At Professor M. Cherif Bassiouni's request, I have been trying to reach you by telephone to determine whether we should go ahead with our previously discussed plan of sending Jack Endicott to the Tribunal to resolve any technical problems you may be having with the database.

As you saw when you visited the International Human Rights Law Institute, our database works well in Chicago. This leads me to believe that the problems you may be experiencing are a result of difference in hardware and networking. Due to the sophisticated nature of the database, one could expect to need additional technical assistance in its operation upon its transfer to a new computer system, which is why we offered Jack's services to you.

The database contains information that will prove valuable to the Prosecutor. It would be a shame if this information was not used because of technical difficulties in the operation of the database.
