eligible for the \$100.00

per teacher the State hopes to get for all schools paying a salary of at least \$720.00 per teacher.

With many thanks to the town officials and friends who have helped with the school problems.

WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

To FRANK W. CARLETON, a Constable of the
Town of Alna in the County of Lincoln, Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Alna, qualified by law to vote on town affairs to meet at the Old Church in said town on the first day of March, A. D., 1943 at one o'clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on the following articles, to wit:

ART. 1 To choose a Moderator.

ART. 2 To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

ART. 3 To act on report of Town Officers.

ART. 4 To choose Selectmen.

ART. 5 To choose Assessors.

ART. 6 To choose Overseers of Poor.

ART. 7 To choose a Treasurer.

ART. 8 To choose a Collector of Taxes.

ART. 9 To choose one member Board of Trustees of Alna Cemetery Fund for three years.

ART. 10 To choose one member of School Committee for three years.

ART. 11 To choose one or more Fire Wardens.

ART. 12 To see if the Town will choose one or more Road Commissioners to handle common roads or leave it with the Selectmen.

ART. 13 To choose all other necessary Town Officers.

ART. 14 To see what method the Town will adopt for collection of taxes and fix compensation for same.

ART. 15 To see if the Town will vote to raise \$300.00 for Maintenance of Third Class Road.

ART. 16 To see what sum the Town will vote to raise for Cutting and Burning Bushes on improved roads.

ART. 17 To see if the Town will vote to raise \$400.00 for Patrol Maintenance.

ART. 18 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Incidental Expenses.

ART. 19 To see if the Town will vote to clear snow on all roads in cooperation with the State.
