COLLECTION SUMMARY

Dr. Godwin Sadoh is a Nigerian composer, educator, church musician, organist, pianist, choral conductor, and ethnomusicologist. He holds music degrees from the Obafemi Awolowo University, Nigeria; the University of Pittsburgh; the University of Nebraska-Lincoln; and Louisiana State University, Baton Rouge, where he became the first African to receive a doctoral degree in organ performance from any institution in the world. The collection holds scores, publications, books, and recorded music

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Godwin Simeon Sadoh was born in Lagos State, Nigeria in 1965. He obtained certificates in piano, theory, and general musicianship from the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music in London from 1982 to 1986 and earned a BA in Piano and Composition in 1988 from the Obafemi Awolowo University in Ile-Ife, Nigeria. Sadoh served as a music instructor while studying in Ile-Ife, in Pittsburgh, and in Lincoln, Nebraska. He became a lecturer in 1995, teaching at Golden West College in California, Thiel College in Greenville, Pennsylvania through 1998.

Sadoh earned a MA in African Ethnomusicology in 1998 from the University of Pittsburgh, and a MM in Organ Performance and Church Music in 2000 from the University of Nebraska–Lincoln. He also holds a DMus degree in Organ Performance and Composition in 2004 from Louisiana State University. Sadoh has taught in various institutions from 2000 to the present, including LeMoyne-Owen College in Memphis, Tennessee, where he also served as Director of the Concert Choir and the Church Music program and as professor in the Music Department at Talladega College in Alabama.

Performing and writing as an organist has been a strong focus of his creative and professional work. He began as organist and choir director in several churches in both Nigeria and the United States from 1980 to the present. He is a sought-after organist and pianist in Nigeria and the US and has directed concert choirs at various churches and universities since 1982. Sadoh has lectured and published on the topics of African pianism, Nigerian church music, and Nigerian and African composers, conductors, and ethnomusicologists. Sadoh has published numerous articles and has authored several books about his fellow Nigerian composers.

Dr. Sadoh has composed extensively for organ and piano, with other instrumentation, including voice and chorus. His works have been performed in Italy, Tanzania, the UK, around the US, Norway, Germany, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Costa Rica, and Nigeria. He specializes in incorporating Nigerian folk styles and rhythms into his compositions.

Sadoh has also authored several scholarly publications and served on the Editorial Advisory Committee for the *Black Music Research Journal* from 2005 to 2012. He has published extensively on African musicology in various journals, such as *The Hymn, The Organ, The Diapason, Africa, Choral Journal, Organ Encyclopedia, Living Music, Composer-USA*, and the *Contemporary African Database*.
