1. I acknowledge receipt of your above-mentioned telefax.
 2. Please note that Lt-Col. Kempenaars will go over the list you sent to me with Mr. Miserez, ICRC. However, I am not optimistic as to the results to be achieved since the said list is basically the same one that you had forwarded to me a month ago and which I submitted to Mr. Miserez. For easy reference, herewith is Mr. Miserez's reply, which I previously transmitted to you. In any event, Lt-Col. Kempenaars will endeavour to elicit some positive results.
 3. As to UNHCR, the Commission Secretariat has indeed been receiving information from UNHCR on a regular basis. UNHCR documents, which seem to be from the field, are listed in the indexes to the files that are forwarded to you periodically.
 4. Lastly, the Mazowiecki Commission Secretariat also has been sending all the information in their possession to the Commission Secretariat on a regular basis and we have been forwarding it to Chicago. And, after your conversation in March with Mr. Roman Wieruszewski and Ms. Karen Kenny, I sent to you the additional information that you had requested that they provide to the Commission Secretariat.

5. Therefore, as far as the collection of information is concerned, we are on a good course.
6. If you require any further clarifications, I remain at your disposal.



En ce qui concerne les activités de visites aux détenus, le seul document public consiste en une liste des lieux visités, comprenant le nombre de prisonniers présents et la date de la dernière visite, ainsi qu'une liste des détenus libérés sous les auspices du CICR. La liste des détenus visités est régulièrement mise à jour et je vous envoie ci-joint copie de listes antérieures datant de 1992. J'espère que celles-ci vous seront utiles et vous fourniront des indications sur certains lieux figurant sur votre liste.

En revanche, le CICR ne peut pas, pour des raisons de confidentialité qui vous sont connues, entrer en matière pour vous fournir des informations sur vos requêtes i, ii, v et surtout iv (le nom des prisonniers libérés) et vi.

Quant à votre point 3, nous demeurons bien entendu à votre disposition pour d'éventuels éclaircissements.

WITH THE CONFLICT IN CENTRAL BOSNIA

In connection with clashes in central and southern Bosnia between Bosnian Croat and Muslim forces since April 1993 the ICRC has visited 1,050 Muslim detainees held by the Bosnian Croats Forces and 820 Bosnian Croat detainees held by the Bosnian Government forces in 16 places of detention. Some 800 of these detainees have been released under ICRC supervision.

The ICRC is currently visiting and registering Muslim detainees held by Bosnian Croats forces in Rodoc. By 17 May 1993, the ICRC had registered some 1,800 detainees in Rodoc and 30 Bosnian Croat detainees held by Bosnian Government forces in Mostar.
