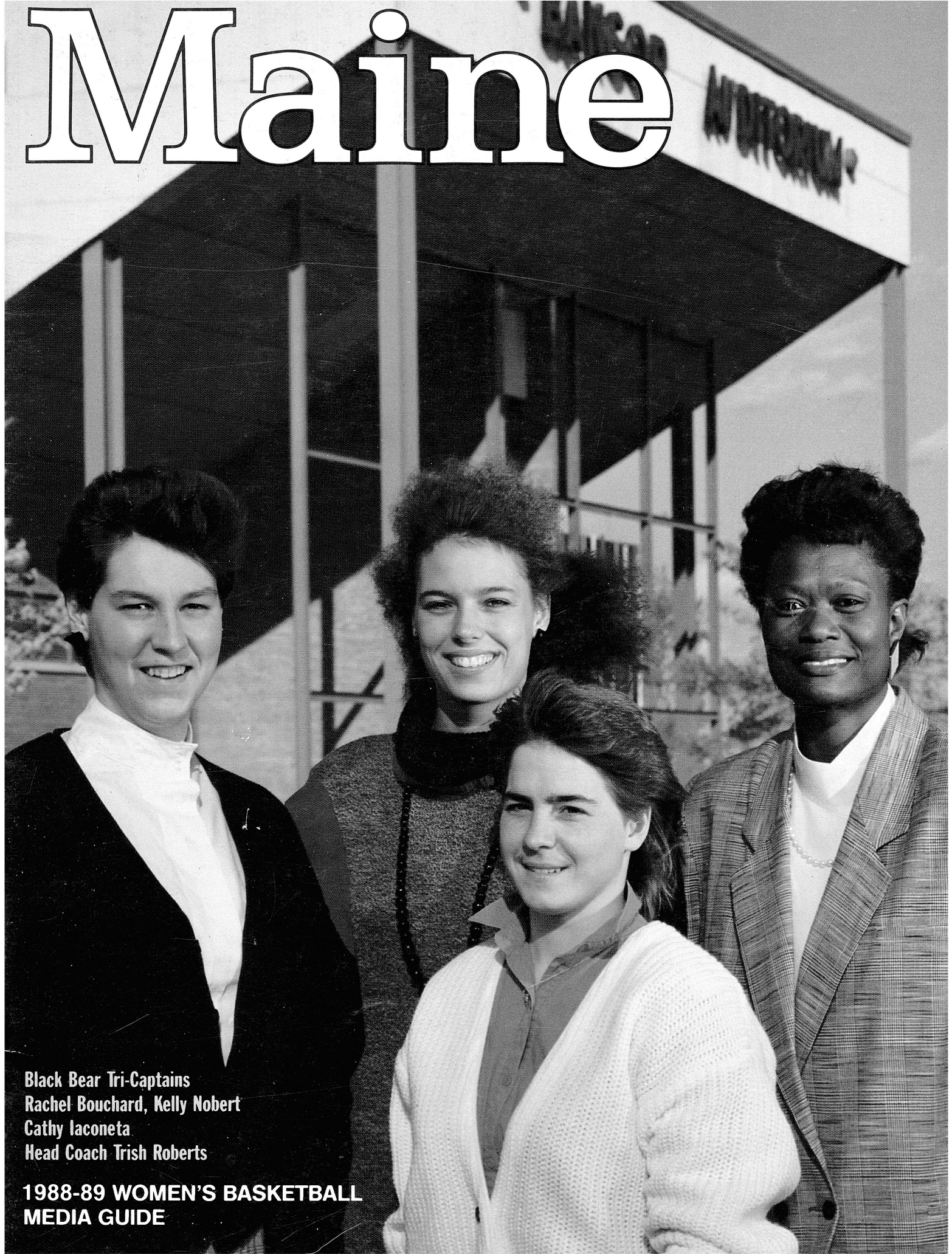

THE UNIVERSITY OF MAINE

The University of Maine, with its seven colleges and four schools, is the largest campus in the statewide university system. There is plenty of elbow room on its 1,200 acres, where the student is offered the diversity and challenge of a large university in the invigorating atmosphere of a small college. Close personal contact among students, and between students and faculty, is a tradition at Orono, where one knows one's neighbors and teachers.

Orono is a cosmopolitan campus in a classic New England setting. Last year, students from 37 states and 36 countries studied here. More than 20 percent of the total enrollment of 12,000 students is admitted

from outside the state of Maine.

The campus is located one mile from the center of Orono, an at-



tractive town with a population of about 10,000, which is 10 miles from Bangor, the state's third largest city. It is in the center of the state's year-round outdoor recreation area, with ski slopes,

scores of ponds, lakes, streams, and the beautiful Maine coast within a short driving distance.

The University of Maine offers programs in physical education, intercollegiate athletics, intramural sports, recreation and related club activities. These programs are recognized as an integral part of the educational process that the university controls and supports within the limitations of budget, staff, equipment, and facilities. These programs are to promote educational leadership, physical fitness, opportunity for recreational pursuits, and athletic excellence through instruction and competition.



DR. DALE W. LICK

Dr. Dale W. Lick, 50, was named the 16th president of the University of Maine Sept. 1, 1986. Dr. Lick came to the University of Maine after serving for eight years as president of Georgia Southern College in Statesboro, Ga., where he was also a professor of mathematics and computer science. During his tenure at Georgia Southern, he was a guiding force in moving the school's athletic programs into Division One and for the Georgia Southern football team's Division I-AA national championship.

A graduate of Michigan State University, where he obtained his baccalaureate and master's degrees in

mathematics, Dr. Lick earned his doctorate at the University of California in Riverside.

Prior to taking the presidency of Georgia Southern, he was dean of the School of Sciences and Health Professions at Old Dominion University, vice president for academic affairs at Russell Sage College and chairman of the math department at Drexel University.

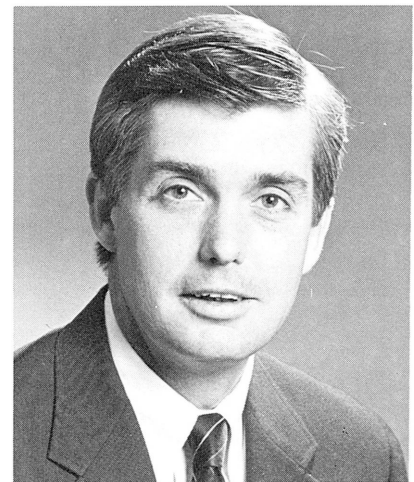
He is married and he and his wife, Marilyn, have three children.

DR. KEVIN M. WHITE

Dr. Kevin M. White joined the University of Maine as the school's Director of Athletics on August 17, 1987. White, 37, came from Loras College in Dubuque, Iowa, where he was the Vice-President for College Advancement for two years. Prior to that position, he was the school's Athletic Director.

Before moving to Loras College, he was the Assistant Director of Athletics and head track and field coach at Southern Missouri. White also has been the driving force behind the National Catholic Basketball Tournament, which features 32 Catholic colleges taking part, and whose championship games are nationally televised.

A graduate of St. Joseph's



College (Rensselaer, Ind.), where he earned his baccalaureate degree in business administration, White received his master's degree in physical education from Central Michigan University. He obtained his doctorate from Southern Illinois in education in 1983.

He was appointed to the NCAA Selection Committee in 1988. That organization is responsible for nominating, screening and recommending individuals for appointment to the prestigious NCAA council.

White is married and he and his wife, Jane, have four children.

THE COACHING STAFF



**HEAD COACH PATRICIA
"TRISH" ROBERTS**

Patricia Roberts, 33, was named head coach of the University of Maine women's basketball program August 23, 1988, and thus became just the third head coach of that program since its inception as an intercollegiate activity in 1975.

Although this is her first head coaching position, Trish comes with the credentials that will make her an outstanding role model for the women who will make up the 1988-89 roster. An All-American basketball player, an Olympian and a former professional player, Trish has also had valuable coaching experience in the big time of women's basketball.

Roberts came to the University of Maine after serving for two years as an assistant coach at the University of North Carolina, where her responsibilities included scouting, recruiting, on-court teaching, counseling and scheduling. She has also been an assistant women's basketball coach at Central Michigan University, from 1982-84, and at the University of Illinois, from 1984-85.

A graduate of the University of Tennessee in 1979, Trish was a Kodak and Street and Smith's All-American basketball player, as well as Female Athlete of the Year. She was a member of the USA Team that won a silver medal in the 1976 Olympics, the 1977 World University Team and the captain of the 1978 USA National Team.

She played professional basketball for the Minnesota Fillies and the St. Louis Streak, and in 1981 was named Woman's Basketball League All-Pro.

In 1987 she worked for the Olympic Committee as an athlete liaison at the World University Games in Yugoslavia, and she has conducted summer basketball camps at Central Michigan University and the University of Illinois.

A graduate of Monroe, GA, Area High School, Roberts played basketball at North Georgia College and at Emporia, Kansas, State College before entering the University of Tennessee. She has taken graduate courses toward a Master's Degree in Athletic Administration at Central Michigan.

Roberts is a member of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) and the Black Coaches Association (BCA).

Her philosophy on playing basketball is the up-tempo game, using the all-court press, changing defenses and fast-break offense. "I would prefer the up-tempo style of play, but I will adjust to the talent available," she says. One thing that has impressed the new coach has been the work ethic of the players she has inherited. "Their attitudes have been great and they have tackled every pre-season work request without complaint," she notes.

**ASSISTANT COACH
JANET DIXON**

Janet D. Dixon, formerly a teacher and head coach of women's basketball and softball at T.C. Roberson High School in Ashville, NC, has been named the assistant women's basketball coach at the University of Maine.

In her one year as head coach of women's basketball at Roberson, her team finished with a 15-11 record and placed second in the conference with a 7-3 mark. In her first year, she was the assistant coach of the Roberson team that finished 10-0 in the conference and eighth in the state with an overall mark of 23-7.

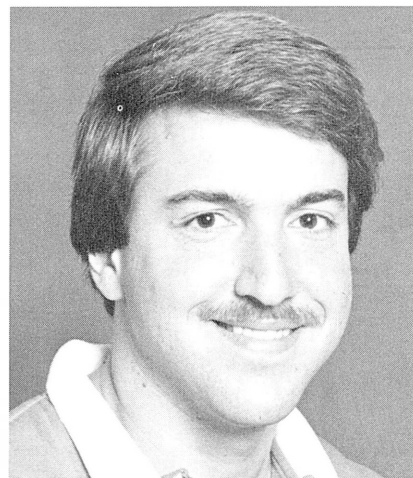
Last year she was voted Coach of the Year in the WAC Conference as the head softball coach. Her team was the conference champion and completed a 17-6 campaign.

Dixon obtained a Bachelor of Arts

Degree from Pfeiffer College and a Master's Degree in physical education from Gardner-Webb College in Boiling Spring, NC, in May of 1986. At Pfeiffer, where she had a four-year basketball/softball scholarship, she was co-captain of the basketball team, Most Valuable Player in the Carolinas Conference softball tournament and an All-World third baseman in USSSA Open Softball.

In 1984 she was an assistant coach for women's basketball at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, and in 1985 she was the head volleyball coach at Gardner-Webb College. In 1985 she also served as track coach at W.C. Friday Junior High in Dallas, NC.

In accepting the position at Maine, Dixon said, "It is an opportunity that I did not feel that I could pass up at this stage of my life. Women's basketball at the University of Maine is big time, and it affords me the opportunity I'm seeking to coach on the college scene."



**ASSISTANT COACH
JOHN ROBINSON**

John Robinson, 26, of West Frankfort, IL, has been named a graduate assistant coach in the women's basketball program for the 1988-89 season.

In 1987-88 he was the head coach at West Frankfort, IL, High School of the girls' basketball team, and during the summers of 1985, 1986, 1987 and 1988, he has directed a basketball camp in Casco, Maine.

A graduate of Southern Illinois in 1984 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in health education, Robinson has served as an assistant woman's basketball coach at Rend Lake Junior College in Ina, IL, from 1982-86 and as the head softball coach at Rend Lake from 1984-86.

He started his coaching career as a student assistant coach of girls' basketball and softball at West Frankfort, IL, High School. He has taken Master's Degree courses at Southern Illinois.

At Maine his responsibilities will include recruiting, pre-season and post-season conditioning, on-court teaching, home game management and summer clinics.

He is single and resides in Old Town, Maine.

1988-89 MAINE OUTLOOK

The 1988-89 season will usher in a new era in University of Maine women's basketball. An entirely new slate of coaches, headed by former Olympian Patricia Roberts, will take over the direction of the program; all except three home games will be played in the 5654-seat Bangor Auditorium. Freshmen promise to play in important role in the fortunes of the Black Bears.

The season will also mark the final competition for Maine in the Seaboard Conference, as the Bears will join most members in moving to the ECAC's North Atlantic Conference.

Also missing from the Maine club for the first time in five years is three-time Kodak District I All-American Liz Coffin, who has graduated and taken her basketball prowess to Europe to play professionally.

While the loss of Coffin, along with last year's starting forward Debbie Duff and starting guard Jen Smart, leaves some major roles unsettled, the new coaching staff enters the campaign with optimism. One of the prime reasons for that optimism is the return of 6-0 sophomore forward Rachel Bouchard, a Freshman All-American, who averaged 17.3 points a game and led the Bears in rebounding with an average of 11.5 per game, placing her 18th nationally in Division I. She also led the club with 42 blocked shots and figures to be the key to Maine's inside game this season.

Another reason for optimism is the return of sparkplug guard Cathy Iaconeta, a 5-2 whirlwind who has all the attributes required to run an up-tempo offense, something that the new coaching staff would like to put into place. Iaconeta led the Bears in assists in her freshman year with 105 and plays hard-nosed defense. She averaged nearly seven points a game and can hit the outside shot.

The third reason for optimism lies in the work ethic of the current squad. The

willingness of the returning players to prepare for the season with hard work has greatly impressed the new coaching staff, who see enthusiasm and dedication making up for some of the inexperience of not only the newcomers, but many of the returnees.

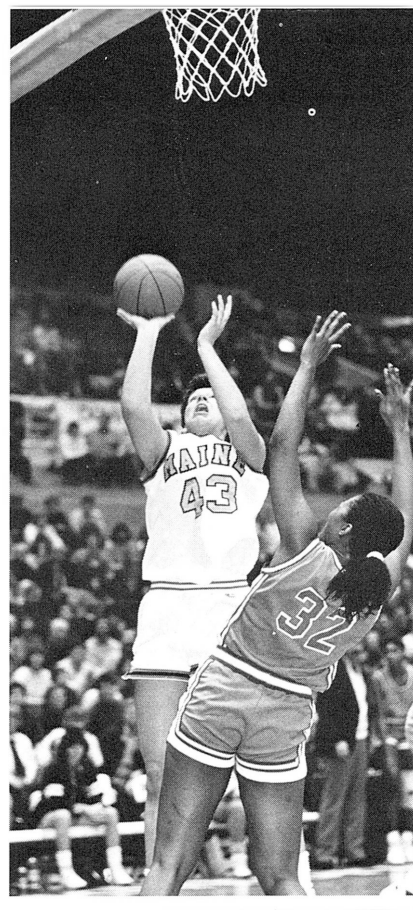
While Bouchard and Iaconeta seem set as starters at their positions, the remainder of the starting posts are wide open. Kelly Nobert, a senior tri-captain, may get the nod at a starting forward position, and Diane Nagle, the tallest player on the squad, could be a starter at center. The other guard position quite possibly will go to 6-0 senior Victoria Watras, who has returned to the club after leaving school last year, or to a couple of freshmen: 5-6 Julie Bradstreet or 5-9 Carrie Goodhue.

Two freshmen, Jessica Carpenter and Tracey Frenette, will battle two returnees, Kathy Carlsson and Elizabeth Sullivan, for spots on the forward line, while Tasha Koris and Jill McGregor, both of whom saw limited action last season, will contest Nagle for the center post. Frenette is the first non-Maine native to play on the Black Bear squad since the 1984-85 season.

One of the most impressive candidates in the pre-season practice sessions has been Julie Bradstreet, who played her high school basketball at Central Aroostook. A Converse All-American honorable mention, she averaged 28.5 points a game as a senior, along with 12.8 rebounds. Her quickness and stamina make her a prime candidate for a starting guard position.

Bradstreet, along with Carrie Goodhue and Jessica Carpenter, could help the Bears with their outside game to supplement the inside scoring punch that will be provided by Bouchard.

The departure of Liz Coffin leaves a considerable void, both offensively and defensively. Last season she led the team in scoring with 20.1 points a game and also in



steals with 80. She was the second leading free throw shooter in the nation last season with an 88.3 accuracy mark. The loss of Debbie Duff, who led the club in three-point field goals with 11 in 24 attempts, takes the main outside scoring threat away. Bouchard's status in the early part of the season is questionable as she is recovering from an ankle injury suffered last spring.

The other player graduating, who played a prominent part in the recent success of the Bears, was Crystal Cummings, who often filled the role of first player off the bench. She played in all 28 games last season, averaging 3.3 points and 2.4 rebounds a game.

Lack of experience and a very tough schedule that finds the Bears facing the likes of Duke, Virginia Commonwealth, University of San Diego, and Georgia Tech will pose some early problems for the Bears under their new coaching staff. However, the Maine camp is confident that the 1988-89 contingent will continue the winning ways generated in the past six seasons.

THE SEABOARD CONFERENCE

The Seaboard Conference, as it is now constituted, will cease to exist after this year with six of the current teams moving into the ECAC's North Atlantic Conference. Maine, along with Northeastern, Boston University, Vermont, New Hampshire and Hartford will become the NAC's original members along with Colgate University. The North Atlantic Conference currently contains the men's basketball teams of all of these schools. Seeking other conference affiliates after the 1988-89 season will be Brooklyn College and Central Connecticut State University.

The final year of the Seaboard Conference will be the fifth of its existence, with each team playing two games against each other member to determine the four top teams, which will compete in the conference Playoffs March 1-4. Post-season games will be played at the site of the highest seed with the competing teams to be named one week prior to the tournament.

The same four teams have reached the Seaboard tournament in each of the previous four years it has been held: Maine, Boston University, Northeastern and New Hampshire. Northeastern Huskies have won the tournament three times while Boston University edged out Maine's Black Bears last season in the final game.

The Seaboard Conference also holds a championship event in tennis as well as basketball.

BLACK BEAR TOURNAMENTS

TOURNEY TIME COMES EARLY FOR MAINE BEARS

The University of Maine women's basketball team will compete in five tournaments to open up the 1988-89 season and will be the host team in three of them. The 15 teams involved in those five tournaments last year posted a combined overall record of 225 wins and 168 losses, and three of the teams involved won or tied for conference championships.

The Black Bears open the season by hosting the Downeast Auto Classic at the Bangor Auditorium Nov. 25 and 26. In the opening round Duke University (17-10 overall) of the Atlantic Coast Conference will meet Eastern Washington University (15-9 overall) of the Big Sky at 7 p.m. In the 9 p.m. contest, Maine (23-6 overall) of the Seaboard Conference meets the University of San Diego (12-15) of the West Coast Conference. The consolation game of the tournament will be played at 1 p.m. on Nov. 26 and the championship game at 3 p.m.

The Bears then head to Michigan State for a tournament that includes the host school, Syracuse, and Drake, and which will be played Dec. 2 and 3 at East Lansing, MI. In the opening round, the Bears will meet Syracuse University (20-7), the champion of the Big East Conference last season and an NCAA post-season participant. In the other opening round game, Michigan State (14-10) will meet Drake (15-12), a member of the Gateway Conference. The final two games are scheduled for Dec. 3 at 2 p.m. and 4 p.m.

On Dec. 9 and 10, the Bears will participate in the Virginia Commonwealth Tournament in

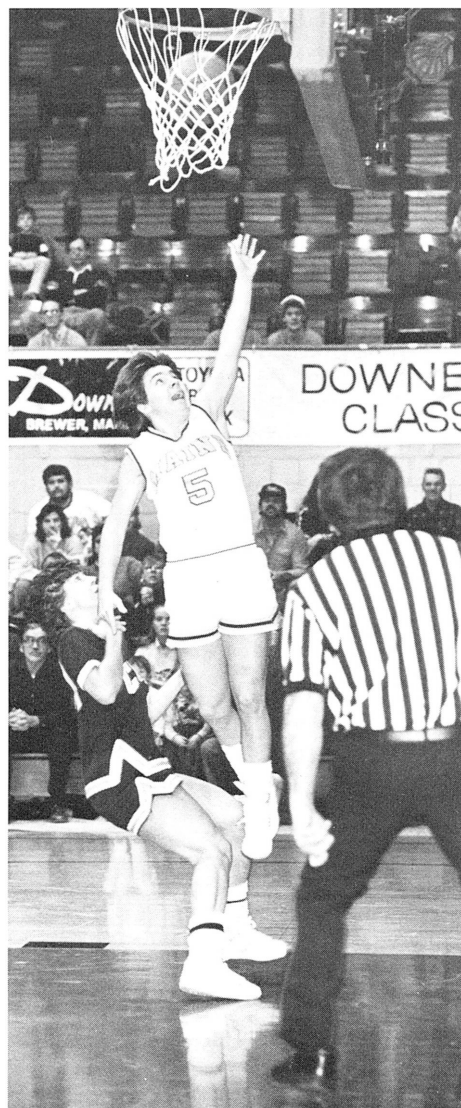
Richmond, VA, and will face the host team, VCU (13-12), at 6 p.m. Virginia Commonwealth is a member of the Sun Belt Conference. In the other opening round contest, Duke will go against the University of Connecticut (17-10) of the Big East Conference. The second day's games are scheduled for 1 p.m. and 3 p.m.

For the first time the University of Maine will host a women's basketball tournament at Augusta, scheduled for Dec. 17 and 18. In the opening round, Howard (16-11) of the Mid-Eastern Conference will meet Harvard University (19-4), winner of the Ivy League last season, while, in the other contest, Maine will meet Georgia Tech (11-15). The games are scheduled for 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. each day.

The final tournament of the early season for the Black Bears is scheduled for Dec. 28 and 29 with Maine hosting the Bath Iron Works classic at Portland's Cumberland County Civic Center. In the opening round of this tourney Providence College (13-14) of the Big East Conference will meet Georgia State (11-16) of the New South Conference at 7 p.m. and the Black Bears will play the University of Massachusetts (9-17) of the Atlantic 10 Conference at 9 p.m.

The consolation and championship games are slated for Dec. 29 at 7 p.m. and 9 p.m.

The three tournaments in Maine will bring to this state teams from the four corners of the nation. Committees working on each of the tourneys have developed plans to entertain the visiting clubs and to make sure that they enjoy Maine food and hospitality. In return, the basketball fans of Maine will get a chance to see women's basketball at its best.



HOME OF THE BLACK BEARS

The University of Maine and the City of Bangor signed a four-year agreement in June, 1988, that will allow the University's men's and women's basketball teams to play most of their home games at the 5,654-seat Bangor Auditorium. The relocation from the campus site, Memorial Gymnasium, represents a major institutional commitment to competitive NCAA Division I basketball with the refurbished facility a key for attracting outstanding and nationally recognized opponents.

The Auditorium has been refurbished to include the establishment of a Black Bear Gift Shop in the lobby area while other renovations have been completed to the men's and women's locker rooms, and offices for coaches have been established. Extensive redecorating of the building to provide a University of Maine atmosphere has

also been accomplished as the result of a fundraising campaign by city officials. The court has been refinished.

The Auditorium business office now serves as a ticket outlet for Black Bear basketball events.

The Auditorium is located on Main Street in Bangor, about a mile from the center of the city. Hotel and motel accommodations are located just across the street from the facility while access to Interstate 95 is a major plus in the use of the building for basketball.

The Bangor Auditorium was constructed in 1955, and in 1979 a Civic Center was added to the structure. The Auditorium has nine rest rooms with facilities for both men and women located on each floor and has three pay phones located adjacent to the main lobby.

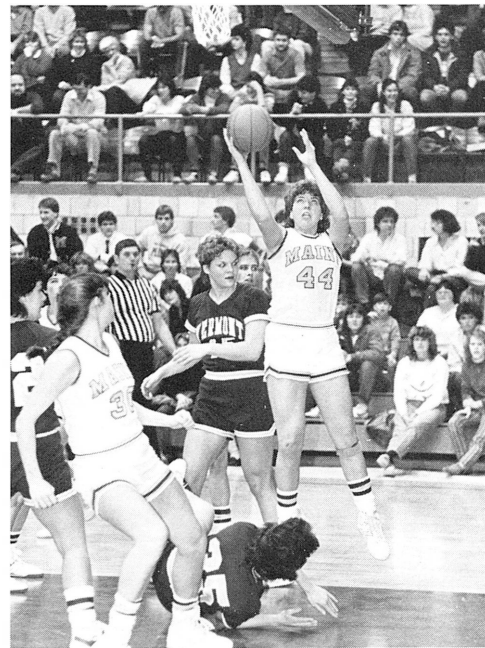

At the conclusion of the 1987-88 season a total of nine seniors wound up their collegiate basketball careers with the games most important double: 2,000 or more career points and 1,000 or more career rebounds. One of those nine seniors nationally to achieve this honor was the University of Maine's Elizabeth Coffin, who concluded a starry career for the Black Bears with 2,153 points and 1,351 rebounds. The national leader in career points was Valorie Whiteside of Appalachian State with 2,944, and the national leader in career rebounds was Katie Beck of East Tennessee State with 1,404. Patricia Hoskins, a junior out of Mississippi Valley State, has already reached the much sought after double: she has 2,218 points and 1,222 rebounds with one year left to play.
