Epigeum Award for the Most Effective Use of Video



The purpose of this prize is to give credit to those practitioners who are exploiting video to enhance learning. There will be four criteria when judging entries: creativity, wisdom of technological choices, fit for purposeness of production, and effect on student learning. Submissions must relate to video components of either online courses or online components of blended learning courses. There are no other restrictions.
