Administrative history / Biographical sketch

Note

William J. Schull, PhD was an American scientist and geneticist famous for his research into the effects of ionizing radiation on the human body largely based on the atomic bombings in Hiroshima and Nagasaki after World War II. Dr. Schull began his scientific career in radiation research in 1949 when he joined the Atomic Bomb Casualty Commission (ABCC), established in Japan in 1946 by the United States National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council to study the effects of the bombings in accordance with a presidential directive from Harry S. Truman. From his first post as Head of the Department of Genetics at ABCC, Dr. Schull served many decades in the elite corps of scientists conducting research into the genetic impact of irradiation on human health. A professor emeritus of The Human Genetics Center, School of Public Health, The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston, Texas, Dr. Schull served on most of the major governmental and non-governmental committees formed throughout the 20th century to quantify the effects of ionizing radiation. He helped form the genetics department at the University of Michigan where he served as a professor from 1956 to 1972. As his career progressed, Dr. Schull frequently served in executive positions, chairing many of the governmental committees he served on and becoming a director, 1986-1987 and 1990-1991, and in 1996-1997, vice chairman and chief of research of the Radiation Effects Research Foundation (RERF), established in 1975 as the follow-on organization to the Atomic Bomb Casualty Commission. Dr. Schull was inducted into the United States National Academy of Sciences in 2001. In affirmation of his long and honorable service to the Japanese people, Dr. Schull received the Order of the Sacred Treasure, Third Class from the Emperor of Japan in 1992. William Jackson Schull was born on March 17, 1922 to Gertrude Edna (maiden name Davenport) (1900-1938) and Eugene Shull (1896-1975) in Louisiana, Missouri. While Shull is the last name inscribed on his birth certificate, his name was changed to Schull while he was in elementary school. Dr. Schull spent most of his boyhood in Milwaukee, Wisconsin and graduated from that city's Lincoln High School in 1939. In 1946, Dr. Schull earned a Bachelor of Science in Zoology from Marquette University in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. In 1947, he earned a Master of Science in Zoology from the same university. He received a Doctor Of Philosophy in Genetics From Ohio State University, Columbus, Ohio in 1949.

Enlisting in December 1942, Dr. Schull served in the United States Army as a surgical technician with the 37th Infantry Division in the South Pacific until December 1945. In concert with his scientific work, Dr. Schull valued the preservation of the archival historic record and promoted the preservation of the history of the ABCC and RERF throughout his career. He died June 20, 2017, in Houston. A detailed curriculum vitae is available for Dr. Schull in the control folder for his collection at the McGovern Historical Collection.

Custodial history

The McGovern Historical Center received this material directly from William J. Schull during his lifetime. Except as noted in a folder's heading, the images were created by Dr. Schull, an avid photographer. The material remained in his possession until it was donated to the McGovern Historical Center.

Scope and content

The William J. Schull Photograph Collection, MS 170, contains photographic prints, positive and negative transparencies, and text ephemera from Dr. Schull's career and many international travels as a global scientific research consultant in the effects of radiation and human genetics and connoisseur of the world's cultures. Dr. Schull collected and preserved all of the material in this collection in the course of his professional career and private life from 1945 to 2014. The images and text reflect Dr. Schull's appreciation for each land's beauty and the uniqueness of its people, crafts, architecture and attire along with the many friends he cultivated in every place he worked. The collection is organized by geographic location in loose archival photo and slide sleeves or in scrapbooks. Geographical areas represented include Japan, Europe and The Middle East; Latin American and South America; Asia, Australia, and South Pacific countries; and the United States. Usually accompanied by his wife, Vicki Schull, the images capture the many activities of their lives as international travelers and residents in Japan. These images add color and detail to the travel diaries located in MS 67 The William J. Schull, PhD Papers, also in the McGovern Historical Collection. The major theme of this collection is to add an important element of humanity and location to Dr. Schull's scientific career in the form of faces, places, and traditional cultures meeting the new atomic age.

About 50% of the material contains images from Dr. Schull's assignments at the Atomic Bomb Casualty Commission (ABCC) and the Radiation Effects Research Foundation (RERF). A highlight of the collection is the scrapbook given to Dr. Schull by the Emperor of Japan upon awarding him the Order of the Sacred Treasure, Third Class in 1992 for his long and honorable service to the Japanese people. Another scrapbook in the collection contains letters from many of Dr. Schull's peers at the ABCC and RERF commemorating activities in his career.

About 40% of the collection contains images from Vicki and Jack Schull's travels and work in other geographies along with group portrait images of their many friends and family. An important 10% of the collection contains scientific lecture slideshows from Dr. Schull's work in human genetics and the effects of ionizing radiation on human health.

The material in the collection is in excellent condition. Scrapbooks are in their original condition. Other material has been placed in archival photo and slide sheets and foldered in archival boxes.

The material frequently had notes from Dr. Schull that designated the location. Less frequently did he designate dates. During processing, the date printed during development was frequently used to date the material, if available. Otherwise, dates on signs, attire, or auto models, if visible, were used to approximate dates. Country names in brackets, for example [Switzerland], represent the project archivist's best guess as to

the location. Numbers in brackets, for example [100], after each date represent the number of images in each folder. The collection consists of 12 boxes including 4 oversize boxes. It represents approximately 8 cubic feet of material

Notes

Physical condition

The prints, positive and negative transparencies, and media in this collection are in excellent condition. Some transparencies have been removed from the original paper frames and inserted in archival slide pages for protection. The glue on the original paper frames failed.

Immediate source of acquisition

McGovern Historical Center accessioned these records through a Deed of Gift from Dr. Schull over a number of years in distributions of various sizes and content.

Location of originals

Most of the material is original. Images depicting atomic bomb damage and the physical condition of victims immediately after the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki during World War II are reproductions. The location of the originals is not known with certainty. Some images were created by the Atomic Bomb Casualty Commission Photo labs. These images may be copies. The collections consists of approximately 12 boxes including oversize. It consists of approximately 8 cubic feet of material.

Alternative form available

The collection contains photographic prints on paper, both black and white and color; positive and negative transparencies, both black and white and color; correspondence; and text ephemera. Material originally housed in a scrapbook remains as received.

Restrictions on access

This collection is open for research. Some material in the collection has been restricted due to the use of patient names or other considerations about the contents. Consult an archivist about potential access to these materials.

<u>Scope and content</u>: Scope and Content Note: This series includes photographic images printed on paper and on positive and negative transparencies that capture Dr. Schull's experiences at the Atomic Bomb Casualty Commission (ABCC) and Radiation Effects Research Foundation (RERF) as well as his many travels into the Japanese countryside and cities. Dr. Schull's love of Japanese gardens, pottery, traditional ceremonies, dress and architecture is documented in these images. A life long collector of Japanese artifacts, Dr. Schull collected the beauty of Japan, her people and her culture in photographs. The folders are first in order by media: print on paper, positive transparency, and negative transparency. Within these categories, the order is determined by date, earliest to latest. If not designated as color, the images are black and white. Some folders in this series are RESTRICTED due to patient images and or content. Consult an archivist for access.
