NH PRIMARY: EASY TO VOTE AND ACCURATELY COUNTED, SUPPORT FOR FIRST-IN-THE-NATION AMENDMENT

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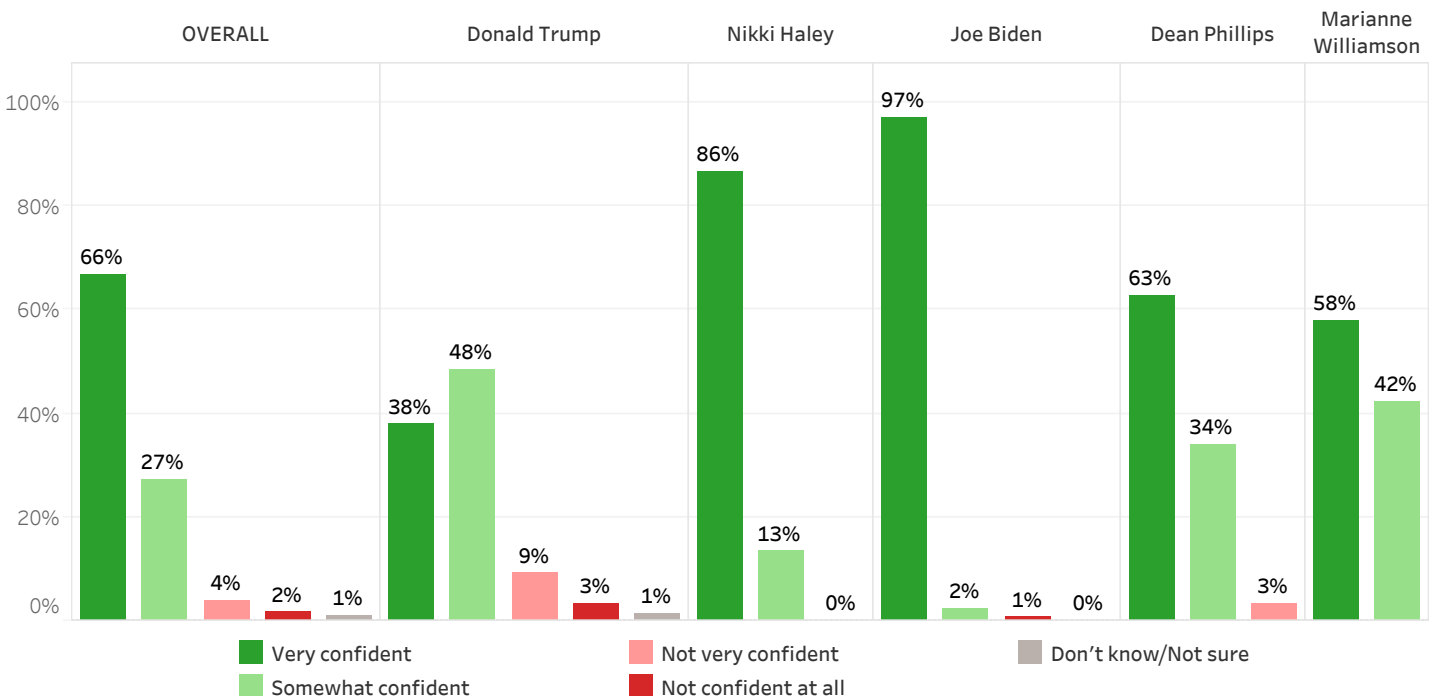
DURHAM, NH - Voters in the 2024 New Hampshire presidential primary overwhelmingly think it was very easy to vote and two-thirds are very confident that their vote was accurately counted. Less than a quarter of Granite Staters feel that voter fraud is a serious problem in the state but nearly half feel it is a serious problem in the United States overall. Two-thirds of New Hampshire residents support the state law requiring the New Hampshire primary to be first in the nation and a small majority support a constitutional amendment requiring the New Hampshire primary to be first.

Perception of January Presidential Primary Vote

Since 2016, there has been concern about declining confidence in US elections. Those on the political left have expressed concern about the difficulty of voting while those on the right are concerned that votes are not counted accurately. The latest Granite State Poll finds that New Hampshire Primary voters are both confident that their vote was counted accurately and that it was easy to vote. Among those who voted in the 2024 New Hampshire presidential primary, two-thirds (66%) are very confident that their vote was accurately counted and another 27% are somewhat confident. Only 4% are not very confident and 2% are not confident at all that their vote was accurately counted.

Most of those who voted for President Joe Biden (97%) or former UN Ambassador Nikki Haley (86%) are very confident that their vote was accurately counted but smaller majorities of those who voted for Minnesota Representative Dean Phillips (63%) or author Marianne Williamson (58%) are very confident and only 38% of those who voted for former president Donald Trump are very confident that their vote was accurately counted. Self-described conservatives, libertarians, those under the age of 50, those with a high school education or less, and conservative radio listeners are less likely to be very confident that their vote was accurately counted.

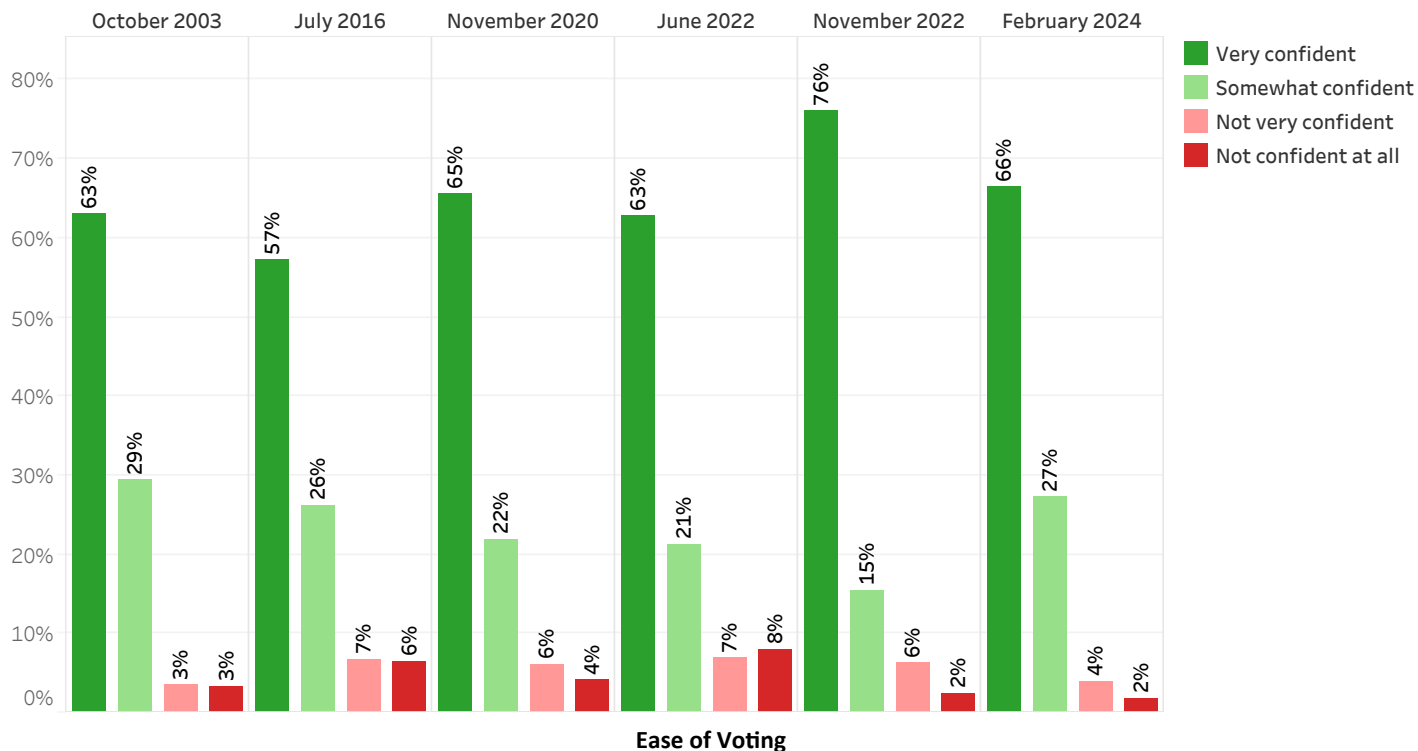
Confidence Past Vote Was Accurately Counted - by 2024 Presidential Primary Vote - February 2024

Over the last 20 years, and despite the type of election, very small percentages of New Hampshire voters have expressed low confidence that their vote was counted accurately.

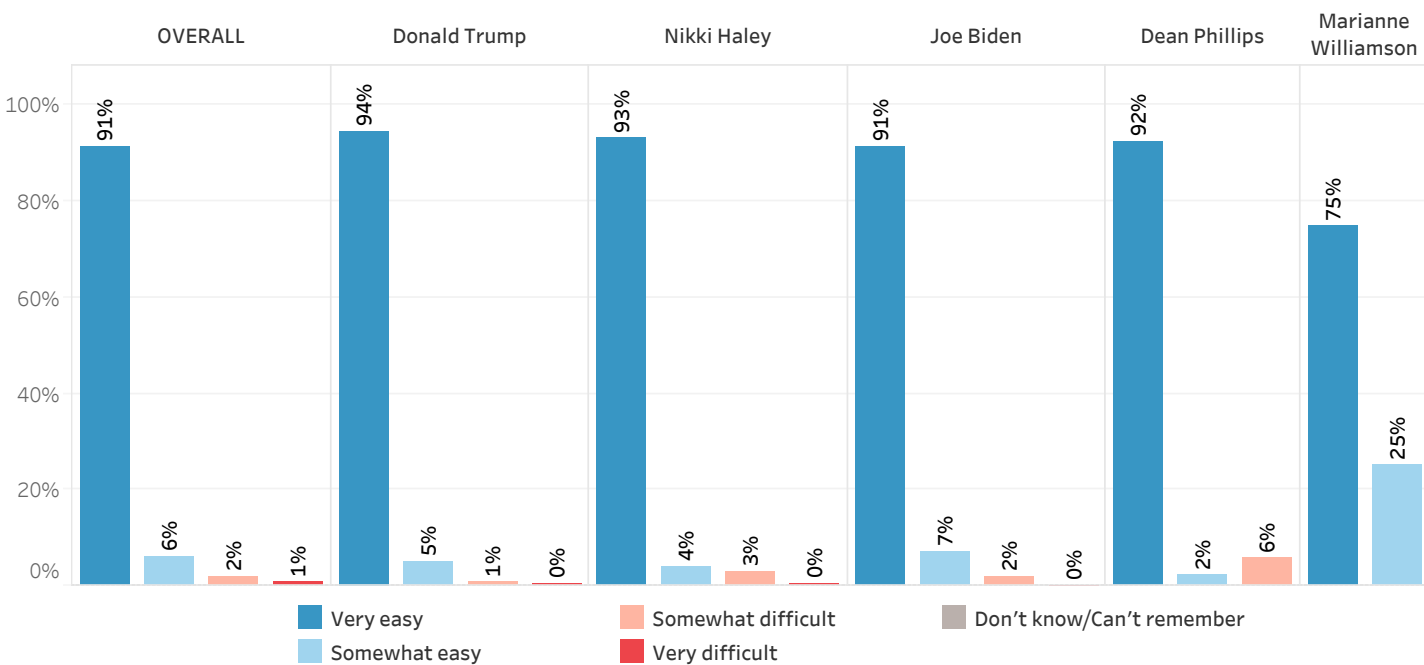
Confidence Past Vote Was Accurately Counted



Among those who voted in the 2024 New Hampshire presidential primary, a large majority (91%) think it was very easy to vote and another 6% think that it was somewhat easy to vote. Only 2% said it was somewhat difficult and 1% say it was very difficult to vote. Trump (94%), Haley (93%), Phillips (92%), and Biden (91%) voters were equally likely to say it was very easy to vote.

Voters in the 2024 New Hampshire presidential primary are equally likely as in November 2022 and November 2020 to describe their last time voting as very easy.

Ease of Voting in 2024 Presidential Primary - by Presidential Primary Vote - February 2024

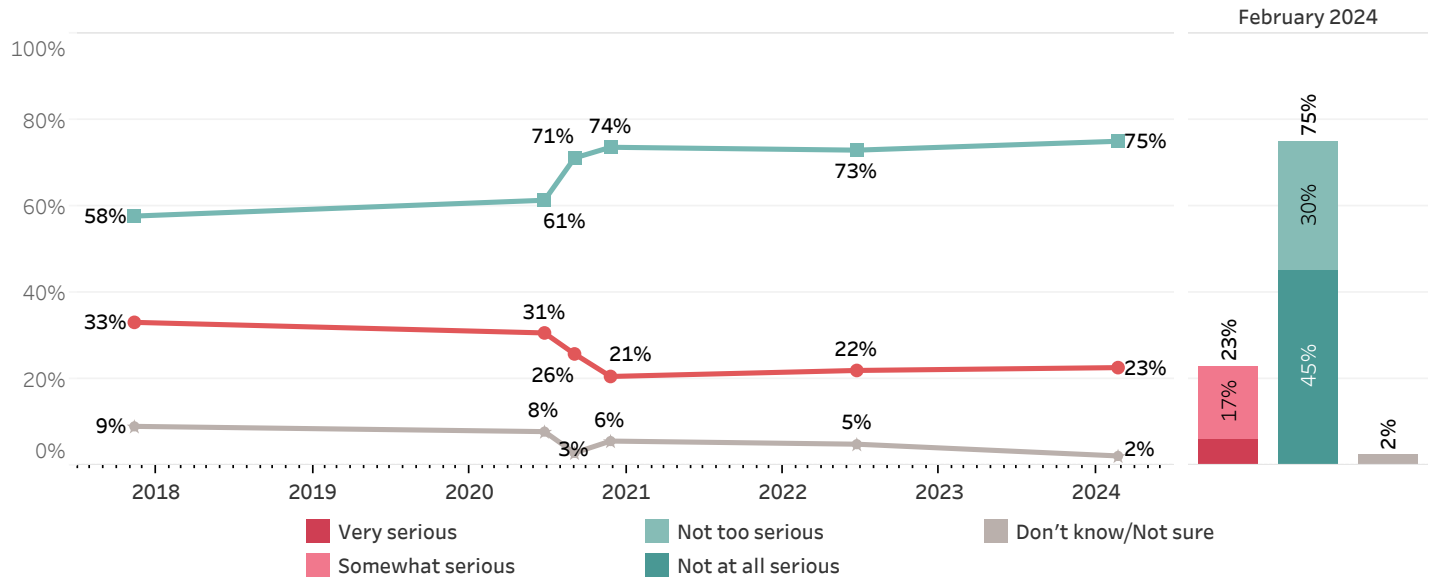


Voter Fraud

Only 23% of New Hampshire residents believe that voter fraud is a very (6%) or somewhat (17%) serious problem in New Hampshire, 75% think it is not too serious (30%) or not at all serious (45%), and 2% are unsure. The percentage of state residents who believe that voter fraud is a very or somewhat serious problem in New Hampshire (23%) is unchanged over the past three years.

Nearly half (46%) of Republicans believe that voter fraud is a very or somewhat serious problem in the state but only 19% of Independents and 2% of Democrats agree.

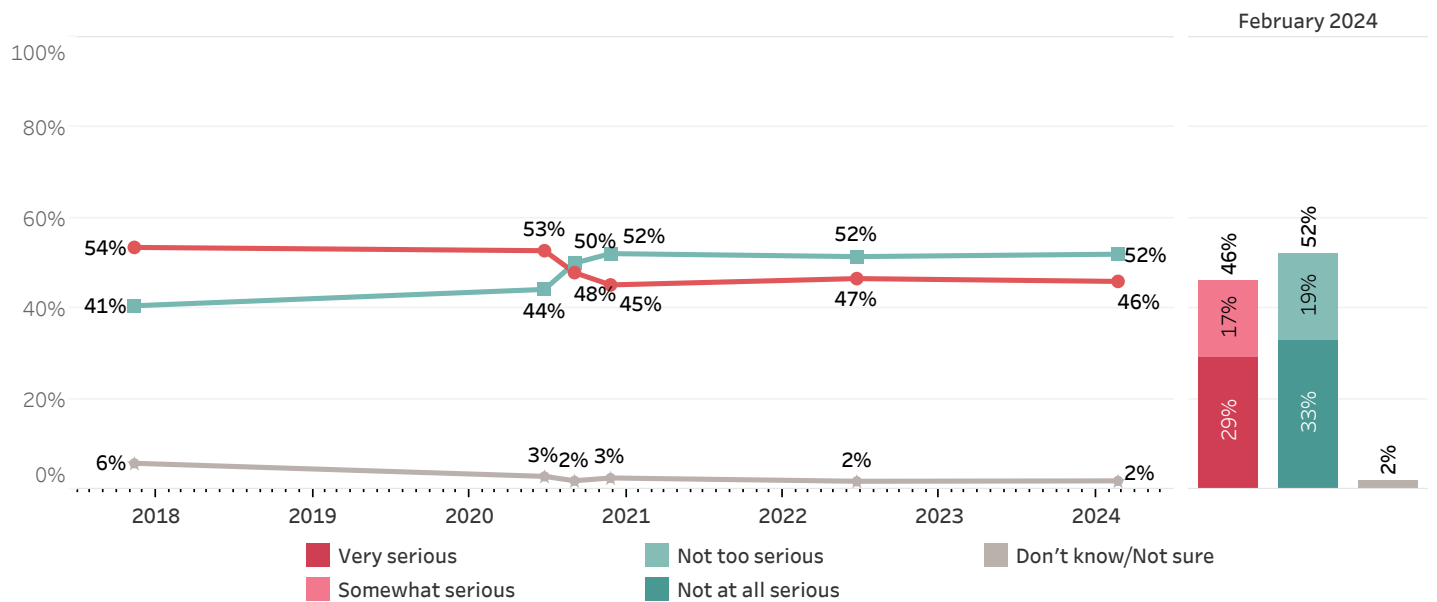
Seriousness of Voter Fraud in New Hampshire



Granite Staters are far less positive in their assessment of voter fraud in the country as a whole: 46% believe that voter fraud is a very (29%) or somewhat (17%) serious problem in the United States, 52% think it is not too serious (19%) or not at all serious (33%), and 2% are unsure. Feelings about voter fraud in the country are largely unchanged since November 2020.

Most Republicans (86%) and more than half of Independents (56%) believe that voter fraud is a very or somewhat serious problem in the country but only 6% of Democrats agree. Overall, 52% of respondents think that voter fraud is a not too serious or not at all serious problem in either New Hampshire or the country at large, 22% think it is a serious problem in the country at large but not in New Hampshire, and 23% think it is a serious problem both in New Hampshire and the country at large.

Seriousness of Voter Fraud in United States

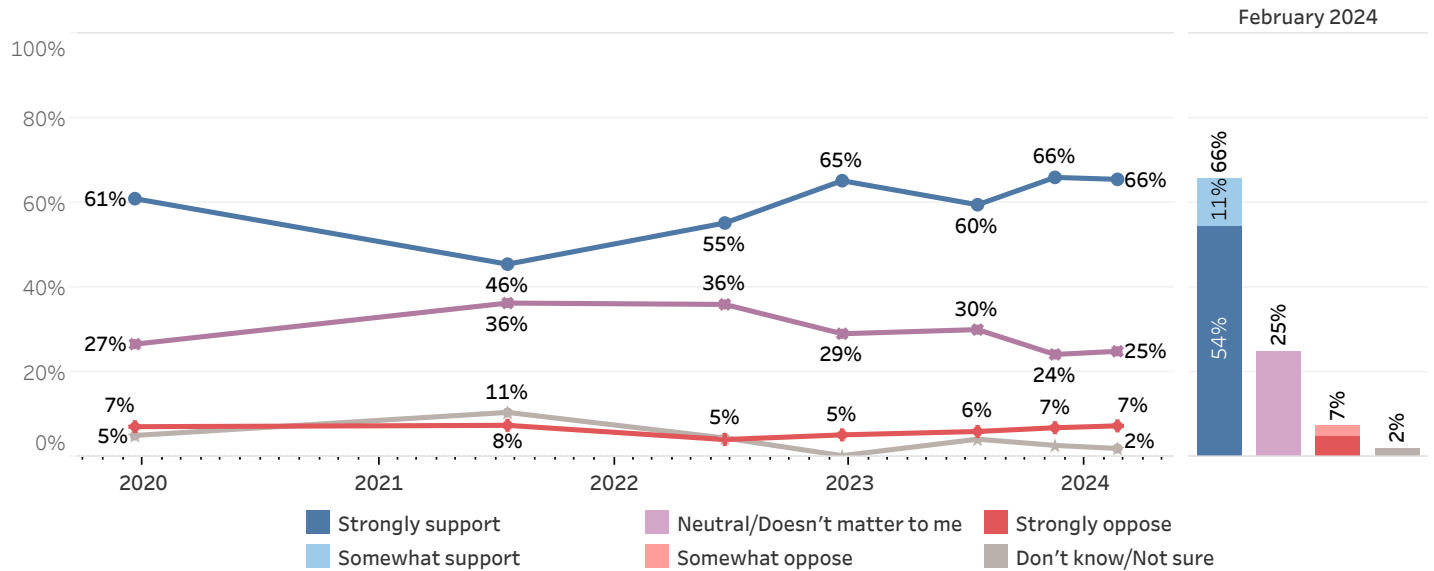


New Hampshire First-in-the-Nation Primary

A law that requires that New Hampshire’s presidential primary be held at least seven days before any similar contest continues to enjoy broad support in the state: two-thirds (66%) strongly (54%) or somewhat (11%) support this law, 25% are neutral or say it doesn't matter to them, and 7% strongly (5%) or somewhat (3%) oppose it. Support for this law is unchanged since November 2023 but remains higher than in 2021 and 2022.

Most Republicans (85%) and Independents (75%) strongly or somewhat support this law but only 45% of Democrats agree.

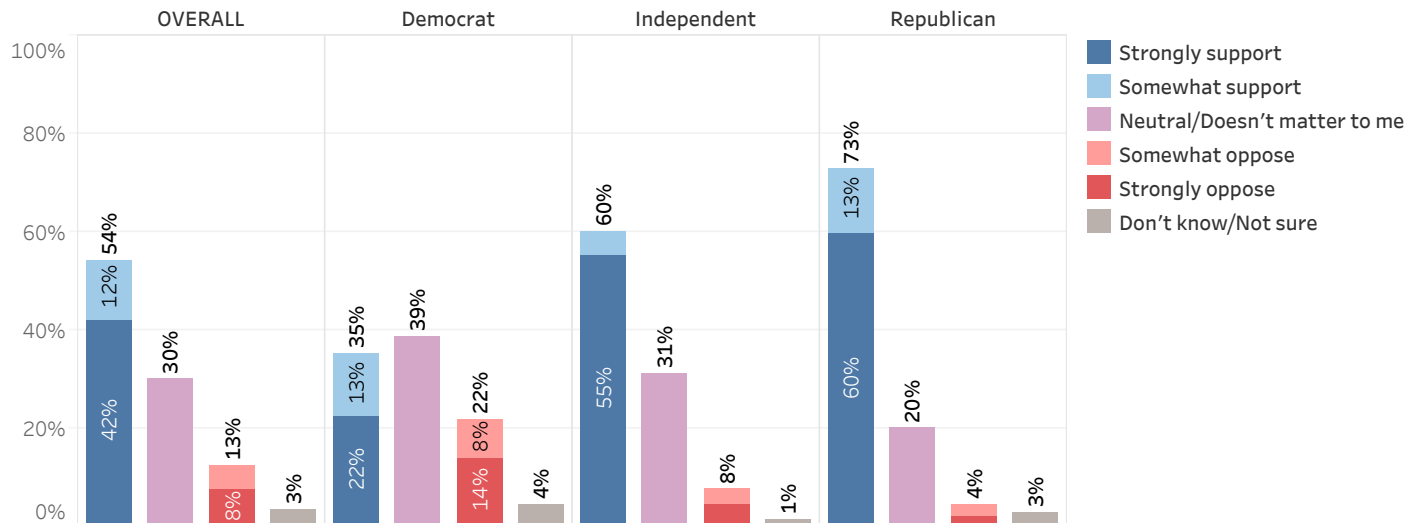
Support or Oppose New Hampshire Law Requiring Primary to be First



The Democratic National Committee (DNC) did not recognize the results of the New Hampshire presidential primary in 2024 as it was not held in the order they prescribed. Instead, the DNC said that South Carolina would hold the first primary. New Hampshire nevertheless held its presidential primary before any similar contest, as required by New Hampshire law. In the wake of this conflict, New Hampshire lawmakers have proposed an amendment to the New Hampshire Constitution which would require the New Hampshire presidential primary to be the first of any presidential election cycle.

New Hampshire residents support this effort: 54% strongly (42%) or somewhat (12%) support an amendment to the state constitution requiring the state to hold the first presidential primary, 30% are neutral or say it doesn't matter to them, 13% strongly (8%) or somewhat (5%) oppose it, and 3% are unsure. Majorities of Republicans (73%) and Independents (60%) support this proposed amendment but only 35% of Democrats feel that way.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand, four hundred, and forty-eight (1,448) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between February 15 and February 19, 2024. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.6 percent. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the February 2024 Granite State Poll is 34%. The design effect for the survey is 2.1%.

The Granite State Panel is a probability-based web panel of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 7,500 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from phone, text-to-web, or mail-to-web surveys sent to randomly-selected phone numbers or addresses. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire. Surveys were taken in English, all respondent data included passes Qualtrics data quality checks, and single-use survey links were used to prevent multiple submissions by respondents.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. All coding of open-ended responses is conducted by human coders.
