Class History

September 1958, a year has passed. One hundred and eighty nine of us returned as Sophomores. Again, our advisors were Mrs. R. Boulware, Mrs. M. D. Steele, Mr. N. Jones, Mr. G. Limehouse, Mr. W. T. Davis, and Mr. M. J. Mack.

This was a glorious year, filled with travel, leadership, and beauty. Buford Pate served as President; Mary L. Simpson, Vice President; Charlotte Jones, Secretary; Mildred Garvin, Assistant Secretary; Marie Mickel, Treasurer; and Howard McKinney, Business Manager.

Beauty! That we did have. Ann Page served as Miss Sophomore; Mildred Garvin, Miss New Farmers; Delores Hinton, Miss Chorus; Gladys Roach and Barbara Jennings, Miss Chorus Attendants; Joan Ruff, Miss Librarian; and Allene Barnette, Miss F.T.A.

To really top this year off, the band attended the Cherry Blossom Festival, on April 20, 1959, in Washington, D.C. How excited the band members were! How proud the school was! By the time school closed the excitement had dwindled, because we were thinking of the summer months ahead.

September, 1959, we returned to our Alma Mater to dwell for the next school term, with Mrs. R. Boulware, Mr. M. J. Mack, Mrs. M. D. Steele, and Mrs. R. C. Pharr as our trustworthy advisors.

This year one hundred and forty five members of the Junior Class elected Johnny Williamson as President; Franklin Archie, Vice President; Marian Rucker, Secretary; Joan Ruff, Treasurer; and John Ellis, Business Manager.

Again our lovely ladies aided the call of beauty. Sarah Chisholm served as Miss Junior; Priscilla Lytle, Miss Speech Choir; and Sarah McCrorey, Miss Commercial Club.

"The Girl Next Door," a three act comedy, starring Catherine Minor, Lottie Berry, Aaron Mobley, James Mc-Crorey, Sarah McCrorey, Frances Jones, Charles Bowens, and Franklin Archie, was one of the best performances given during the school term of 59-60.

Time passed, and another special event was approaching. The Junior-Senior Prom was being planned. Some weeks passed and then, prom-time. We were perfect hosts to the Seniors on that evening.

School closing brought tears to our eyes, which made us realize we had almost reached our goal.

On September 7, 1960, we again assembled together to travel the last mile before we would be able to reach our goal. One hundred and twenty nine of us started the year busily with football games, homecoming, Senior Class Play, and the electing of our Christmas Queen to represent us in our annual Christmas Parade.

Deloris Hinton was elected to serve as our Miss Homecoming during our homecoming festivities.

On November 22, 1960, the Senior Class presented a three-act play, "Man Alive," starring Franklin Archie, Mary Jo Moore, Cecelia White, Alice Robinson, Pauline Roach, Cora Douglas, Alexander Phillips, Aaron Mobley, and James McCrorey, which proved to be a success.

Time passed on and the Yule-Tide season was approaching. Mildred Garvin represented us as Emmett Scott's Christmas Queen. Oh, how proud we were! Not only because of our Christmas Queen, but the fact that we had traveled the first half of the last mile.

Now we have just a few more events to look forward to; our mid-term exams, the results, our annual talent show, class rings, invitations, final exams, again results, graduating exercises, diplomas, and our last farewell.
