



THE LIFT OFF 1960—1964

September, 1961: Of our four years spent at Emmett Scott High, none will be as memorable as the year we spent as sophomores. Our class was well represented in all the school activities. Our advisors were Mr. Jones, Mrs. Bradley, Mrs. McKeithen, Mrs. McArthur, Mrs. Moore, Mrs. Newton, Miss Pettus, Mr. Posey and Miss Tarte.

This was an exciting year filled with beauty and leadership; Arnetta Gladden, President; Tommie Ervin, Vice President; Ernestine Porter, Secretary; Dorothy Jordon, Assistant Secretary; Willie B. Douglas, Treasurer and Patricia Cauthen, Reporter.

For "Miss N.H.A." our class proudly provided Rosemary Hunt. Dianne Hart reigned as "Miss Student Council." Tommie Ervin reigned as "Miss N.F.A.", and Ernestine Porter reigned as "Miss High School Chorus." Our class marched as proud sophomores.

September, 1962: As we reached our junior year, we had gained so much confidence in ourselves that we knew we were ready for the title of "Juniors."
