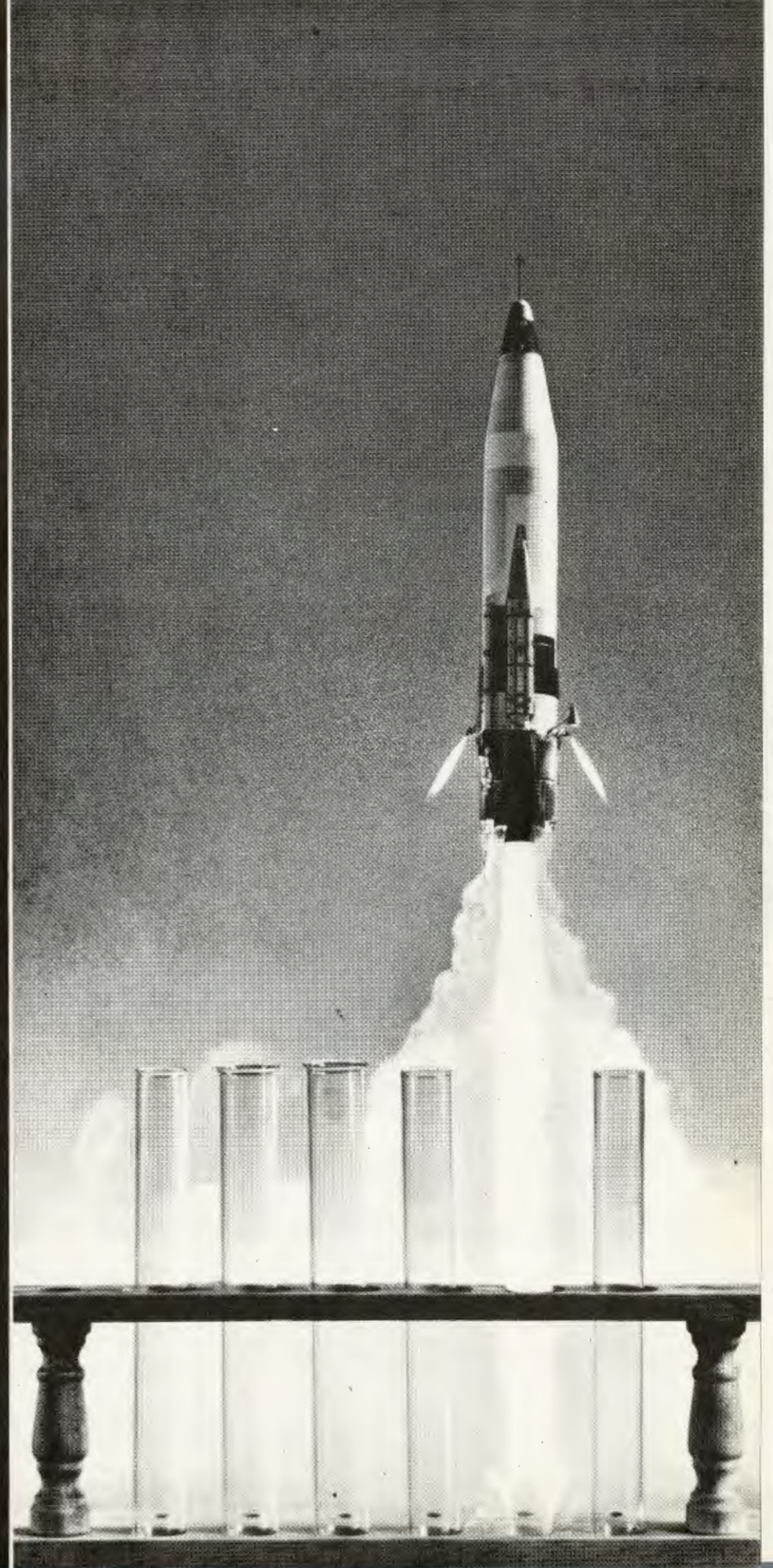

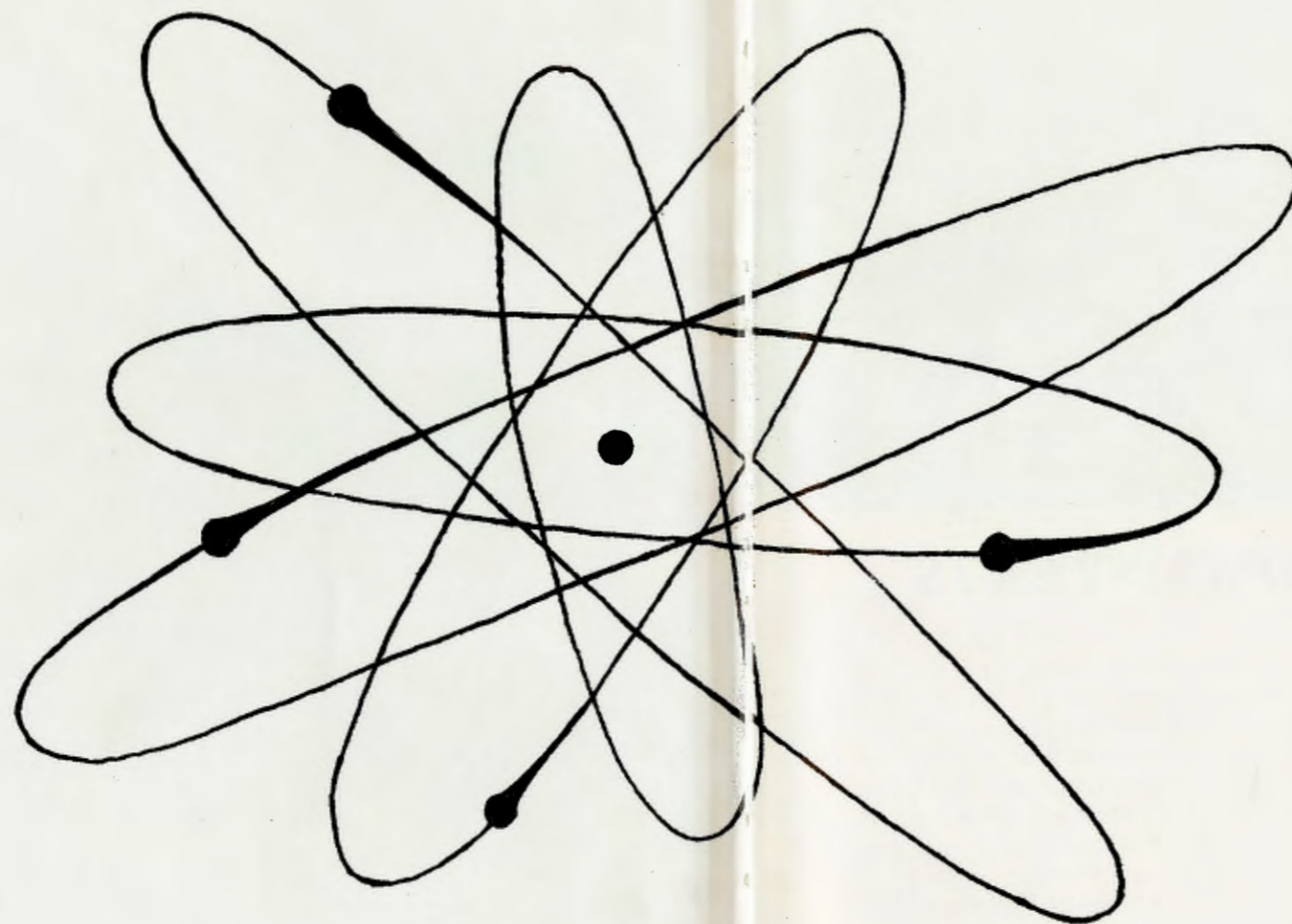

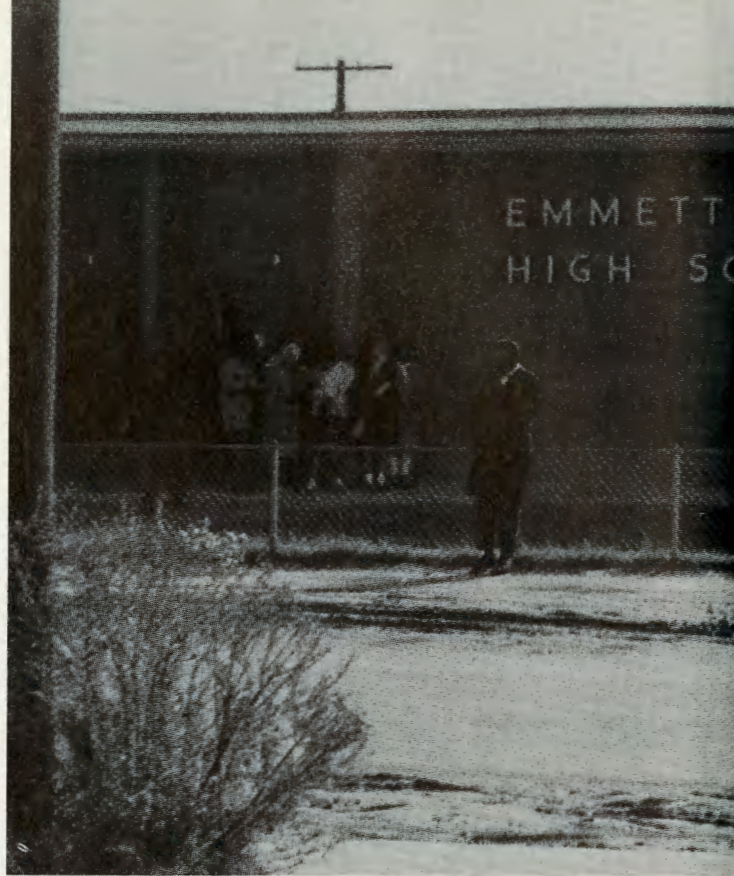

As you turn the pages of our 1964 Rattler, you will view the activities which have developed, kindled and sustained our dreams; also those vital activities which will help push us toward our achievements.

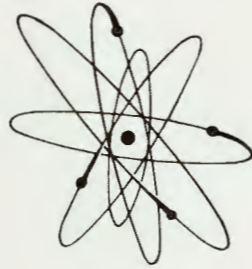

# DEDICATION

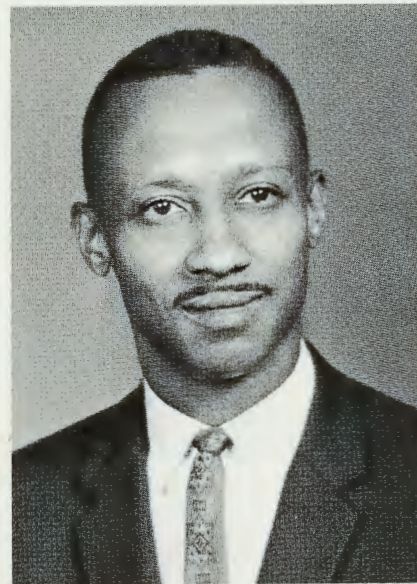

Poverty will not be poverty, nor weakness, weakness."

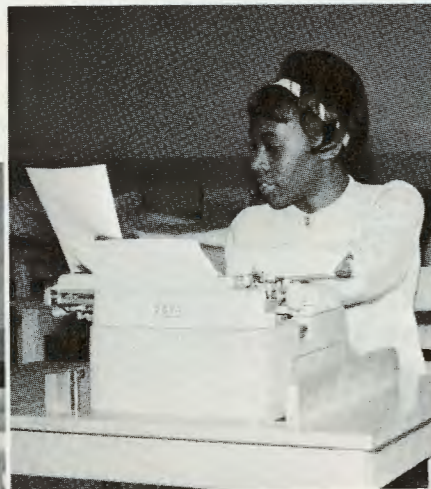

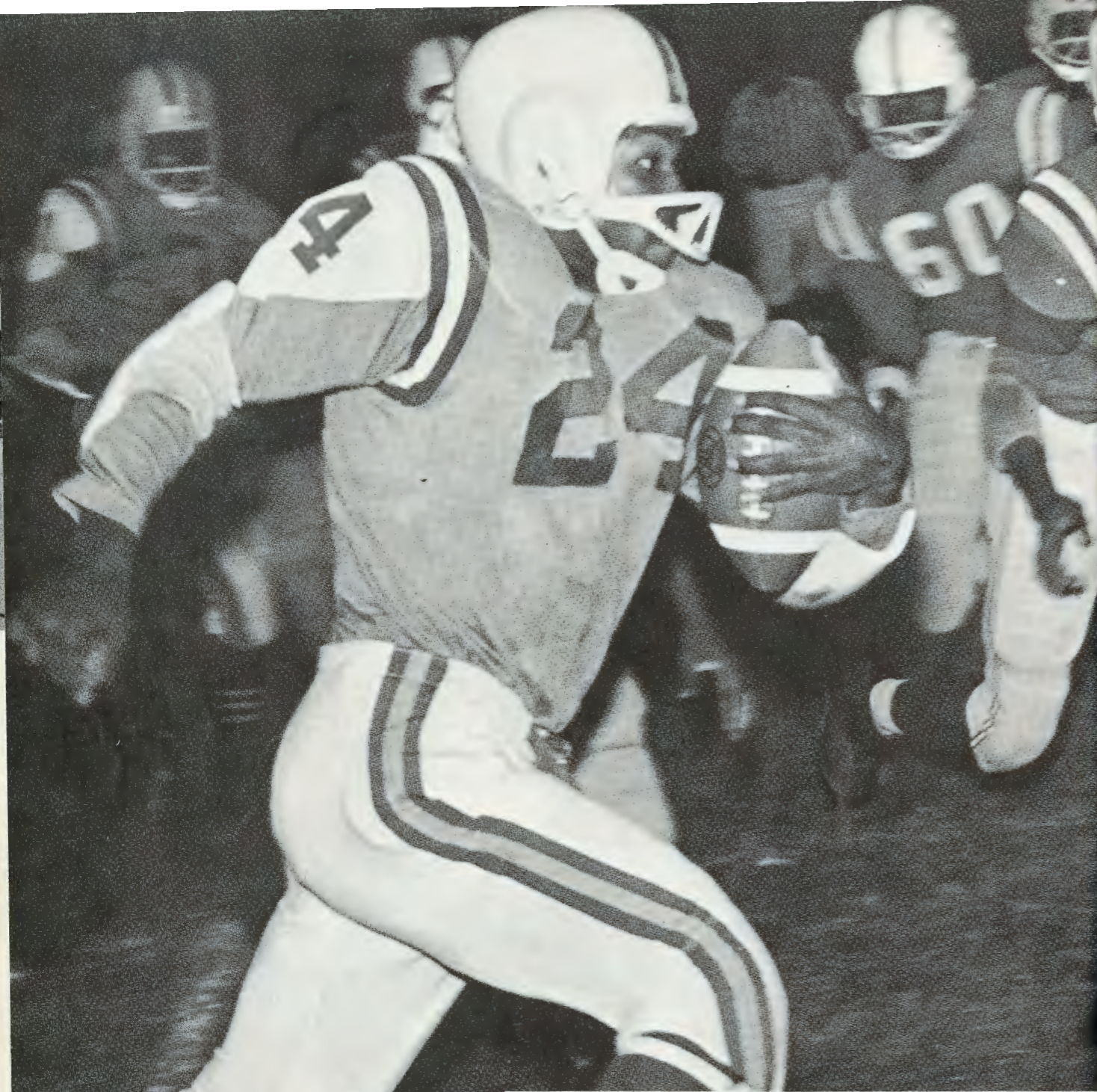

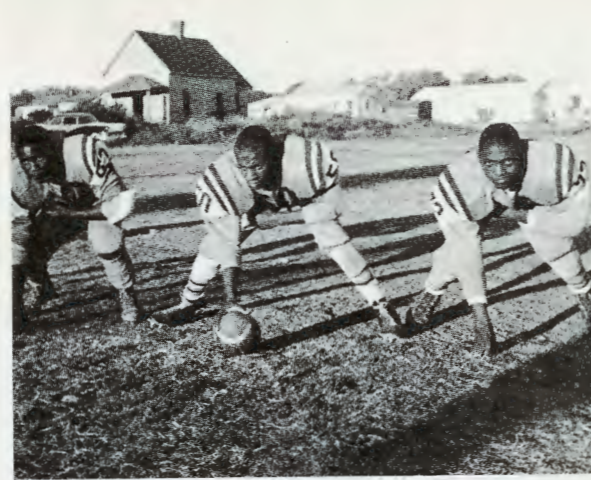
