Johann Sebastian Bach's *Jesu, meine Freude, BWV 227,* is an historically interesting and unique motet. This particular motet was thought to have been written for a graveside funeral shortly after Bach moved to Leipzig in 1723. For an audience today, it is worth noting how Bach's motets are significantly different from his cantatas in many ways. The most important distinction is that the motets do not have instrumental accompaniment except for possible basso continuo. If instruments were used, they played *colla parte.* This means that the instrumentalists played directly from the vocal parts. Also, when most of us think of the word 'motet' we think of the equivalent of a short a cappella anthem. But, the 17th century German Lutheran motet was really more of a precursor to the cantata. The motets that would have inspired Bach's motets, would have been multi-movement works with soloists and *colla parte* instruments.

BWV 227 is eleven movements (the longest and most musically intricate of the motets). The work is named after a hymn tune by Johann Crüger. That tune is used in different chorale settings for movements 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, & 11, each respectively using a consecutive stanza of the original chorale: Mvt. 1 (Stanza 1), Mvt. 3 (Stanza 2), Mvt. 5 (Stanza 3), etc. Movements 2, 4, 6, 8, & 10 utilize the eighth chapter of the Epistle to the Romans. Throughout the work, Bach uses text painting to illuminate the meaning of the words.

One of the most fascinating things about BWV 227 is the symmetrical structure Bach creates with alternating the chorale settings and settings of the biblical texts in a mirrored pattern sometimes called a chiasmus. Chiasms are named after a Greek word meaning crossing or X-shaped. It is similar in some ways to a palindrome or antimetabole. This larger structure is used to deepen an idea, create rhythm, or increase the power and memorability of the rhetoric.


