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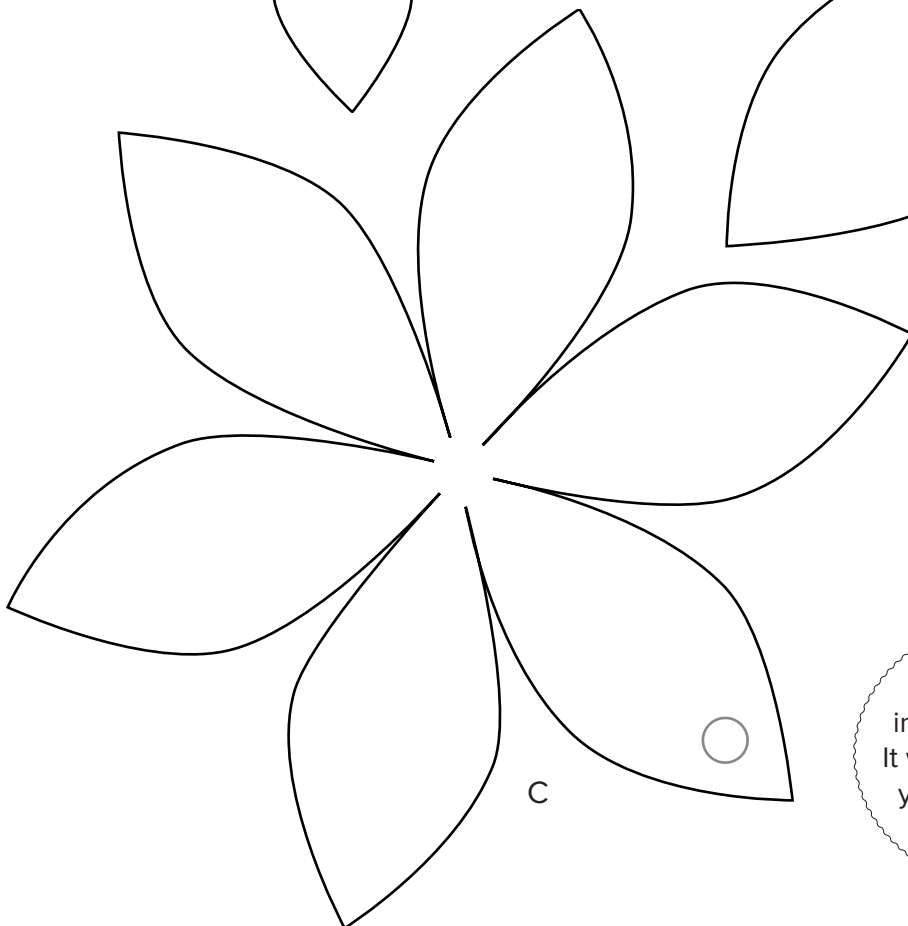
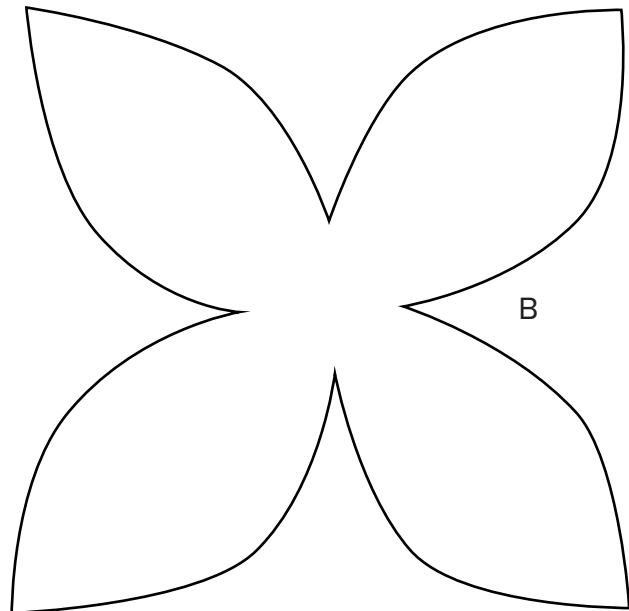
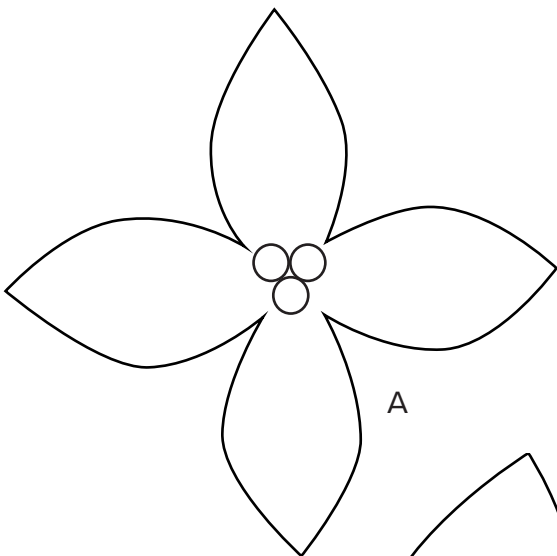
Make your own poinsettia ornament

You will need:

1. crayons, markers or colored pencils (reds, greens, yellows)
2. scissors
3. adhesive: glue, glue stick, glue dots or tape
4. single hole punch
5. string

Print pages 1 and 2. Follow the directions in order.

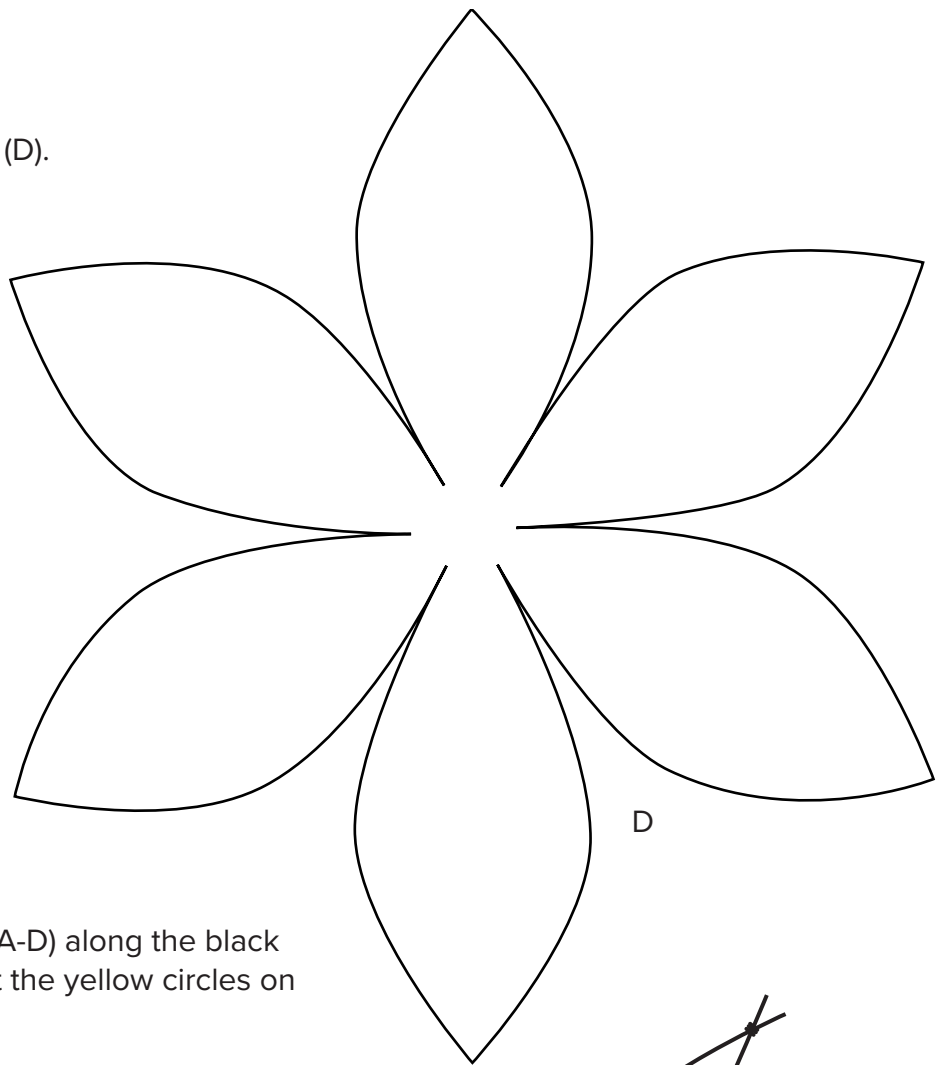
1. **Color** in the poinsettia's bracts — the colorful leaves of the poinsettia (layers A, B and C).
On layer A, color the three circles yellow.



Tip: Some poinsettias are red, pink or white — use your imagination!

Tip: Punch a hole in the circle on layer C. It will be for the string so your ornament can be hung on the tree.

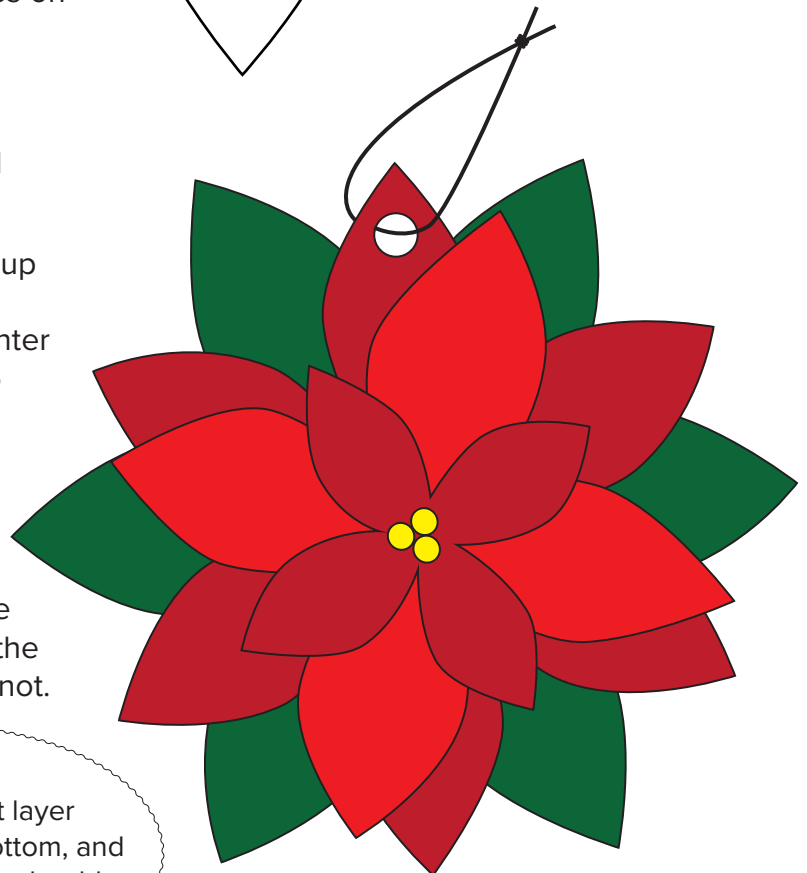
2. **Color** the leaves green (D).



3. **Cut out** all four layers (A-D) along the black outlines. Do not cut out the yellow circles on layer A.

4. **Assemble** your poinsettia. You will need your glue, glue stick, glue dots or tape.

- Lay your green leaves (D) color side up on the table.
- Put a dab of your adhesive in the center of the back of layer C, then stick it to the green leaves (D).
- Do the same for layer B, sticking it to layer C, then layer A, sticking it to layer B.
- The final step is to punch the hole in layer C if you haven't already done so. Then thread your string through the hole and tie the ends together in a knot.



Tip: Your largest layer should be on the bottom, and your smallest layer should be on the top.
