

DEAF CUSTOMERS WILL BE ABLE TO USE NEW SYSTEM

MILWAUKEE (UPI) — Starting Wednesday, deaf customers of the Wisconsin Telephone Co. will be able to "talk" by teletypewriters directly to an assistance bureau about directory assistance, bills, repairs and other services.

Establishment of the new bureau is in part the utility's response to a petition filed with the state Public Service Commission last year by Wisconsin Telecommunications.

The telephone industry was asked to provide an answering center and directory assistance service for about 3400 deaf customers with teletypewriters.

In Milwaukee, deaf persons will be able to reach the bureau by dialing 678-3222. From other areas in Wisconsin, the tollfree number is 1-800-242-9393, utility officials said.
