Society has its ideas of what one should become or have others force their ideals onto them. This is why the fandom feels so appealing and relieving as it is a great place to be able to express their true selves and find a place to belong.



Thusly, many who are part of this subculture are LGBT+. This is due to this community already being considered non-normative by society and due to various reasons mentioned previously.

Furry Identity

This is also where fursonas and fursuits come into the mix. Many furries tend to use fursonas to project their ideal selves. their irl selves, or just aspects of themselves: an extension of "This is who I am". Overtime, they could develop their own personalities, flaws. and perhaps be more than their initial intention. Yet. they are Still vehicles to express something personal to their creator through art and other mediums in the fandom. while also helping them understand themselves and grow as a person.
