User Interface Customization

To support multiple user interfaces and user interface customization, the CWIS code base is split into distinct PHP and HTML sets of files. The .html files contain HTML and PHP relating to the look and feel of CWIS, and the .php files contain everything else (i.e. functionality).

Adding a New User Interface

To add a new user interface to your CWIS-based site, all you need to do is go into the top directory on your site and run the CWIS new interface creation script:

cd MyPortalHome ./newinterface

(Where *MyPortalHome* is name of the directory where you installed CWIS.)

The newinterface script will ask you for the name you want to give to your new user interface, and then create the necessary files and directories. After you've run newinterface, log into your CWIS site and make sure that your new user interface shows up in the Default User Interface list on the Edit System Configuration screen.

Customizing the Overall Look and Feel

Customizing a CWIS-based site can be broken down into two phases: changing the overall look and feel, and changing the look and feel of individual pages.

For the **overall** look and feel of a CWIS-based site, there are three files that contain almost all of the common page elements and appearance settings: SPT--StandardPageStart.html, SPT--StandardPageEnd.html, and SPT--Stylesheet.css.

As their names might suggest, SPT--StandardPageStart.html and SPT--StandardPageEnd.html contain the common page elements that appear at the top/left and bottom/right, respectively, of most pages. Any changes made to those files will appear on all CWIS-based pages on your site.

SPT--Stylesheet.css contains the CSS (Cascading Style Sheet) attributes for the site (text color, font size, etc). Again, changes made to this file will affect all CWIS-based pages.

All three of these files can be found in the include subdirectory under your new interface directory (that you created by running newinterface as directed above).
